Dear Jonathon:

I tried to reach you by phone yesterday, and left a message asking that you call me, but have not yet received a return phone call, so I am sending you this information in this letter. BellSouth has not been receiving copies of SouthEast Telephone's pleadings or other filings by electronic service. For example, BellSouth did not receive SouthEast Telephone's Motion for Extension apparently filed on or about November 13 or 14, until after the Commission's Order of November 17, 2003, granting SouthEast Telephone's Motion for Extension.

I wanted to be sure that you had that information so that you promptly serve BellSouth electronically with SouthEast Telephone's testimony and any other pleadings. Pursuant to the Commission's Orders in this case and BellSouth's acceptance of electronic filing, BellSouth should be served electronically by sending a copy of any pleadings you file, in PDF format, to the following e-mail address: <u>BellSouthKY.casefilings@bellsouth.com</u>. BellSouth provided this information in its letter of October 21, 2003, and also in its November 10, 2003 letter.

It was my understanding that SouthEast Telephone had reconsidered the position it stated in its Motion for Extension and was prepared to file its direct testimony by the middle of this week. However, I have not yet received that direct testimony. I would appreciate your confirming to me when SouthEast Telephone will be filing its direct testimony. If for any reason you have difficulty with serving BellSouth electronically, please contact my office and we will be happy to discuss this with you so that BellSouth timely receives service. As you know, with a hearing scheduled in this

matter on November 25, 2003, it is imperative that SouthEast Telephone properly and promptly serve BellSouth.
