- 12 A. Home address. Paul Thompson, 64 Mockingbird 13 Lane, Lafayette, Tennessee 37083.
 - Q. Okay. Is that like Lafayette?
- A. Exact same spelling. We're just a little different here, so we pronounce it Lafayette. Here and maybe in Louisiana are the only two places I've heard it pronounced that way.
- 19 Q. Okay. Have you had your deposition taken before?
- 20 A. No.
- Q. Okay. Well, let me explain to you what the process is. As -- As you know, your testimony is going to be taken by the court reporter and transcribed, so we're going to need verbal responses.
 - A. Okay.

- A. I have a Bachelor's degree from Tennessee

 Technological University in Cookeville, Tennessee.
- Q. Okay. Now, in -- in your position as Executive
 Vice President and General Manager of Tri-County, are you
 familiar with pole attachment agreements with attaching

- A. Yes. I think that what I'm supposed to do is answer the questions. What I was directed by our counsel to do was to answer the questions honestly and as completely and thoroughly as I could. And since I have been involved, then yes, I think I'm prepared to answer those questions.
- 11 Q. Okay. But you didn't do anything to educate 12 yourself on these subjects?

- Q. And you're shown as the witness on the majority of these, correct?
 - A. That's correct.
 - Q. Except for a few in which counsel is -- is specified as the witness, right?
- 10 | A. Yes, sir.
 - Q. Okay. So, what did you do to respond to these information requests?
 - A. We prepared I think originally -- Gosh, so much time has passed. But we -- We prepared originally and submitted documentation I think in response to these things.
 - Q. Okay. You prepared documentation of what sort?
 - A. Copies of some of our agreements with rural telephone coops. Also, I think we may have submitted our contracts with cable attachers, as well as maybe an agreement with -- original agreement from South Central Bell that now we serve AT&T under.
- Q. Okay. So, we're talking now about the documents.

 So, what did you do to search for responsive documents?
 - A. We got the copy of all of that information. We have folders on each attacher to our facility, so we got

those. Another thing I failed to mention earlier, I think we also gave some summaries of what our pole attachment revenue had been over the course of a number of years. And so, we keep records of those each year and I just submitted those.

- Q. Do you know whether those documents were submitted to us?
 - A. I have no idea.

- Q. Okay. I will state on the record that there are a number of those documents that were never provided to us, including contracts with other pole owners and so on, including the contract of -- the South Central Bell agreement.
- MR. DEPP: I will state on the record that I believe we have provided all responsive documents, but -- that's all.
- A. And let me clarify. My memory is that we got those, and it's been, gosh, a long time. We may have or may not have. That's my memory, is that I think we did.
- Q. Okay. What did you do to respond to the -- the data requests that requested a particular answer as opposed to a document?
 - A. I tried to answer to the best of my ability.
- Q. Well, the -- So, the answers that are contained in Exhibit 40, for example, how were they prepared? Do you know?

- A. I'd have to look at each one of those.
- Q. Well, why don't you look at, for example, the -- item two. How was that prepared?
- A. Item two? (Witness reviews document.) Well, it looks as if we did not feel that we needed to respond to that.
- 7 Q. I'm talking about -- Are you looking at Exhibit 8 No. 40?
- 9 A. I think I am, uh-huh. It's labeled Exhibit 40.
- 10 Q. Okay.

- 10 | A. Yes, sir.
- 11 | O. What rates are referred to in that sentence?
- 12 A. I think they're talking about all rates.
- 13 Q. What does that mean?
- A. That would mean our electric rates, our pole attachment rates, both wholesale and resale -- or, retail on electric.
- Q. Okay. Does the wholesale Power Contract that
 Tri-County has with TVA specifically refer to pole attachment
 rates?
- 20 A. I think it does.
- 21 Q. Do you recall where?
- A. I could probably find it if you have a copy of
- Q. Uh-huh, I have a copy of it.
- MR. DEPP: While you're gathering that, I'll go

- 1 | ahead and note on the record, I understand your question is
- 2 directed at the witness' personal knowledge of the agreement,

 - Q. Forty-two, okay. And if you would find for me, if you can, any expressed referenced to pole attachments in this document. Let me ask a preliminary question, before we get into that. Is -- Is -- Exhibit No. 42, does that represent the current contract between TVA and Tri-County?
 - A. I think it does.
 - Q. Okay. So now, let's go back to my question, for you to identify for us any expressed reference to pole attachments in this document, if you can find it.
 - A. (Witness reviews document.) What I was referencing can be found under the schedule of terms and conditions, item number one, paragraph A, the last sentence.
 - Q. Okay. What page is that on?
- A. It appears to be the very first page of the schedule of terms and conditions which if -- out of the exhibit that you handed -- handed me, would be two, three -- the fifth page.
 - Q. Okay. And what are you referring to particularly?
- 25 A. The very -- The very last sentence in that -- in

paragraph A, which is under item number one.

- Q. So, you're referring to the sentence that says (reading) in the interest of efficiency and economy, cooperative may use property and personal -- personnel jointly for the electric system and other operations subject to agreement between cooperative and TVA as to appropriate allocations based on direction of effort, relative use, or similar standards of any and all joint investments, salaries, and other expenses, funds, or use of property or facilities, close quote.
 - Is that what you're referring to?
- 12 A. Yes, sir.

