All Bidders on the above titled Project are hereby advised of the following modifications to the Specifications and Drawings on the Project. These modifications will be a part of the resulting Contract.

SPECIFICATIONS

Item No. AD 2-1: Services of Manufacturers Representative (Section 01450)

Replace Article 1.1G with the following:

The minimum required number of on-site man hours required for manufacturer's representatives shall be as follows for all major pieces of equipment:

Rapid Mix #1 and Controls:	4 Hours
Clarifier #2 Equipment and Controls:	4 Hours
Clarifier #3 Equipment and Controls:	4 Hours
Flocculators #1-3 Equipment and Controls:	4 Hours
Flocculators #4-6 Equipment and Controls:	4 Hours

Item No. AD 2-2: Wage Determination Schedule (Section 00830)

Replace the Federal wage rates in Section 00830 with the attached updated wage rates for the project. Replace the Kentucky state wage rates determination "cover letter" with the attached revised cover letter dated 02/18/15.

Item No. AD 2-3: Water Valves and Gates (Section 02640)

Replace Article 2.6C with the following:

C. All slide gates shall be manufactured using NSF-61 approved materials of construction.

Item No. AD 2-4: Water Valves and Gates (Section 02640)

Delete Article 2.6E.1 and replace with "Not Used"

Delete Article 2.6Q and replace with "Not Used"

Item No. AD 2-5: Water Valves and Gates (Section 02640)

Add the following as Article 2.6R.4:

4. For 48" effluent slide gates as indicated on Sheet 01D105, 01D106, and 01D305 shall be wall mounted and fully supported with concrete wall anchors as specified and provided by the manufacturer. Anchors shall be adjustable to allow for proper vertical plumbing/leveling of the gate to facilitate alignment of stem with actuator. Remaining space between gate frame and wall shall be grouted following completion of proper installation and alignment of the gate and stem.

Add the following as Article 2.6R.5:

5. For 36" influent slide gates as indicated on Sheet 01D107, 01D304, and 01D305 shall be flange mounted to existing pipe. Full framed, self supporting, gate shall be fully supported and hung from suspended concrete slab ceiling of rapid mix as to not transfer significant load to the pipe. Manufacturer shall supply necessary hardware and mounting bolts for proposed mounting scenario.

Item No. AD 2-6: Cast In-Place Structural Concrete (Section 03310)

Replace Article 1.6D.2 with the following:

2. Testing services listed in ACI 301 shall be performed by a testing agency acceptable to the Engineer. Testing services to meet the requirements of ACI shall be paid for by the CONTRACTOR. Tests shall be made for each 50 cubic yards of concrete and/or each day concrete is placed.

Item No. AD 2-7: Motor Control Equipment (Section 16442)

Add the following as Article 2.1A.2:

2) Eaton / Cutler Hammer

Item No. AD 2-8: Drawing 01D107 - Rapid Mix #1 (Upper and Lower) Floor

Replace Sheet 01D107 with the revised Sheet 01D107 (attached). The revised sheet depicts changes in hatch size and orientation of the Rapid Mix #1 access hatch.

Item No. AD 2-9: Drawing 01D304 - Section (C and D) – Rapid Mix Basin #1

Modify Notes as Follows:

All notes indicating the size of the proposed access hatch to the Rapid Mix Basin #1 as 30"x60" shall be modified to read a hatch dimension of 42"x60" and the hatch shall be reoriented to match the revised positioning as indicated on the revised Sheet 01D107 (attached).

OPERATING ENGINEER CLASSIFICATIONS

GROUP 1 - Crane; Forklift

Operators on cranes with boom 150 feet and over, including jib, shall receive \$0.75 above Group 1. All cranes with piling leads will receive \$0.50 above Group 1 rate regardless of boom length. Combination rate shall mean \$0.50 per hour above the basic hourly rate of pay.

Employees assigned to work below ground level are to be paid 10% above basic wage rate. This does not apply to open cut work.

Operators on cranes with booms 150 feet and over (including jib) shall receive \$1.00 above Group 1 rate; 250 feet and over including jib shall receive \$1.50 above Class 1 rate. Combination Rate: All crane operators operating cranes, where the length of the boom in combination with the length of the piling leads equal or exceeds 150 feet, shall receive \$1.00 above the Group 1 rate.

Employees assigned to work below ground level are to be paid 10% above basic wage rate. This does not apply to open cut work.

WELDERS - Receive rate prescribed for craft performing operation to which welding is incidental.

Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (ii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classification and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" or "UAVG" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the "SU" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

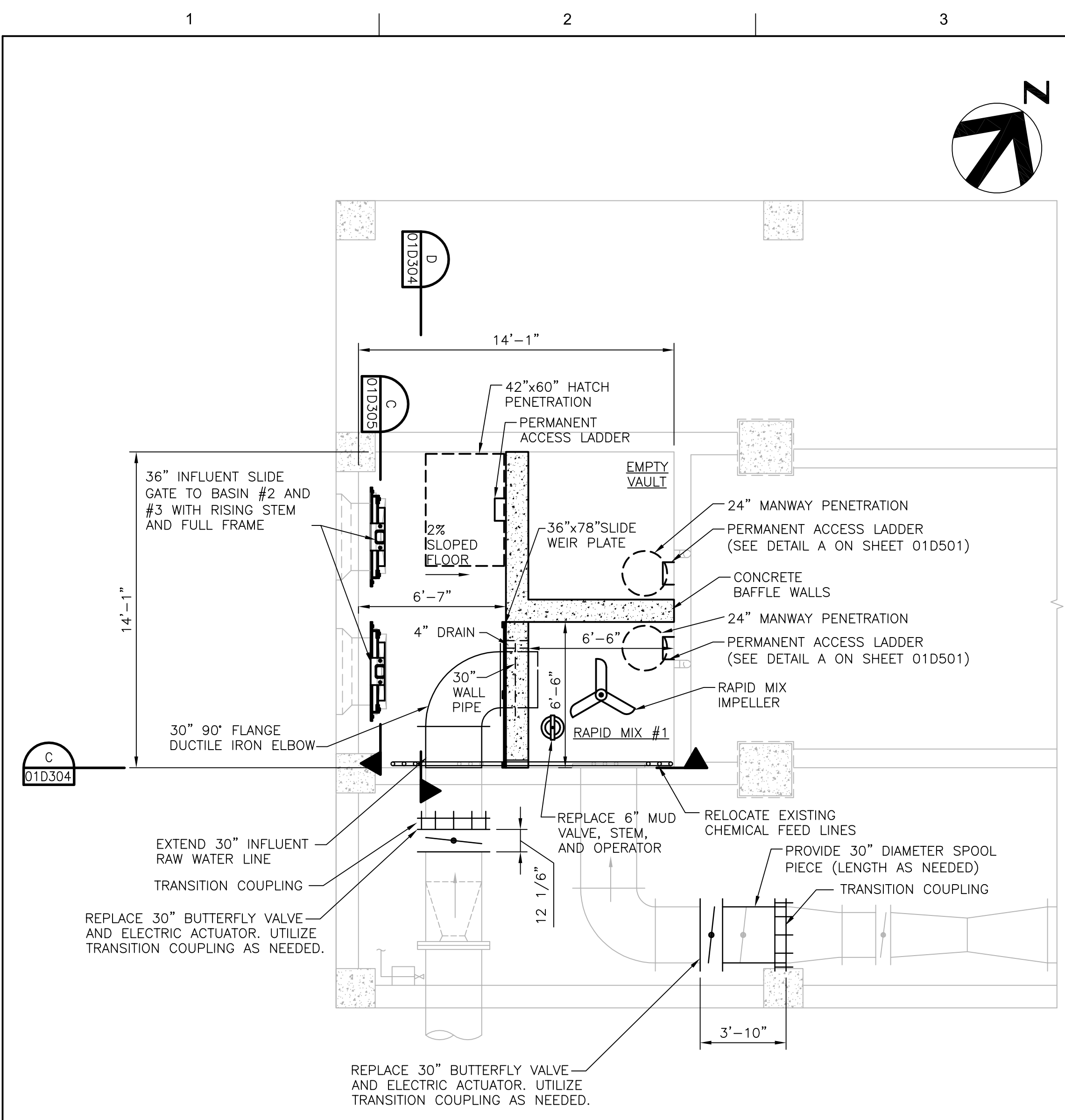

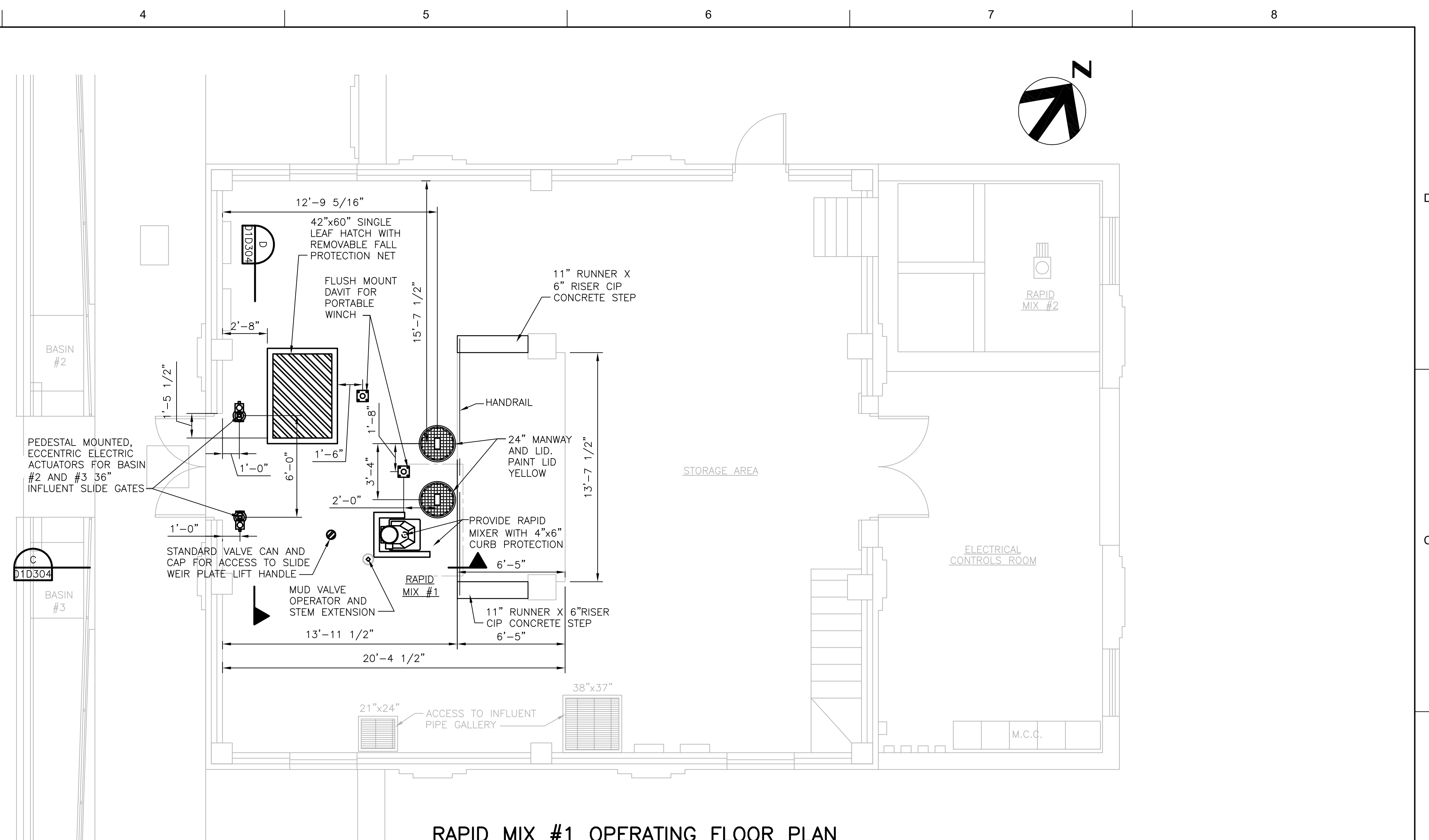

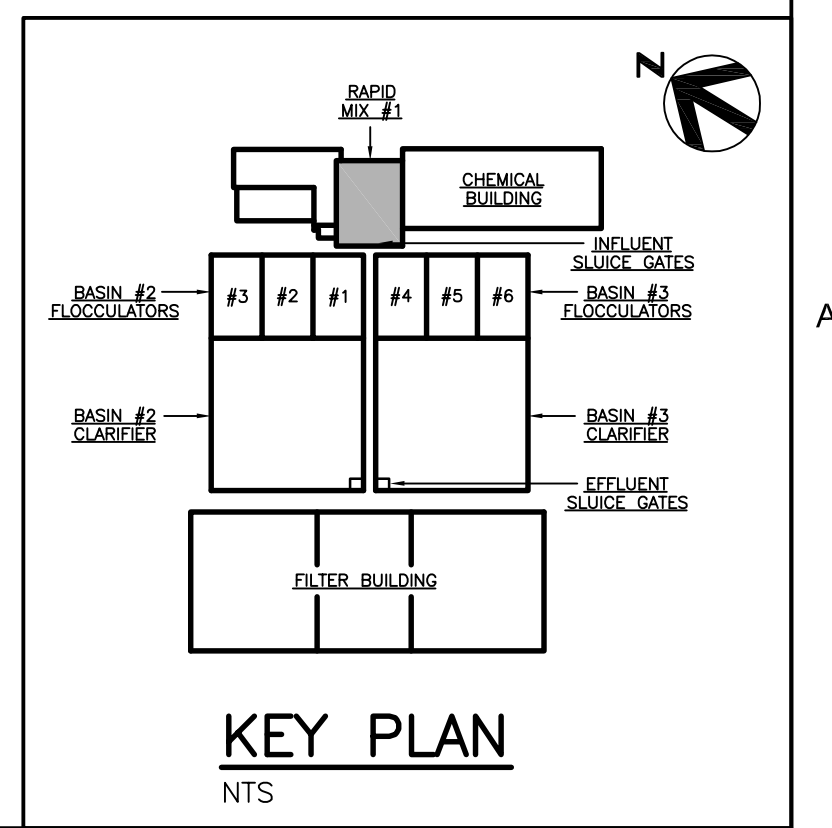




RAPID MIX #1 LOWER FLOOR PLAN

1/4"=1'-0"



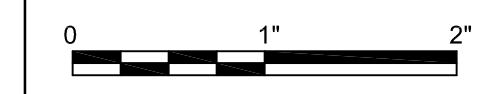
