MOTION TO CORRECT ORDER

Monroe County Water District ("Monroe District"), by counsel, respectfully moves the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") to make certain technical corrections to its Order of January 12, 2018.

In its Order of January 12, 2018, the Commission establishes two schedules of rates for Monroe District. The first schedule, set forth at Appendix A of the Order, establishes rates for water service provided from September 30, 2017 to November 7, 2017. The second schedule, set forth at Appendix B of the Order, establishes rates for water service provided on and after November 8, 2017. This action appears based on two assumptions. First, Monroe District placed its proposed rates into effect on September 30, 2017 and then adjusted those rates on November 8, 2017, pursuant to KRS 278.015, to reflect an increase in the wholesale rates of its water supplier. Second, the Commission's Order of November 8, 2017 in Case No. 2017-00404¹ approved this adjustment to Monroe District's proposed rates for service rendered on and after November 8, 2017.²

The record shows that these assumptions are incorrect. As shown in Monroe District's Notice of Intent to Place Proposed Rates into Effect (Exhibit A) and its filed tariff sheets (Exhibit

B), Monroe District placed the proposed rates into effect at 11:59 p.m. CDT on September 30, 2017. As evidenced by the Resolution of its Board of Commissioners adopted September 11, 2017 (Exhibit C),³ Monroe District placed new rates into effect at 12:01 a.m. CDT on October 1, 2017 that reflected the proposed rates adjusted for the increase in Monroe District's cost of purchased water. KRS 278.015 permitted Monroe District to take this action without prior Commission approval.⁴ In its Order of November 8, 2017 in Case No. 2017-00404 (Exhibit D), the Commission approved the application of Monroe District's proposed purchased water adjustment factor to the proposed rates "for water service rendered by Monroe County **on and after October 1, 2017**."⁵

No need exists to distinguish between the rates charged for water service provided between September 30, 2017 and November 7, 2017 and those charged for water service provided after November 7, 2017. The rates in Appendix B are the rates that the Commission found reasonable and to which it then applied the purchased water adjustment factor approved in Case No. 2017-00404. They reflect the purchased water adjustment that occurred on October 1, 2017. Accordingly, the effective date for the rates in Appendix B should be October 1, 2017.

When a wholesale supplier selling water or providing sewage treatment to a water district; combined water, gas, or sewer district; or water commission increases its rates, the water district or combined water, gas, or sewer district shall have the authority to increase its rates commensurate with the wholesale supplier without prior approval by the commission.

Within twenty (20) days after any such increase in rates, the district shall file its revised tariffs with the commission, together with a copy of the notice from its wholesale supplier showing the increase in the rate charged to the utility, and a statement of the volume of purchased water used or sewage treated to calculate the increase in rates. The commission shall approve the filing or establish revised rates by order no later than thirty (30) days after the above documents are filed with it. Prior to or at the time of the first billing of the new rates, the district shall give notice to its customers of the increase

Given that proposed rates unadjusted for the wholesale supplier's increase were in effect for only two minutes, directing any refunds based upon the rate schedule in Appendix A serves no practical purpose. The amount of water sold in those two minutes is so small as to be impossible to ascertain and to bill at the proposed rate. To the extent that the Commission finds the rates set forth in Appendix B are reasonable, these rates should be applied to service rendered on and after October 1, 2017 and should be the only rates used to calculate any refunds that the Commission deems necessary.

As the Commission in its Order of January 12, 2018 required Monroe District to file revised tariff sheets reflecting the rates set forth in that Order, including an effective date for such rates, Monroe District asks that the Commission make all corrections necessary to remedy the noted errors no later than January 31, 2018.

Nothing contained in this Motion should be construed as acceptance of the lawfulness or reasonableness of the Commission's Order of January 12, 2018 or of the rates established therein or as a waiver of any right under KRS 278.400 or KRS 278.410. Monroe District expressly reserves all rights provided under KRS 278.400 and KRS 278.410.

