APPLICATION, STATEMENT AND NOTICE

Comes Kentucky-American Water Company and states as follows:

1. Kentucky-American Water Company (“Kentucky American Water”) is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky with its principal office, place of business and post office address at 2300 Richmond Road, in Lexington, Fayette County, Kentucky.

2. Kentucky American Water is a wholly-owned subsidiary of American Water Works Company, Inc. (“American Water”) and is engaged in the distribution and sale of water in its Central Division, consisting of Bourbon, Clark, Fayette, Harrison, Jessamine, Scott and Woodford Counties and its Northern Division consisting of Gallatin, Owen and Grant Counties. It currently owns, operates and maintains potable water production, treatment, storage, transmission and distribution systems for the purpose of furnishing potable water for residential, commercial, industrial and governmental users in its service territory.

3. To meet continuing demand for adequate service Kentucky American Water has been and will continue to be required to expend money to renovate its existing facilities, to improve and enlarge its facilities to construct new facilities, and to reinforce and extend its distribution system through the end of the forecasted test year in this proceeding. The increase in the cost of service and the additional capital expenditures have not been offset by the additional

income produced by the increase in rates effective December 1, 2004, in Case No. 2004-00103 with the result of an erosion of significant proportions in the earnings of Kentucky American Water as reflected in the attached exhibits. An increase in its rates is essential for Kentucky American Water to maintain a reasonable level of service, to meet the expanding needs of its service area and to have a reasonable opportunity for appropriate earnings. Kentucky American Water must have income to sufficiently and properly provide for all expenses of an efficient public utility, to market its securities, to attract replacement capital for maturing debt and to attract new capital, all at reasonable costs. The rates presently charged by Kentucky American Water are insufficient to meet its requirements because they no longer are compensatory and are therefore unfair, unreasonable and unjust.

4. As authorized by KRS 278.192(1) and for the purpose of justifying the reasonableness of the proposed increase in rates, Kentucky American Water has utilized a forward-looking test period corresponding to the first twelve (12) consecutive calendar months the proposed rates will be in effect after the six-month suspension of the proposed rates. The forward-looking test period is the twelve months ending November 30, 2008.

5. Kentucky American Water has used, in the attached exhibits, a base period consisting of the twelve (12) months ending July 31, 2007. This base period begins not more than nine (9) months prior to the date of the filing of this Application, and is a period consisting of not less than six (6) months of historical data and not more than six (6) months of estimated data, all as authorized by KRS 278.192(2)(a).

6. Within forty-five (45) days after the last day of the base period Kentucky American Water will file the actual results for the estimated months of the base period as required by KRS 278.192(2)(b).

7. Kentucky American Water's annual reports, including the annual report for 2006, are on file with the Public Service Commission as required by 807 KAR 5:006, Section 3, (1).

8. Kentucky American Water gives notice to the Public Service Commission of the adjustment of its rates from those set forth in Exhibit No. 1 in the filing requirements to those rates set forth in Exhibit No. 2 in the filing requirements, in the total amount of \$13,188,906 on an annual basis. The percentage of increase will approximate an overall increase of 25.10% to Kentucky-American Water Company.

The estimated amount of increase per customer class in the Central Division (Bourbon, Clark, Fayette, Harrison, Jessamine, Scott and Woodford Counties) is: residential, \$7,261,612, 28.64%; commercial, \$3,603,420, 29.01%; industrial, \$502,597, 33.00%; municipal or private fire connections, \$213,574, 34.93%; public fire hydrants, \$529,333, 26.99%; private fire hydrants, \$105,307, 34.93%; municipal and other public authority, \$1,037,001, 27.72%; sales for resale, \$327,927, 32.20%; activation fee customers, \$17,958, 8.33%; reconnection fee customers, \$56,270, 8.43%. The effect upon the average bill for each customer class that the proposed rate change will apply in the Central Division is an increase: residential, \$5.81, 29.02%; commercial, \$32.09, 29.48%; industrial, \$865.36, 32.79%; municipal or private fire connections, \$169.64, 34.93%; public fire hydrants, \$84.13 per hydrant, 26.99%; %; private fire hydrants, \$164.03, 34.94%; municipal and other public authority, \$108.30, 26.89%; sales for resale, \$1,708.11, 33.04%; activation fee customers, \$2.00, 8.33%; reconnection fee customers, \$2.00, 8.33%.

