COMES the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government ("Lexington"), by counsel, and pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001 Section 3(8), moves that it be granted leave to intervene in this matter and that it be granted full intervention status. Approval of the application in this matter will have a significant impact on Lexington and the citizens of Fayette County. Lexington has a special interest in this matter, and it will not be adequately represented by the other parties. More specifically, the proposed rate increase to the cost of public fire service alone impacts Lexington by more than \$800,000.00 per annum. Lexington's participation in this matter is likely to assist the Commission in developing and identifying facts and issues and in fully considering this matter without unduly complicating or disrupting the proceedings.

In response to paragraph number 5 of the Commission's February 16, 2010 procedural order, Lexington waives its right to service of Commission orders through the United States Mail, and accepts electronic delivery of such orders.