WHEREFORE, Monroe District respectfully requests that the Commission:

- 1. Make the necessary corrections to its Order of January 12, 2018 to remedy the noted errors, to include:
- a. The elimination of any requirement to base refunds upon the rates contained in Appendix A;
- b. Requiring only refunds of amounts exceeding the rates in Appendix B that were collected between October 1, 2017 and January 12, 2018;
- c. Revision of the second sentence on page 21 of Order in the Section "Purchased Water Adjustment" to read:

The Commission finds that the purchased water adjustment factor that was determined in that case shall be used to calculate the rates in Appendix B for service rendered on or after October 1, 2017.

2. Issue the Order making the necessary corrections no later than January 31, 2018.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF MONROE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT ADJUSTING WATER RATES AND CHARGES TO OFFSET THE CITY OF TOMPKINSVILLE'S WHOLESALE RATE INCREASE

WHEREAS, the City of Tompkinsville, Kentucky ("Tompkinsville") is Monroe County Water District's primary wholesale water supplier;

WHEREAS, on August 8, 2017, Tompkinsville filed with the Kentucky Public Service Commission notice of an increase in its wholesale water rate from \$2.25 to \$3.00 per 1,000 gallons effective September 8, 2016;

WHEREAS, based upon the water purchases from Tompkinsville during the previous 12 months, the annual increased cost to Monroe County Water District will be approximately \$212,250.74;

WHEREAS, prudent financial management dictates that Monroe County Water District take immediate action to adjust its retail rates commensurate with Tompkinsville's wholesale rate increase; and

WHEREAS, KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068 provide the legal mechanism for Monroe County Water District to increase its water rates commensurate with Tompkinsville's wholesale rate increase via a Purchased Water Adjustment ("PWA");

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF MONROE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** The facts, recitals, and statements contained in the foregoing preamble of this Resolution are true and correct and are hereby affirmed and incorporated as a part of this Resolution.
 - **Section 2.** The PWA factor is \$0.99 per 1,000 gallons;
- **Section 3.** All tiers of all meter sizes of Monroe County Water District's tariff that are in effect as of 12:01 a.m. Central Daylight Time, October 1, 2017, shall be increased by \$0.99 per 1,000 gallons subject to any minor adjustment that may be made by the Kentucky Public Service Commission.
- **Section 4.** The Chairman is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file the PWA Application, Tariff Sheet, and all other documents that may be required by the Kentucky Public Service Commission.
- **Section 5.** The Chairman, all appropriate Staff, and Monroe County Water District's attorney are hereby further authorized and directed to take any and all other actions and to execute and deliver any and all other documents as may be reasonably necessary to implement the PWA.
 - **Section 6.** This Resolution shall take effect as of 12:01 a.m., October 1, 2017.

WHEREAS, on September 11, 2017, the Board of Commissioners of Monroe County Water District adopted a resolution to increase all tiers of all meter sizes of Monroe County Water District's tariff that were in effect as of 12:01 a.m. Central Daylight Time, October 1, 2017, by **\$0.99 per 1,000 gallons** to reflect an increase in the wholesale rate of the City of Tompkinsville, Kentucky ("Tompkinsville");

WHEREAS, the increase was based upon the erroneous assumptions that the annual increased cost to Monroe County Water District from the increase in Tompkinsville's wholesale rate would be approximately \$212,250.74 and that this increased cost would be spread over total annual sales of 215,310,250 gallons;

WHEREAS, based upon the water purchases from Tompkinsville during the 12-month period ending July 31, 2017, the annual increased cost to Monroe County Water District will be approximately **\$213,841.49**;

WHEREAS, during the 12-month period ending July 31, 2017, Monroe County Water District sold approximately **227,609,403 gallons of water**;

WHEREAS, the use of these corrected assumptions results in a Purchased Water Adjustment ("PWA") factor of \$0.94 per 1,000 gallons; and

WHEREAS, the Resolution of September 11, 2017 should be amended, *nunc pro tunc*, to correct these errors and to ensure that the Monroe County Water District's customers are assessed rates that accurately reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Tompkinsville;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF MONROE COUNTY WATER DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The facts, recitals, and statements contained in the foregoing preamble of this Resolution are true and correct and are hereby affirmed and incorporated as a part of this Resolution.

