COMMENTS OF THE OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GENERAL

Comes now the Attorney General of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by and through his Office of Rate Intervention, and files these comments pursuant to the Commission's Order dated 6 December 2004 wherein the Commission requested the parties to this action to submit a detailed recommendation for third party testing of Service Quality Measurements (SQMs) ultimately established in this proceeding.¹

Put directly, the Commission should deny BellSouth's request for a modification and continue on the course now set until the reviews in Florida and/or Georgia are complete and can give guidance as a result of a fully litigated multiple party proceeding. In Case No. 2001-00105², the Commission rejected BellSouth's proposal and instead adopted, in total, the Georgia Commission's performance plan. While the Commission did not prohibit BellSouth from proposing a Kentucky-specific plan, the

Commission charged BellSouth with the duty to discuss the provision of non-discriminatory service to Competitive Local Exchange Carriers ("CLECs"). By inference, BellSouth has been mandated to demonstrate that the non-discriminatory practices are being properly addressed. Stated another way, it must prove that the CLECs are satisfied with BellSouth's performance. Objections by a CLEC show that the practices have not been satisfactorily addressed and a modification of the performance plan is not in order. Because Covad has objected to the modification, the Attorney General moves the Commission to deny any modification to the current plan.

BellSouth is likely to maintain that if there is but one or only a few CLECs which claim that a modification is unnecessary, the modification should be permitted because there will never be a plan that will appease all existing or potential CLECs. In the event that this argument is raised, it should be given some consideration. Indeed, this is precisely why the Commission should defer to either Georgia or Florida, where an extensive review was undertaken in the former jurisdiction and the process is underway in the latter. In those jurisdictions, considerable effort and time was or will be spent by many parties in evaluating the reasonableness of any relaxation of the safeguards to competition in BellSouth's exchange territory. An attempt for BellSouth to avoid such an extensive review and implement a modified plan in Kentucky should be denied. Instead, the Commission should dismiss BellSouth's request and await either Florida's decision or any modification in Georgia in order to eliminate a duplication of work.

In conclusion, the Commission should deny BellSouth's request and defer to either Georgia or Florida where a more extensive analysis will be conducted in a jurisdiction with input by more CLECs to truly determine whether modifications will not deteriorate competition. In other words, the Commission should stay the course which it has chosen wisely thus far.
