
**MOTION FOR AN ORDER ESTABLISHING
A PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE AND
ASSIGNING BURDEN OF PROOF**

Lebanon Water Works Company (the “Company”), by counsel, moves for an order establishing a procedural schedule in this matter and assigning the burden of proof to Marion County Water District (the “Marion District”). Since Marion District seeks to unilaterally modify its longstanding contractual agreements with the Company, to abolish the single, uniform rate provision that has been observed for nearly a half century, and to create a new dual rate (i.e., one rate for city customers and another rate for Marion District), Marion District should be assigned the burden of proof in this proceeding.

In support of this Motion, the Company attaches a supporting memorandum and the written testimony of Daren Thompson.
