#### A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF ESTILL COUNTY WATER DISTRICT NO. 1 ADJUSTING WATER RATES AND CHARGES TO OFFSET IRVINE MUNICIPAL UTILITIES' WHOLESALE RATE INCREASE

**WHEREAS,** the Irvine Municipal Utilities ("Irvine") is Estill County Water District No. 1's primary wholesale water supplier;

**WHEREAS,** on March 24, 2017, Irvine filed with the Kentucky Public Service Commission notice of an increase in its wholesale water rate from \$2.587 to \$3.13 per 1,000 gallons effective July 19, 2017;

**WHEREAS**, the Kentucky Public Service Commission allowed the proposed increase to take effect on July 19, 2017

WHEREAS, based upon the water purchases from Irvine during the previous 12 months, the annual increased cost to Estill County Water District No. 1 will be approximately \$142,884.48;

WHEREAS, prudent financial management dictates that Estill County Water District No. 1 take immediate action to adjust its retail rates commensurate with Irvine's wholesale rate increase; and

WHEREAS, KRS 278.015 and 807 KAR 5:068 provide the legal mechanism for Estill County Water District No. 1 to increase its water rates commensurate with Irvine's wholesale rate increase via a Purchased Water Adjustment ("PWA");

### NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF ESTILL COUNTY WATER DISTRICT NO. 1 AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** The facts, recitals, and statements contained in the foregoing preamble of this Resolution are true and correct and are hereby affirmed and incorporated as a part of this Resolution.

- Section 2. The PWA factor is \$0.89 per 1,000 gallons;
- **Section 3.** All tiers of all meter sizes of Estill County Water District No. 1's existing tariff shall be increased by \$0.89 per 1,000 gallons, effective this day, subject to any minor adjustment that may be made by the Kentucky Public Service Commission.
- Section 4. The monthly water rates to be charged to and collected from the customers and users of Estill County Water District No. 1's water system shall be as set forth in Appendix A, which is attached hereto and is incorporated herein by reference as a part of this Resolution. These monthly rates and charges shall be in effect for all water service rendered on and after this day.

**Section 5.** The Chairman is hereby authorized and directed to execute and file the PWA Application, Tariff Sheet, and all other documents that may be required by the Kentucky Public Service Commission.

**Section 6.** The Chairman, all appropriate Staff, and Estill County Water District No. 1's attorney are hereby further authorized and directed to take any and all other actions and to execute and deliver any and all other documents as may be reasonably necessary to implement the PWA.

Section 7. This Resolution shall take effect upon its adoption.

- **Q-5.** State any actions taken, or proposed to be taken, regarding employee health insurance and dental insurance benefits by Estill District No. 1 in light of Commission Staff's recommendation to disallow a portion of the costs of those benefits.
- **A-5.** Estill County Water District No. 1's Board of Commissioners is considering the following actions to address the Public Service Commission's decision to deny recovery of \$29,641 of test period expenses related to employee health insurance and dental insurance benefits (approximately 33 percent of total test period employee health/dental insurance costs):
  - Requiring employees to pay a portion of health/dental insurance costs;
  - Limiting health/dental insurance coverage to single coverage to employees whose family members are eligible for insurance coverage from another source (e.g., spouse's employer);
  - Reducing health/dental insurance coverage to single coverage or employee plus child coverage;
  - Switching to a lower cost policy with reduced coverages and/or higher deductibles and co-pays; and,
  - Switching to a lower cost insurance provider that provides similar coverages.

The Board is very concerned that any reduction in employee health and dental insurance benefits will adversely affect the Water District's ability to retain and recruit qualified employees. As reflected in the Water District's response to Post-Hearing Request for Information No. 3, no employee has received a wage increase since January 1, 2015 and most employees have not received a wage increase since March 17, 2010. Any reduction in these benefits will be perceived as a reduction in total wages. The Board wishes to find and select the approach that is most cost-effective and the least damaging to employee morale.

