RESPONSE TO ORDER OFJUNE 4, 2014 AND MOTION

Northern Kentucky Water District (NKWD), by counsel, responds to the order dated June 4, 2014. That order indicates that additional notice of this project be published due to the change of rates of sub districts A,B,C, D, E, F, G, K, R, RF and RL. Rates for those sub districts are not changing. Each sub district is funded independently of all other sub districts. The rate for each of those sub districts is calculated on the debt service, the number of customers and the funding sources and is recalculated annually. Rates from customers of one sub district do not contribute to or subsidize the rates of other sub districts.

The confusion in this case seems to relate to the RD letter of conditions, which specifies certain rates for the proposed sub district M and the other sub districts. The tariff rates referenced in the RD letter are based on NKWD's 2012 filed tariff rates, copy attached. A comparison of the RD rates and the 2012 rates shows they are the same. There is apparently a typographical error on the rate for sub district B. That rate is listed in the RD letter as \$17.92, but is actually \$17.16. No sub district rate is changing as a result of this application.

The discrepancy in the rates contained in the RD letter and the current tariff rates is the result of the annual recalculation of the sub district rates. As required by Commission orders, each year the rate for each sub district is recalculated to reflect the

current debt service and number of customers of that sub district.

Because NKWD is not changing any sub district rate, except for the imposition of

the surcharge on the proposed new sub district M customers, the order mistakenly

requires an additional notice to customers of the unaffected sub districts.

The order also indicates that the notice should be republished due to the timing of

the publication. One of the newspapers in the service area only publishes on Thursday.

That schedule affected the timing of the notice. Because the notice previously caused to

be published by NKWD is correct and because all customers of sub M are aware of the

surcharge and many have already applied for service based on information previously

provided by NKWD, republication of the original notice seems unduly repetitive. Additional

notice could cause a delay in the case beyond the bid period, which is July 12, 2014.

NKWD requests a deviation pursuant to 807 KAR 5:001(22), if necessary, for the

acceptance of the prior publication and from any additional public notice.

For these reasons, Northern Kentucky Water District requests that its application

for the construction, financing and surcharge for sub district M be accepted as of the

original filing date.
