Schutzman, Villa escape Bellevue

Senior pours in 36 points, 27 in the second half

In a Northern Kentucky Athletic Conference Division III battle that featured three lead changes in the final two minutes, it was Villa's expe-rience that won out over Bellevue's talented youth Wednesday night in Bellevue, 62-57.

Senior Thomas Schutzman scored 36 points, including 27 in the second half and 17 in the fourth quarter, as the Blue Lightning overcame a 46-40 deficit in the final period. Villa used intense ball pressure on the defensive end to force the Tigers into turnovers that cost them the game.

"I have an experienced team in general, but we make it interesting," Villa coach Nathan Dilts said. "Our older guys carried us tonight. Thomas has been playing for me since he was a freshman. Sometimes, with those kinds of players, you just look at him and say we're going to let you do what you do. He's that type of playmaker. They don't come around too often for any coach. We're going to go where he

Schutzman came into Wednesday averaging 18.2 points per game. He started off playing patiently against Bellevue's zone but knew exactly when his team needed him to flip the

switch and take over the game the

"I have trust in my shot and I know my teammates have trust in me to make plays," Schutzman said. "Being a senior, I just wanted to try and lead the team.

Junior Sean McIntyre added 12 points, seven of which came in the fourth quarter. He was the only Villa player other than Schutzman to score in the final eight minutes. He also had three huge steals down the stretch.

"We told our kids that coming out of the gate in the second half that we were going to change the game with defense," Dilts said. "(Bellevue) plays a tough zone. Unless you have somebody that can just flat out knock it down from the outside, we know that going to be tough to play in the halfcourt against them all the time so we knew we needed to get some turnovers and needed to run. That's what

fueled us. That's why we won." Bellevue led 46-40 heading into the fourth quarter and still had a fivepoint lead midway through the period after consecutive old-fashioned threepoint plays by junior Brett Maehren. Maehren led the Tigers with 21

Villa had the deficit down to one, 53-52, with under two minutes to play and then Schutzman scored on a baseline floater to take the lead. Bellevue sophomore Daniel Hill answered Schutzman and took the lead back for the Tigers with his only bucket of the game, but McIntyre scored on the ensuing possession to take the lead right back. Schutzman then nailed a three with 1:12 to play, pushing Villa's advantage to two possessions, 58-54.

Bellevue sophomore Tommy Ratterman buried his fifth 3-pointer of the game with 18.1 seconds left to bring the Tigers within one, but Schutzman sealed the win by making four straight free throws.

"I'll take the toughness we have," Dilts said. "I keep telling these guys we're as tough as any team I've coached. You're not going to come back on the road down six in the fourth quarter if you don't have a little bit of that toughness mentality to you, and I'm proud of our guys."
Bellevue only returned one player

with any type of varsity experience from last year's team, so the Tigers are still learning how to win. The closest game they've played in this year, win or loss, featured a 17-point

The biggest issue for us is our inexperience," Bellevue coach Jim Hicks said. "It really showed tonight. Our guys haven't experienced what it's like to play at the varsity level in a close game. We'll learn from it. We'll be better because of this game tonight.'

After playing to an 11-11 stalemate in the first quarter, Villa gained a little separation on a three from Schutzman followed by a floater from senior forward Will Martin to put the Blue Lightning ahead 18-14 with 6:15 left in the half.

Bellevue tied the game up at 20-20 when Ratterman scored on a baseline cut with 2:25 to play in the second. Ratterman buried a three a minute later to give the Tigers the lead back and Maehren followed with a three of his own to extend the lead to 26-20 at

Ratterman finished with 18 points.
