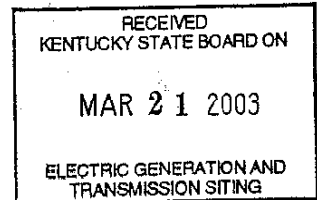

Dear Sirs:

I am a resident of Montgomery Co. and I am very concerned about the quality of air that I breathe. Montgomery Co. has a large population of school age children who will be affected by the environment.

Kentucky is already fifth in the nation in Cancer related diseases and does not need to rate any higher.

The Ky. Pioneer Energy, a subsidiary of Global Energy of Cincinnati wants to build a 540-megawatt plant at Trapp, where a mixture of coal and garbage pellets would be burned. The garbage would be shipped from Northeastern states. This garbage may have amounts of lead based paint and asbestos materials plus other chemicals that will be released when burned. People put all sorts of things in garbage that they should not put there especially if a building or an older home has been remodeled.

The traffic will be increased greatly shipping in this garbage to Kentucky plus there will be unsightly power lines and more substations to help beautify Ky.

I have also found out that a Cincinnati-based company which handles trash wants to haul trash from all Ky. to Montgomery Co. including having a solidification pit at the landfill which might contaminate well water and the water table in that area.

It seems to me that out of state companies want to take advantage of Kentucky and not pollute their own states!

I hope for the sake of people in Ky. that the proposed power plant in Trapp will not be allowed.
