## MOTION TO CONSOLIDATE

Comes now Duke Energy Kentucky, Inc. ("Duke Energy Kentucky" or "Company"), by counsel, and moves the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") for an Order consolidating the above-styled case with Duke Energy Kentucky's natural gas rate case, Case No. 2018-00261,<sup>1</sup> which was filed with the Commission on August 31, 2018.

In support of this Motion, Duke Energy Kentucky states that consolidation of the two cases will result in greater administrative efficiency since the two cases involve similar issues of law and fact. Consolidating the two cases will also ensure that the parties do not spend additional time, money and resources litigating the same issues twice. Furthermore, consolidation will allow a more comprehensive review of the total impacts of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act ("TCJA") and will reduce the possibility of inconsistent outcomes. Indeed, the rate case already makes assumptions related to the TJCA as part of its filing.

The Commission recently granted the same type of consolidation to Water Service Corporation of Kentucky on August 30, 2018 in Case Nos. 2018-00043,<sup>2</sup> and 2018-00208.<sup>3</sup> In that Order, the Commission found that the two cases present similar questions of fact and law related to the TCJA and no parties would be prejudiced by consolidating the two cases. The Commission also found that this would allow more time to thoroughly review the impacts of the TCJA and will achieve administrative efficiencies.

WHEREFORE, for good cause shown, Duke Energy Kentucky respectfully requests an Order from the Commission consolidating Case No. 2018-00036 and Case No. 2018-00261.