The Board is also concerned that any change in employee health and dental insurance benefits be made gradually and that the Water District's employees have adequate time and notice to make necessary arrangements to adjust to any changes in insurance coverages (for example, locating insurance coverage for spouse or family members). The Board has established a target date of May 1, 2018 for identifying and beginning implementation of any changes. Estill County Water District No. 1 will supplement this response at that time or when it has taken action on this issue, whichever occurs first.

The project was completed in 2016 but year-end accounting adjustments had not been made by the Water District's auditing firm as of August 31, 2017. Those adjustments have since been made and none of expenditures related to the project remain in the Construction Work in Progress Account.
  - Phase IX (\$750). This project involved the construction of an elevated water storage tank, the construction of approximately 20 miles of water main, a booster pumping station, and the conversion of the Water District's meters to radio read meters. 



- **A-18**. The Audit Report for the calendar year ended December 31, 2016 is not yet available. It is expected to be filed with the Public Service Commission no later than December 31, 2017. The certified public accountant that Estill County Water District No. 1 has retained to conduct the audit and prepare a report has represented that his audit and the report will be completed and provided to the Water District no later than December 15, 2017. The report of the audit will then be reviewed at the next regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners, which is scheduled to be held on December 28, 2017.

The Water District has used the same accounting firm to perform its annual audit for several years. It generally conducts the audit after completion of the annual financial and statistical report required by 807 KAR 5:006, Section 4(2). Because of the auditing firm's work load and the delay in receiving information regarding the Water District's liabilities as a result of its participation in the County Employee's Retirement System, the auditing firm was unable to complete this report until October 31, 2017.

The Water District acknowledges that it has not in recent years submitted its financial and statistical report or its audit report in a timely manner and that its performance must improve. To that end, the Water District is considering contracting with a certified public accountant to work closely with the Water District's Office Manager and to review monthly financial statements prior to their submission to the Water District's Board of Commissioners. This arrangement would ensure that monthly financial reports are clear, accurate, and up-to-date when provided to the Water District's Board of Commissioners. This arrangement should also reduce the time necessary to conduct the annual audit of the Water District's records. The Water District has solicited a proposal from a local accounting firm to provide this service and will be reviewing it at its upcoming meeting.

# Estill County Water District WATER LOSS PREVENTION AND LEAK DETECTION PROGRAM

Estill County Water District has a distribution system that is comprised of approximately 400 miles of water pipe. The line size ranges from 12 inch down to 2 inch, with the majority of the lines being PVC. We have approximately 4000 customer services, 10 pumping stations, and 10 storage tanks. Estill County Water District purchases it water from Irvine Municipal Utilities and Jackson Water Association via 4 master meters. Water loss has been a continuing problem for the District for the past few years. The District is committed to allocating a sufficient amount of resources to identify and correct water loss, thus improving its operating efficiencies.

The following plan was derived using guidelines set forth in the Kentucky Public Service Commissions components of a water loss plan outline. The Districts water loss prevention and leak detection plan outlines processes and procedures that the District has been and will continue to conduct on a routine basis (both in a reactive and proactive mode) to identify and repair water line leaks, identify and monitor un-metered water usage, prevent tank overflows, and reduce its overall water loss.