Section 2. Sections 2 and 3 of the Resolution of September 11, 2017 are amended, *nunc pro tunc*, to read as follows:

Section 2. The PWA factor is \$0.94 per 1,000 gallons.

Section 3. All tiers of all meter sizes of Monroe County Water District's tariff that are in effect as of 12:01 a.m. Central Daylight Time, October 1, 2017, shall be increased by \$0.94 per 1,000 gallons subject to any minor adjustment that may be made by the Kentucky Public Service Commission.

Section 3. All provisions of the Resolution of September 11, 2017 that are not in conflict with this resolution shall remain in effect.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be retroactive to September 11, 2017.

ORDER

On October 13, 2017, Monroe County Water District ("Monroe County") applied for approval to adjust its rates pursuant to the purchased water adjustment procedure.¹

The Commission notes that in its 2015 Annual Report Monroe County reported a water loss of 18.6367 percent.² Monroe County's application provides updated purchases and sales information for a more current period than the 2015 Annual Report. Commission regulation 807 KAR 5:066(6)(3) states that for ratemaking purposes a utility's unaccounted-for water loss shall not exceed 15 percent of total water produced and purchased, excluding water consumed by a utility in its own operations. Based upon the updated information in the application and the percentage of other water consumed by

the utility in its 2015 Annual Report,³ Monroe County's unaccounted-for water loss is determined to be 15.9389 percent for the updated period.⁴

Reduction of Monroe County's unaccounted-for water loss to 15 percent would result in an approximate \$8,031⁵ decrease to purchased water expense. Potentially, Monroe County is paying \$0.04 per 1,000 gallons sold, for expenses associated with unaccounted-for water loss in excess of the allowable 15 percent⁶ threshold.

The Commission is placing greater emphasis on monitoring utilities that consistently exceed the 15 percent unaccounted-for water loss threshold and strongly encourages Monroe County to pursue reasonable actions to reduce its unaccounted-for water loss. Failure by Monroe County to make significant process towards reducing unaccounted-for water loss may cause the Commission to pursue additional action with the utility.

The Commission, having reviewed the record and being sufficiently advised, finds that:

1. Monroe County purchases water from the city of Tompkinsville ("Tompkinsville"). Tompkinsville's dramatic wholesale rate increases to Monroe County over the past few years appear to be due in part to the city's excessive line loss of 71

percent, as reported in the 2012 - 2013 fiscal year audit.⁷ Tompkinsville has increased its wholesale rate to Monroe County from \$1.88 per 1,000 gallons in 2014 to \$3.00 per 1,000 gallons in 2017, an increase of approximately 60 percent. The Commission anticipates Monroe County's customers will gain some relief once the construction of its treatment plant is complete and operational in March 2018 the district will not have to rely solely on Tompkinsville as its water source.

- 2. Tompkinsville notified Monroe County that its wholesale rate would increase from \$2.25 per 1,000 gallons to \$3.00 per 1,000 gallons effective September 1, 2017.8 Monroe County proposes to increase the water rates to its customers effective October 1, 2017, to reflect the increased cost of purchased water from Tompkinsville.
- Monroe County proposed a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.94 per
 1,000 gallons.
- 4. During the 12 months ended July 31, 2017, Monroe County purchased 285,122,100 gallons of water from Tompkinsville. During the same period, Monroe County sold 227,609,430 gallons of water. The increase in the cost of purchased water is \$213,841.57, resulting in a purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.94 per 1,000 gallons.
- 5. The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.94 per 1,000 gallons, as calculated in Appendix A to this Order, is fair, just, and reasonable and should be approved.

6. Monroe County's proposed rates, as set forth in Appendix B to this Order, are fair, just and reasonable and should be approved for water service rendered by Monroe County on and after October 1, 2017.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that:

- The purchased water adjustment factor of \$0.94 per 1,000 gallons is approved.
- The rates as set forth in Appendix B to this Order are approved for water service rendered by Monroe County on and after October 1, 2017.
- 3. Within 20 days of the date of this Order, Monroe County shall file with the Commission, using the Commission's electronic Tariff Filing System, revised tariff sheets showing the rates approved herein.
