"Section 7 - General Obligation: Maintenance of Sinking Fund. The Notes shall be full general obligations of the City and, for the payment of said Notes and the interest thereon, the full faith, credit and revenue of the City are hereby pledged for the prompt payment thereof. During the period the Notes are outstanding, there shall be and there hereby is levied on all the taxable property in the City, in addition to all other taxes, without limitation as to rate, a direct tax annually in an amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Notes when and as due, it being hereby found and determined that current tax rates are within all applicable limitations. Said tax, shall be and is hereby ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officers in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of said years are certified, extended and collected. Said tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof provided, however, that in each year to the extent that the other lawfully available funds of the City are available for the payment of the Notes and are appropriated for such purpose, the amount of such direct tax upon all of the taxable property in the City shall be reduced by the amount of such other funds so available and appropriated.

The City has heretofore established a sinking fund (the "Sinking Fund"), which is hereby ordered to be continued and maintained as long as the Notes shall remain outstanding. The funds derived from said tax levy hereby required or other lawfully available funds shall be placed in the Sinking Fund and, together with interest collected on the same, are irrevocably pledged for the payment of the interest on and principal of all bonds and notes issued under the Act and Tax-Supported Leases, as defined in the Act, when and as the same fall due. Amounts shall be transferred from the Sinking Fund to the Note Payment/Fund at, the times and in the amounts required by Section 6 hereof."

Lien For Taxes

The City of Williamstown has a lien upon the property assessed pursuant to the terms hereof for taxes and levied thereon pursuant to the terms hereof and all penalties, interest, fees, commissions, charges and other expenses, including court costs and attorney's fees incurred by reason of delinquency in payment of the tax bill therefore or in the process of collecting it and such lien has priority over all other obligations or liabilities for which the property is liable.

SECTION VI Purpose of Tax

The taxes levied and collected pursuant to the terms hereof shall be deposited in the General Fund of the City of Williamstown and appropriated and used for the general operating expenses of the City of Williamstown for the fiscal year.

It appears Northern Kentucky University's next president won't be Trey Grayson.

The former Kentucky Secretary of State and president of the Northern Kentucky Chamber of Commerce has taken a position with Frost Brown Todd, the law firm announced.

Grayson's name had risen to the top of the list for many as a successor to former NKU President Geoff Mearns, who left in July to become president of Ball State. Grayson had applied to become Transylvania University president in 2014. NKU is still searching for a president they hope to have in place by the end of the year, said Board of Regents Chairman Rich Boehne.

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
