
Dear Mr. Strickler:

This will confirm my telephone conversation with you today regarding Bowling Green Municipal Utilities' ("BGMU") Motion to Quash Subpoena Duces Tecum and Motion for Protective Order. Pursuant to KRS 278.320 and 807 KAR 5:001, Section (6)(b), the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("KPSC") has authority to issue subpoenas in proceedings before the Commission.

In our conversation you indicated BGMU does have switch(es) even though it does not offer telephone service. I understand you will follow up with your client as to whether or not it will respond to the discovery attached to the Subpoena Duces Tecum served on you February 20, 2004, or whether it will be necessary for BellSouth to request a valid subpoena from the KPSC to take the deposition of Teresa Newman in Warren County. You agreed to let me know no later than tomorrow, February 27, 2004, whether or not your client will respond to BellSouth's discovery request in lieu of deposition.