- <u>Daily Master Meter Reading-</u> master meters are monitored weekly and pump run times and tanks levels are monitored daily through the Districts telemetry system. A history is kept of all tank levels and pump run times.
- Consecutive Timely Individual Meter Reading- all 4000 individual electronic meters in our distribution system are read in a 3.5 day time line. Our meters are read consistently beginning on the 10<sup>th</sup> of the month and only varying from the schedule only when a weekend or holiday fall on the in the 3.5 day time line.
- Zoning- the water District has worked with Kentucky Rural Water Association and our engineers to divide its distribution system into eight (8) zones that can be isolated to account for water usage in each zone. There are maps on file in the Districts office to show the different zones.
- Billing Software Utilization- the district has purchased new billing software to have enhanced reporting capabilities. Monthly billing records are used to determine water usage in the different zones in the District.
- Monitor Meter Installation- the water district has purchased meter sets with double shut off valves to install in small sections of areas with dead end lines with customers of one hundred (100) customers or less. The installation of these meters is currently underway.
- 6. Storage Tank Metering- the Estill County Water District has purchased a portable flow meter to use to monitor water flow from each tank as well as to check the GPM accuracy of the pumps. The portable flow meter may also be used to monitor the amount of water entering each zone for a comparison with each individual customer meter.
- Pressure Reading- the water district installs a pressure recorder monthly and keeps all recordings on file.

- 8. Meter Test & Change Outs- all residential meters have been replaced as of January 1, 2009. The meters in the system at this time are less than two (2) years old. The district has a certified meter test bench and district employees have been training with a C I Thornburg technician to further their education in meter testing in order to be certified meter testers in the near future.
- Part-time Operator- the water district's board of commissioners has discussed hiring a part time operator to allow existing employees ample time to utilize the leak detection equipment as well as search for leaks in the distribution system.
- 10. <u>Infrastructure Replacement-</u> sections in the water distribution system that have been determined to be prone to leaks, due to age of line or installation procedures in the past, are being replaced. At this time the district, with the help of our engineers, are putting together plans for a new project, the project profile is set to be presented to the Bluegrass Area Development District for ranking in the next 1-2 months.
- 11. <u>Pressure Reduction-</u> the district has utilized tank pressure in one zone of our area to take one pump off line therefore reducing pressure on an older line in the distribution system. Leaks in this area have diminished considerably due to fewer pressure fluctuations.
- 12. <u>Equipment Upgrades</u>- in the past few months the district has allocated \$15,000.00 for the purchase of several new pieces of equipment including a listening device, a line locator, and a flow meter to help locate leaks throughout our distribution system.

The Estill County Water District's Board of Commissioners as well as its employees have been and will continue to be committed to the reduction of the districts water loss. With continual monitoring, planning, and education it is the districts goal to lower the district water loss percentage to a level acceptable to the Kentucky Public Service Commission.

#### **ESTILL COUNTY WATER DISTRICT NO. 1 POLICY ON VALVE INSPECTIONS**

- O GPS information, for all valves, is located on the 2015 Map Books software located at Estill County Water District No. 1's ("the District") office.
- Valves should undergo an annual inspection using the District's color-coded zone maps.
- Valve inspections should include, but are not limited to, exercising the valve, inspecting the valve box and lid, and valve markers.
- O During the inspection, operators should identify any valve problems using the District's listening device, as Kentucky Rural Water Association recommends.
- o Any problems, with the valves, that are discovered during the valve inspection should be documented in a work order and repaired in a timely manner.

#### **ESTILL COUNTY WATER DISTRICT NO. 1 POLICY ON METER INSPECTIONS**

- Estill County Water District No. 1 ("the District") will read all radio read meters monthly.
   Meter reading should start on or around the 10<sup>th</sup> of each month and should be complete by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month.
- Monthly reports generated by the Sensus Meter Reading System should be utilized to locate misread meters or meters with high and low usage.
- o Any meters that are flagged, for investigation, by the Sensus Meter Reading System should then be manually read and inspected.
- Any meters that are abandon or inactive will be inspected annually to check for leaks or theft on the meter.
- All manual meters that have not been changed out to radio read type meters will be read and inspected monthly.
- O During monthly disconnects the District will inspect the disconnected meter for leaks and will recheck the meter, if service has not been reinstated after 7 days, for theft.
- Annually the District will inspect all meters in the distribution system using a PLD listening device, as Kentucky Rural Water Association recommends, to check for leaks on the service lines, meter bottoms, and regulators.