- Q. And what agreement, if any, is there between the cooperative and the TVA as to appropriate allocations related to pole attachments? Is there any?
 - A. Yes, sir. I believe there is.
 - Q. And what -- What agreement is that?
- A. I think, specifically, our financial accounting records that we submit to them monthly.
 - Q. Okay. What financial accounting records are you referring to?
- A. Each month, the member cooperatives have to submit to TVA a TVA report which reflects their financial status on income and expenditures. It reflects both the wholesale and resale -- retail side of -- of the business.

Q. And what information in that report is specifically related to pole attachments?

- A. It's a line item on the report. I can't remember the specific line item, but it reports nonelectric sales revenue.
- 6 Q. Okay. Does it identify it as pole attachment 7 revenue?
 - A. Nothing on the report specifically says pole attachment, but that's what that number represents on our report.
- 11 Q. Is that the only nonelectric sales revenue that 12 is received by Tri-County?
- 13 A. It is of any significance.
 - Q. Well, that information includes revenue from other sources, other than pole attachments; is that right?
- 16 A. There could be a small amount reflected there, 17 yes.
- Q. Okay. So, it is your view that these monthly reports constitute communications between Tri-County and the TVA related to pole attachments?
- 21 A. I think that's -- Yes, I think it does.
- Q. Can you tell me why we have not been provided copies of any one of these reports?
- MR. DEPP: That's a legal response and you know that.

- Q. I've asked -- I'm asking the witness.
- 2 A. I have no idea.
 - Q. Okay. Does the -- So, this report -- We will be discussing your annual report later, but does this report mirror the annual reports in terms of line items, categories?
 - A. Yes.

- Q. Okay. Does this report contain any information regarding pole attachment rates?
 - A. No.
- Q. Does this report contain any particular
 allocation of -- Well, let me put it this way. Does -- Does
 this report contain information on the costs of providing
 pole attachments?
- A. Are you talking about that monthly report that I mentioned earlier?
- 16 O. Yes.
- 17 A. I don't think so.
- Q. Okay. And what is it in this report that you believe is an agreement between the TVA and Tri-County as to appropriate allocations?
- 21 A. I don't think I said that report contained an 22 agreement.
- Q. Okay. So, the report does not contain an agreement regarding appropriate allocations?
- 25 A. I don't think that report contains any agreement

1 of any kind.

- Q. Okay. And how does that report reflect any kind of an agreement between the cooperative and TVA as to appropriate allocations, if it does?
- A. It reflects the overall financial statement and condition of the electric coop and, specifically, revenues generated from pole attachments.
- Q. Okay. It -- So, it provides information to TVA regarding the revenues from pole attachments. Does it contain information regarding the expenses of Tri-County incurred in connection with pole attachment payments to other parties for attaching to their poles?
- A. Yes, it would show our total expenses for the month.
- Q. All right. So, it would show them just in terms of total expenses or is it set out in any way?
- A. The number reported in that line would reflect the net of charges and expenses relative to pole attachments.
- Q. Okay. So, the -- Let me take a step back. So, we'll get to -- we'll get to this, but Tri-County has arrangements with other pole owners in which Tri-County is allowed to use those pole owners' poles and those pole owners are allowed to use Tri-County's poles, correct?
 - A. Yes, sir.
 - Q. And they each have a -- some payment requirement

- for the use of the other's poles, right?
- A. Typically, we pay 150 percent of what we charge people to attach to us when we attach to their system.
- Q. Okay. So, typically -- Well, we'll get to that.
- 5 But -- But there are payments or charges that go both ways, 6 right?
- 7 A. Yes.

- Q. Okay. And typically, Tri-County has more poles
 than its joint users, right?
- 10 A. Yes. I think without exception. Usually, we 11 would have 98 percent or more of the poles.
- Q. Well, we'll see if we can determine what that
 number is. But -- But what you're saying in terms of net,
 the -- the amount that is reflected on the monthly reports to
 the TVA are the net amounts that take the revenue that is
 received by Tri-County for pole attachments and nets out the
 expenses that Tri-County pays to the other pole owners for
 Tri-County to use their poles?
 - A. Yes, sir.
- Q. Okay. So, even if this line item on the report were only for pole attachments, what the TVA could see from it is the net between the -- those expenses and those revenues?
- 24 A. That's correct.
 - Q. Okay. Is there anything else in those monthly

reports that would reflect the -- any appropriate allocations?

- A. I don't think I understand the question.
- Q. The paragraph in the -- in the agreement with -- with TVA says that these arrangements are supposed to be subject to agreement between the cooperative and TVA as to appropriate allocations, and I'm just trying to understand better what it is about the information supplied to TVA that represents some agreement between the cooperative and TVA as to the appropriate allocations.
- A. In Tri-County's case, that's the only entity -only group that we enter into and provide use of our
 property. We don't lease any office space. We're not any -in any kind of subsidiary business. That's the only thing we
 have, is pole attachments and the agreements with those
 companies.
 - Q. Okay. Is that the full extent of your answer?
- A. Yes.