The estimated amount of increase for the residential class in the Northern Division to the customers formerly served by Elk Lake Property Owners Association, Inc. is: residential, \$193, .21%; the estimated amount of decrease for the commercial class is \$151, -60.16%. The effect upon the average bill for each customer class that the proposed rate change will apply in the

Northern Division to the customers formerly served by Elk Lake Property Owners Association, Inc., is a decrease in the residential class of \$6.96, -33.22% and a decrease in the commercial class of \$6.42, -28.65%.

The estimated amount of decrease in the Northern Division to the former customers of Tri-Village Water District is: residential, \$310,080, -31.12%; commercial \$40,885, -34.19%; municipal and other public authority \$16,093, -40.03%. The effect upon the average bill for each customer class that the proposed rate change will apply in the Northern Division to the former customers of Tri-Village Water District is a decrease in the residential class of \$9.88, -30.00%, a decrease in the commercial class of \$7.68, -15.59%; and a decrease in the municipal and other public authority of \$71.76, -27.65%.

The estimated amount of change in the Northern Division to the former customers of the City of Owenton is a decrease for residential of \$103,846, -25.52% and an increase for commercial of \$4,703, 2.37%. The effect upon the average bill for each customer class that the proposed rate change will apply in the Northern Division to the former customers of the City of Owenton is a decrease in the residential class of \$4.89, -19.21% and a decrease in the commercial class of \$.57, -1.26%. The present tariffs (Exhibit No. 1) and the proposed tariffs (Exhibit No. 2) are shown in comparative form on the same sheets, side by side, and those comparative sheets are identified as Exhibit No. 3 in the filing requirements.

9. Kentucky American Water is a corporation, and a certified copy of its Articles of Incorporation, together with all amendments, are incorporated by reference as authorized by 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10, (1), (b), 3 and Section 8, (3), and were filed as Filing Exhibit No. 4 in Case No. 95-554, Notice of the Adjustment of The Rates of Kentucky American Water

Company Effective on and after February 29, 1996, and are referred to in Filing Exhibit No. 4 attached.

10. Kentucky American Water is a corporation in good standing with the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. A certificate to that effect, dated within sixty (60) days of April 30, 2007, as required by 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10, (1), (b), (5), is attached as Exhibit No. 5 in the filing requirements.

11. The legal name of the applicant is Kentucky-American Water Company. It does business under an assumed name, has filed a Certificate of Assumed Name as is required by KRS 365.015 and a certified copy of the Certificate as required by 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10, (1), (b), (6) is attached as Exhibit No. 6.

12. Kentucky American Water has complied with 807 KAR 5:011, Section 8, (2) and 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10, (3) and (4), by mailing a typewritten notice to all customers no later than the date this Application, Statement and Notice was filed with the Public Service Commission and by posting a sample copy of the Notice at its principal office and place of business in each division no later than the date this Application, Statement and Notice was filed with the Public Service Commission. Copies of the Notices are attached as Exhibit 7.

13. Kentucky American Water has filed with the Executive Director of the Public Service Commission a written notice of its intention to file this rate application. The notice stated that the application would be supported by a fully forecasted test period, was delivered to the Executive Director's office on April 2, 2007, at which time a copy was provided to the Utility Intervention and Rate Division of the Attorney General's office of the Commonwealth of Kentucky as set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10, (2). A copy of the notice is identified as Exhibit No. 8 in the filing requirements.

14. As required by 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10, (4), (f), Kentucky American Water will post a copy of Exhibit No. 7 of the filing requirements at its places of business on April 30, 2007, and they will remain posted until the Public Service Commission has finally determined Kentucky American Water's rates.

15. In support of its application for a general adjustment of rates, supported by a fully forecasted test year, Kentucky American Water has presented its financial data for the forecasted period in the form of pro forma adjustments to the base period, has limited the forecasted adjustments to the twelve (12) calendar months immediately following the suspension period, and has based capitalization and net investment rate base on a thirteen (13) month average for the forecasted period, all as set forth in 807 KAR 5:001, Section 10, (8), (a), (b) and (c), in Exhibits No. 37B, 37D and 37J.

16. In further support of its application for a general adjustment of rates, supported by a fully forecasted test year, Kentucky American Water attaches the following documents or explains their absence:




