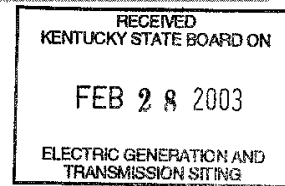

Dear Angela,

Thank you for sending all the info about Trapp incinerator. I called Roy Polk, CEO at East Ky Power, on Th, 2/20/03 and left a voice mail. He returned the call to me at my workplace on Friday, 2/21/03, at 8:55 AM. I asked him several questions about this facility. I wrote down some of his comments, word for word. I would even say to him, "May I quote you on this?" First, I asked for the transmission line plans. He said, "The transmission plans will be filed with the Plant Siting Board soon." I said when can I get a copy? He said, "I can check on it and call you back." I began to ask him about this pelleted waste from New Jersey. At first he said that the plant does not have to use waste as fuel, that it might be 100% coal. So... I asked what's the point of this new technology and all the whoopla if you are going to burn coal only? Then I said, "Let's pretend that it is already installed and you are going to burn pellets of solid waste that someone has deemed to be just waste, not SOLID waste. He said he calls it "DRY WASTE". SO... I ask who will be accountable for monitoring this waste that's brought in? He said, "EAST KENTUCKY HAS SOLE CONTROL OF WHAT WASTE IS PROCESSED IN TRAPP. THE DRY FORM OF WASTE COULD BE CHANGED IN THE FUTURE TO A DIFFERENT FORM OF WASTE." Needless to say I was shocked to hear this exact statement from him BECAUSE THE PELLET WASTE WAS CLASSIFIED AS NOT BEING REGULATED AS SOLID WASTE. (Even though we all know that it is solid waste.) To finish the conversation with Mr. POLK, I stated my opinion that it's unethical for private business to come into a County with such a risky venture that will impact the future of the health and welfare of the community and probably become a future Super Fund Site. I believe that his statement proves my theory: that Trapp will eventually become the DUMP for the Eastern half of the US.

I ask you to CONSIDER THIS STATEMENT OF MR. POLK'S. I already know that you'll call it hearsay, and that he could deny it. All I can do is assure you that it is completely true as I wrote it down as he said it to me.
