Notice that Duke Energy Kentucky, Inc. has applied to the Kentucky Public Service Commission for approval to revise its Demand Side Management (DSM) rate for electric service for residential and commercial customers. Duke Energy Kentucky's current rate for residential gas customers is \$0.054918 per hundred cubic feet and for non-residential gas customers is \$0.000000 per hundred cubic feet. Duke Energy Kentucky's current rate for residential electric customers is \$0.003062 per kilowatt-hour and for non-residential electric customers is \$0.001128 per kilowatt-hour for distribution service and \$0.000848 per transmission service.

Duke Energy Kentucky seeks approval to revise these rates as follows: Duke Energy Kentucky's rate for residential gas customers would increase to \$0.111800 per hundred cubic feet. Duke Energy Kentucky's rate for residential gas customers would remain at \$0.000000 per hundred cubic feet. Duke Energy Kentucky's monthly DSM rate for residential electric customers would increase to \$0.003062 per kilowatt-hour and for non-residential customers would increase to \$0.001654 per kilowatt-hour for distribution service and would decrease to \$0.000161 per kilowatt-hour for transmission service.

The rate proposed in this notice is the rate proposed by Duke Energy Kentucky. However, the Commission may order a rate to be charged that differs from this proposed rate. This may result in a rate for consumers other than the rate in this notice. The foregoing proposed increase in electric revenues of approximately \$1.83 million or 0.54% over current electric revenues and an increase of \$3.62 million or 3.08% over current gas revenues.

A typical residential gas customer using 70 ccf in a month will see an increase of \$3.98 or 5.71% over current gas charges. A typical residential electric customer using 1000 kWh in a month will see an increase of \$7.37 or 0.62%. Non-residential gas customers and non-residential electric customers will see an increase of \$1.83 million or 0.54% over current electric revenues and an increase of \$3.62 million or 3.08% over current gas revenues.

Duke Energy Kentucky's monthly DSM rate for residential electric customers would increase to \$0.003062 per kilowatt-hour and for non-residential electric customers would increase to \$0.001654 per kilowatt-hour for distribution service and would decrease to \$0.000161 per kilowatt-hour for transmission service.

The rate proposed in this notice is the rate proposed by Duke Energy Kentucky. However, the Public Service Commission may order a rate to be charged that differs from this proposed rate. The foregoing proposed increase in electric revenues of approximately \$1.83 million or 0.54% over current electric revenues and an increase of \$3.62 million or 3.08% over current gas revenues.

A residential gas customer using 70 ccf in a month will see an increase of \$3.98 or 3.08%. A residential electric customer using 1000 kWh in a month will see an increase of \$0.30 or 0.30%. A typical non-residential electric customer using 40 kilowatts and 14,000 kWh in a month will see an increase of \$7.37 or 0.62%. Non-residential gas customers and non-residential electric customers using 1000 kWh in a month will see an increase of \$0.30 or 0.30%.

Duke Energy Kentucky's current monthly DSM rate for residential electric customers is \$0.001128 per kilowatt-hour and for non-residential customers is \$0.001128 per kilowatt-hour for distribution service and \$0.000848 per kilowatt-hour for transmission service. Duke Energy Kentucky seeks approval to revise these rates as follows: Duke Energy Kentucky's monthly rate for residential gas customers would increase to \$0.111800 per hundred cubic feet and for non-residential gas customers would remain at \$0.000000 per hundred cubic feet. Duke Energy Kentucky's residential electric customers would increase to \$0.004652 per kilowatt-hour and for non-residential electric customers would increase to \$0.001654 per kilowatt-hour for distribution service and would increase to \$0.000848 per kilowatt-hour for transmission service. In this notice is the rate proposed by Duke Energy Kentucky. However, the Public Service Commission may order a rate to be charged that differs from this proposed rate. Such action may be taken if the Public Service Commission determines that the proposed rates are not in the public interest. The foregoing rates reflect a proposed increase of approximately \$1.83 million or 0.54% over current total electric revenues of \$338 million or 3.08% over current gas revenues. A residential gas customer using 70 ccf in a month will see an increase of \$3.98 or 4.77%. A residential electric customer using 1000 kWh in a month will see an increase of \$1.59 or 1.80%. A commercial electric customer using 40 kilowatts and 14,000 kWh will see an increase of \$7.37. The foregoing rates apply to residential gas customers and non-residential electric customers served at transmission voltage in their bills from this application. Any interested party may by motion within thirty (30) days after publication of this notice request to intervene to the Public Service Commission, 100 North Boulevard, P.O. Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602, and shall set forth the grounds for the status and interest of the party. The intervention may be granted beyond the time period if good cause shown. Written comments regarding the proposed rate may be filed with the Public Service Commission by mail or through the Public Service Commission's website.
