## JOINT MOTION TO SUSPEND CURRENT PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE AND WITHDRAWAL OF PENDING MOTIONS WITHOUT PREJUDICE.

The undersigned parties to this proceeding, having agreed to the withdrawal of the pending motions described below without prejudice, respectfully move the Commission to enter an Order suspending the current procedural schedule and state as follows:

1. On December 7, 2016, Applicant CompSouth<sup>1</sup> filed a motion to compel discovery

responses from Intervenors AT&T Kentucky<sup>2</sup> and Verizon<sup>3</sup> and to extend the procedural

schedule.

2. On December 9, 2016, AT&T Kentucky filed a motion to strike CompSouth's

motion to compel and to suspend the procedural schedule and set a status conference.

3. On December 12, 2016, Verizon filed a motion to strike CompSouth's motion to

compel.

4. On December 15, 2016, CompSouth filed a Notice relating to the foregoing motions.

5. CompSouth, AT&T Kentucky and Verizon have now agreed that CompSouth will confer separately with AT&T Kentucky and with Verizon about CompSouth's discovery issues with each of those Intervenors with a view toward eliminating or at least narrowing the parties' differences. To that end, CompSouth hereby withdraws without prejudice the motion to compel it filed on December 7 and the Notice it filed on December 15, and AT&T Kentucky and Verizon hereby withdraw without prejudice the motions to strike they filed on December 9 and December 12, respectively.

6. CompSouth will confer with AT&T Kentucky and with Verizon about CompSouth's discovery issues with each of those Intervenors during approximately the next week. If discovery issues remain, CompSouth intends to file a new motion to compel relating to those issues, and the briefing will proceed in accordance with the Commission's rules, subject to the parties' rights to seek such extensions of time as may be appropriate. After the Commission rules on the new motion to compel, if any, the parties will attempt to agree on a revised schedule for the remainder of the case to submit for the Commission's approval.

7. If CompSouth's conferences with AT&T Kentucky and Verizon resolve all discovery issues, the parties will then attempt to agree on a revised schedule for the remainder of the case to submit for the Commission's approval.

8. The current procedural schedule includes a December 7 date for rebuttal testimony and a December 28 date for submission of briefs. The parties agree that in light of the ongoing discovery activity, these dates cannot hold. Accordingly, the parties respectfully move the Commission to enter an Order suspending the current procedural schedule in its entirety.
