### Introduction

Butler County Water System, Inc. (Butler Water) provides water service to Butler County, KY outside the service area of the Morgantown Utilities Commission. In addition, Butler Water serves a portion of eastern Muhlenberg County. As of December 2017, Butler Water serves approximately 4,800 active customers. It is estimated that there are approximately 13 households within the Water System's service area that do not have access to an approved public water supply. The people living in most of these households are drinking contaminated water and the Water System is continuing its efforts to extend safe, potable drinking water to those households. The Water System will also install an Automatic Meter Reading (AMR) and leak detection system to improve the efficiency of the meter reading operation and improve water accountability for the entire service area.

The Water System has applied to Rural Development (RD) for funds to construct water lines in five (5) areas of Butler County that do not have a source of pure drinking water. The project also includes installation of an AMR and leak detection system. The information provided in this report more fully describes the proposed project (Project 18), the need for the improvements, and supplies appropriate financial summaries.

### **Summary and Conclusions**

The water line extensions and other system improvements referred to as Project 18 and as illustrated on the enclosed map (Exhibit A) are greatly needed to alleviate a serious health hazard. Examples of the current water supplies for the specific households affected by the project include collecting rain water off the house roof, drawing water from a wet-weather pond, and hauling water in a 275-gallon plastic tote on a trailer. These methods of obtaining water expose the members of the household to fecal material and parasites.



The proposed project to serve approximately 10 new households and upgrade the metering and leak detection system is economically feasible with a 9.95 percent general rate increase, a \$1,422,000 loan from RD, and a \$250,000 grant from RD. The project qualifies for the RD intermediate level interest rate on loan funds (2.750 percent).

### **Project Description**

The proposed project consists of construction of approximately 22,860 feet of 4-inch water mains and appurtenances. Approximately 10 meters will be installed adjacent to the mains to serve approximately 23 people. As shown on the enclosed map (Exhibit A), the extensions are located throughout the Water System's service area. The road names, length of the extensions, and number of new customers to be served is listed below. The AMR system installation will require modifications to all 4,800 customer meters and will include acoustic leak detection sensors.

### **Results of Bids**

On July 26<sup>th</sup>, 2017, Butler County Water System opened bids for the AMR and leak detection system material and on December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017 bids were opened for the water line extensions, encoder registers, plastic meter pit lids, and AMR system installation. The low bids were generally in-line with the original project budget. A summary of the bid tabulations is attached as Appendix A. The proposals of the low bidders are attached as Appendix B.

### **Project Budget**

The revised Project Budget, as-bid with adjustments, is presented on the next page. The quantities of meters, leak sensors, and meter reading devices were adjusted to balance the budget. The increased quantity of meters accounts for system growth during the project. The increased number of leak sensors will help reduce water loss and the extra meter reading devices will increase productivity and AMR system redundancy. The total number of leak sensors to be installed is 3,600.

### **Household Income Information**

Qualifications for funding from RD are based in part on the median income level of the households affected by the project. In order to qualify for the intermediate interest rate available, the median income level for households in the project area must be below \$43,342. An examination of U.S. Census data indicates that the median household income in Butler County is \$34,581. Since this income level is well below the required amount, the project qualifies for the intermediate level interest rate of 2.750 percent on RD loan funds.

### **Financial Considerations and Proposed Water Rates**


The methodology used in developing the Butler Water's existing rate schedule was taken from the American Water Works Association, Manual M-1, <u>Water Rates</u>, Section 5, "Rate Design for Small Utilities", published by the AWWA in 2000. Basic philosophy and methodology presented in other sections of that manual were also incorporated into the rate design.

It was determined that with the additional debt service and operating expenses resulting from the proposed project, a rate increase averaging 9.95 percent is required. The 9.95 percent rate increase will also cover a Rochester Dam Regional Water Commission withdrawal fee assessed to fund repairs to the Rochester Dam, the source of water for Butler Water. This increase will also allow an adequate margin for depreciation funds to be accumulated for system maintenance, minor improvements, and special programs.



As Butler Water's facilities continue to age and more facilities are added, the need for expenditures on maintenance and upkeep is expected to increase. Examples of major upcoming expenditures from depreciation funds include tank maintenance, plant maintenance, meter and line replacement programs. These are only a few examples of the many uses of depreciation funds that are required for system upkeep. Therefore, it is very important for Butler Water to implement water rates that result in sufficient revenue so that these funds will be available.

The schedule of water rates recommended in conjunction with this project is shown on the following page. Following the rate schedule is the Proforma Adjustment which shows the estimated revenues (which include the rate increase) and expenses for the first full year of operation after the completion of Project 18. Appendix A contains the Analysis of Actual Water Usage and Forecast of Water Usage income for the first year of operation. Appendix B contains the Forecast of Water Usage income for the new users.



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### 9.0 Exceptions to the RFP Requirements

The proposed Itron AMR system meets the requirements of the RFP with no major exceptions or "deal breakers". Itron's Mobile MC3 SME and Handheld IMR systems will collect Reading & Data logging information from the Itron 100W radio endpoints and leak data from the integrated Itron Leak Sensors. However, we have listed a few items of clarification and our assumptions related to the RFP below.

### Section 3.1 Objectives:

# The Vendor shall be responsible for the software integration with BCWS\WCWD's existing GIS, customer service, and billing software.

We have included estimated services to assist with these items. USS will provide technical guidance to CIS vendor and test interface files for accuracy and proper functionality. If additional USS service hours are required, they will be billable at the standard hourly rate. We have not included any charges/fees the CIS vendor or other 3<sup>rd</sup> party vendors may charge for integration. These charges would be the responsibility of BCWS/WCWD.

### Section 3.3 Scope of Work:

# G. Integration... GIS meter data is located with sub-foot accuracy and includes a unique identifier which links GIS to accounts in the CIS Infinity database.

The MC3 software can use the GIS meter data if the coordinates are included in the FCS download files created by CIS Infinity. This information would need to be included in the MTX record of the Itron FCS interface file.

### Section 4.1 Radio Frequency Meter Interface Units (MIU):

### H. The range will not be affected when the meter pit is flooded.

We understand RF friendly lids or Itron Thru Lid Antenna's will be used. If the MIU is installed properly, 1-3 inches below the meter lid, flooded pits will have a minimal effect on performance.

# V. For ease of future expansion of the system, it is preferred the MIU have the capability to migrate from AMR to AMI without reprogramming or replacement.

The Itron 100W endpoints (MIU's) can be used in either AMR or AMI mode. To switch from AMR to AMI mode, the MC3 can be used in a drive-by fashion to reprogram desired AMI endpoints in mass.

### Section 4.3 Meter Reading Software (Host Software)

A.4. Allow user to review and edit any account in the meter reading software database.

Users can review all items but limited items may be edited, such as meter reading.

A copy of Crystal Reports Developer and one (1) license is included with the FCS Host Software. Users can create new reports or a modified copy of existing reports. Additional Crystal Reports licenses are available at \$595 each.

B.7 Zero Consumption- Number of consecutive days with no consumption detected by the MIU.

FCS Endpoint Tamper report will list Active accounts with 0 usage for the reading period. It also includes Use on Inactive and High/Low Audit failures.

### Section 4.3 Meter Reading Software (Host Software)

B.16 Continuous Leak- The number of days a continuous leak was detected.

FCS report will list MIU's with continuous hourly usage for a period of 7 days or more.