- Q. Does Tri-County, in these monthly reports, provide the TVA with information regarding the particular expenses that are incurred by Tri-County in providing pole attachment space?
- 23 A. No.
- Q. Okay. Is there anything else in the contract
 between TVA and Tri-County that you believe expressly refers

- 1 to pole attachments?
- 2 I don't think so. Α.
- 3 Okay. Mr. Thompson, I'm going to show you what's Ο. 4 been marked as Exhibit No. 4 and direct you to a letter of 5 January 24th, 2013 from Cynthia Herron to you. Are you familiar with that letter?
- 7 Α. Yes, sir.

- Okay. Did you communicate with Cynthia Herron Q. about that letter before it was sent?
- 10 No, sir. I did not. Α.
- 11 Ο. Do you know who did?
- 12 No, sir. Α.
- Are you aware of any discussion by anyone related 13 Q. 14 to obtaining a letter from TVA on this subject?
- 15 Α. No, sir.
- 16 Okay. Now, the letter says that the distributor, Ο. 17 which would be Tri-County, right --
- Yes, sir. 18 Α.
- 19 -- is required to recover the full costs Ο. 2.0 associated with pole attachments and that the TVA does not 21 object, quote, as long as the power distributor recovers the 22 costs associated with pole attachment rentals and that the 23 electric rate payers do not subsidize the cost of these 24 rentals. Do you see that?
 - Α. Yes, sir.

- Q. Okay. Has Tri-County determined what its costs associated with pole attachment rentals are?
 - A. Yes, sir.

- Q. Okay. And when did it do that?
- 5 A. It would be prior to me coming to Tri-County, 6 prior to '98.
 - Q. Prior to 1998?
 - A. Yes, sir.
 - Q. That was the last time it was done?
- 10 A. No, sir. We look at that on an annual basis.
- Q. All right. Well, let's go back to the -- the costs associated with rentals on a -- prior to 1998. And how was that accomplished?
- 14 A. I do not know.
 - Q. Okay. And why do you believe that the costs associated with pole rentals were analyzed at that time?
- A. To my knowledge, it was done annually prior to me being there, but the only thing I can speak to is since my time at Tri-County, and I came in March of 1998.
 - Q. Okay. And what is done annually then?
- 21 A. We review, through a formula, what our costs are.
 - Q. Okay. And what costs do you consider?
- A. We look at the cost of a bare pole and we look at anything that -- carrying costs of all the poles in our system. We also allocate some space based on minimum safety

height -- or, clearances. We also consider the safety space that is required by the National Electric Safety Code. And then, we look at the space that an attacher is requesting to use, specifically what usable space do they want. And then, through our formula, we calculate the rate.

- Q. Okay. So, you calculate this rate annually?
- A. Yes.

- Q. And you base your pole attachment rates on this calculation?
- 10 We base our rates on the calculations. Α. 11 only renew at the request of some of our attachers. In fact, 12 the majority wanted to do three-year terms. And so, we 13 review those attachment rates annually. But then, we do 14 amendments to our agreements on a three-year term for all but 15 AT&T, and there was a negotiated rate that was done by them with TVPPA. 16
 - Q. Okay. The -- The analysis that you do, do you provide that to TVA?
 - A. Yes.
 - Q. Okay. And when have you done that? When have you provided that to TVA?
- A. I don't recall the last time we've given it to them.
- Q. Were you provided a copy of -- Well, let me -- 25 Was that in writing?

Page 25 1 The formula, yes. Α. 2 And when was that -- You don't recall when that Ο. 3 was provided to TVA? 4 Α. No, sir. 5 Ο. Do you know whether that was provided to us in 6 response to this case? 7 Α. No, sir. 8 We'll state on the record that it was not. Okay. Q. 9 The -- The formula was provided to TVA. That's what you're 10 saying, right? 11 Yes, sir. Α. 12 Okay. And was that in -- prior to 1998? Q. 13 Α. It would've been since 1998. 14 Okay. And does Tri-County provide the results of Q. 15 the analysis using the formula to TVA? 16 Α. Yes, we have. 17 Q. When have you done that? 18 Α. No, sir. 24 Q. Was it provided in writing? 25 Α. Yes.

Page 26 1 Did Tri-County make any effort to uncover this Ο. 2 document to provide it to us in this proceeding? 3 Α. No, sir. 4 Q. Okay. Was this a communication with TVA 5 regarding pole attachment rates? 6 MR. DEPP: Objection to the extent that calls for 7 a legal conclusion. 8 Q. You can answer the question. 9 Restate the question. Α. 10 Read it back. Ο. 11 (WHEREAS, THE QUESTION WAS READ BACK.) 12 In my opinion, it was a reflection of how we Α. 13 determine our rates. Was it a communication with TVA? 14 Q. 15 MR. DEPP: Same objection. That's now been asked 16 and answered, as well. 17 MR. GILLESPIE: It has not been answered. 18 MR. DEPP: It's been answered to the best of his 19 ability. 2.0 MR.
