O R D E R

On August 11, 2003, Jacqueline Mitchell filed a motion for intervention in this proceeding before the Commission. Subsequent to that filing, on September 5, Jacqueline Mitchell filed a document on behalf of several customers of Ohio County Water District ("Ohio District"). Attached to her motion was a petition signed by several concerned residents of Ohio District. 807 KAR 5:001, Section 3(8) states that a person seeking full intervention must show to the Commission that the person seeking intervention has a special interest which is not otherwise adequately represented in the proceeding or that that party is likely to present issues that will assist the Commission without unduly complicating the proceedings.

The Commission finds that such intervention is likely to present issues that will assist the Commission without unduly complicating the proceedings. The Commission, being otherwise sufficiently advised, HEREBY ORDERS that:


1. The motion of Jacqueline Mitchell for intervention is granted.
2. Jacqueline Mitchell shall be entitled to the full rights of a party and shall be served with the Commission's Orders and with filed testimony, exhibits, pleadings, correspondence and all other documents submitted by parties after the date of this Order.
3. Jacqueline Mitchell shall comply with paragraph 8 of the Commission's Order of May 14, 2003, as to notification of electronic filing.
