CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETED NOTICE

To: The Public Service Commission, Frankfort, Kentucky

Pursuant to the Rules Governing Tariffs (effective August 4, 1984), I hereby certify that I am Edwin R. Staton, Vice President, State Regulation and Rates for Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E") and Kentucky Utilities Company ("KU") ("Companies"), utilities furnishing retail electric and gas service within the Commonwealth of Kentucky which, on the 17th day of January, 2014, filed an application with the Kentucky Public Service Commission for review, modification, and continuation of existing, and addition of new, Demand-Side Management and Energy Efficiency Programs, and that notice to the public of the filing of the application has been completed in all respects as required by 807 KAR 5:001, Sections 17, as follows:

That more than twenty (20) customers will be affected by said change by way of an increase in their bills, and that on the 9th day of January, 2014, there was delivered to the Kentucky Press Services, Inc. ("Kentucky Press"), an agency that acts on behalf of newspapers of general circulation throughout the Commonwealth of Kentucky in which customers affected reside, for publication in such newspapers once a week for three consecutive weeks beginning on January 17, 2014, pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001, Section (17)(2)(b)(3), a notice of the joint filing of LG&E/KU's Application in this case. Publication of this notice is now complete, with the exceptions as set forth in the Petition to Deviate from Notice Publication Requirements filed by Kentucky Utilities Company on February 21, 2014. An affidavit from the Kentucky Press confirming the publication of the Notices of KU and LG&E, and a copy of said notices are attached as Exhibits A and B, respectively. The Kentucky Press has presented to LG&E and KU proof of publication of these notice in the form of "tear sheets," which LG&E and KU will maintain in its files.

On the 17th day of January, 2014, notices were exhibited for public inspection at 701 South Ninth Street, Louisville, KY 40203 and at One Quality Street, Lexington, KY 40503, and that the same will be kept open to public inspection at said offices in conformity with the requirement of 807 KAR 5:001, Section 17(1)(a).



Notice is hereby given that on January 17, 2014 Louisville Gas and Electric Company ("LG&E") filed an application with the Public Service Commission, Frankfort, Kentucky for approval of revisions in its Demand-Side-Management and Energy-Efficiency ("DSM/EE") program portfolio, as shown in LG&E's *Adjustment Clause Demand-Side Management Cost Recovery Mechanism* ("DSMCRM") tariff and the resulting changes in DSMCRM charges. In its application, LG&E notified the KPSC that the revised DSMCRM tariff sheets are proposed to become effective on and after February 16, 2014; however, because LG&E anticipates the Commission will suspend the proposed changes in the DSMCRM tariff to conduct an investigation of the proposed changes, LG&E has asked the Commission to approve the proposed changes in its DSM/EE program portfolio and resulting increases in the charges under the DSMCRM mechanism in its DSMCRM tariff to be effective on January 1, 2015.

The proposed changes to the DSM/EE program portfolio, if approved, will result in an increase in the charges calculated under the DSMCRM mechanism. The increase charges for all affected electric rate classes are as follows:

that may result in charges under the DSMCRM mechanism that differ from the proposed increase charges contained in this notice.

A person may submit a timely written request for intervention to the Public Service Commission, Post Office Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602, establishing the grounds for the request including the status and interest of the party. If the Commission does not receive a written request for intervention within thirty (30) days of the initial publication or mailing of the notice, the Commission may take final action on the tariff filing.
