Duke Energy Kentucky seeks approval to revise these rates as follows: Duke Energy Kentucky's monthly DSM rate for residential gas customers would increase to \$0.055020 per hundred cubic feet and for non-residential gas customers would remain at \$0.000000 per hundred cubic feet.
