InresponsetotheMarch10,2011Order(the"Order")ofthePublic ServiceCommission of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (the "Commission") in the above-capt ioned case (the "Intrastate Access Case"), the RLECs ¹ respectfully request that the Commission schedule an informal conference for all participants in the Intrastate Access Case <u>prior</u> to the May 2, 2011 deadlineforfilingthefirstroundofdatarequests.Insupport of theirmotion,theRLECsstateas follows.

I. GroundsforInformalConference.

807KAR5:001(4)(b)(4)provides that "[i]norder to provide opport unity for set tlement of a proceeding or an <u>yof the issues</u> therein, an informal conference with the commission staff may be arranged through the secretary of the commission either prior to, or during the course of hearings in any proceeding, at the request of any party." *Id.* (emphasis added). The RLECs believe that an informal conference will help all participants in volved resolve potential confusion ergarding aspects of the AT&TPlan and focus the issues for the proceeding going forward. Inparticular, an informal conference would provide an opportunity for the pa rtiesinthis casetoaskquestionsregardingtheAT&TPlan,toseekclarificat ionfromAT&Tregardingtheir understanding of it, or to address any other issues involved in this proc eeding. Prior to the requests and testimony in this exertion of significant time, effort, and resources to issue data proceeding, an informal conference will allow the parties to resol veandnarrowtheissuesgoing forward. The Commission has customarily held informal conferences at the inception of cases for these same purposes. Due to the significance of the issues involved and their wide-reaching effects, the RLECs believe an informal conference under the auspice softheCommissionandits expert staff would be in the best interest of all parties participatinginthiscasebyensuringthat theissuesareclearandthattheultimateoutcomeofthisproce eding, whateverit may be, is truly tothebenefitofthecitizensoftheCommonwealth.

Finally, the RLECs' request for an informal conference would not c ause a procedural delay in this case as it would fall in between the filing of c omments on April 15, 2011 and the firstround of datarequests, which are scheduled to be filed by May 2,2011. The RLECs believe that an informal conference would best serve the parties if it occurred prior to the deadline for filing the firstround of datarequests because it will provide the parties addit ional information for the purpose of focusing their datarequests and, subsequently, their direct testimon y.
