### Enjoy Fireworks SAFELY

Provided by your Gallatin County Emergency Management Office

According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), an estimated 9,700 people were treated in hospital emergency rooms for injuries associated with fireworks. More than half the injuries were burns and most involved the hands, eyes and head and 50 percent of the victims were children under age 15.

As the July 4th holiday approaches, the Home Safety Council urges families to enjoy fireworks the safer way, by attending locally sanctioned fireworks shows presented by professionals who adhere to safety codes.

Fireworks are not toys, they're devices designed to reach high temperatures, to burn and spark, and to explode and launch. They're unpredictable by nature and too dangerous for non-professional users. Dr. Gary Smith, Director of the Center for Injury Research and Policy at Columbus Chil-

dren's Research Institute in Ohio conducted a 22-year study of fireworks injuries treated in emergency rooms. What he found may help you understand the risk: • 67 percent of spark-related injuries were among children 5 years

or younger • 70 percent of patients treated for all fireworks injuries were male • Adult supervision was present in 54 percent of the cases • The eyes were injured in nearly one-third of the cases • The average age of patients was eight and 1/2 years

Although many states permit fireworks use by consumers, only trained and experienced experts should use or transport fireworks. Read more about fireworks regula-

tions in your state. Be aware fireworks safety is not a supervision issue. A fireworks injury can happen in the blink of an eye, whether or not a parent is standing by with a brocket of water. During the holiday, keep in mind that the safest manner use of fireworks is none at all. *Kentucky Division of Fire Prevention offers these tips:*

The Kentucky Division of Fire Prevention encourages Kentuckians to attend community events instead of celebrating with fireworks at home during this year's Independence Day festivities.

"Let the professionals entertain your family," said Mike Haney, state fire marshal and director of fire prevention for the Kentucky Department of Housing, Buildings and Construction. "By celebrating at a public event instead of at home, you reduce the risk of injury and property damage. You may also avoid violating the law."

Anyone who does celebrate with fireworks at home is encouraged to research state and local laws before doing so. For example, state law prohibits people under 18 from purchasing fireworks, and from setting fireworks unless supervised by a parent or guardian. Fireworks cannot be used within 200 feet of a structure, vehicle or other person, and fireworks cannot be sold to anyone who is under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

In addition to state law, local vendors are required to comply with local ordinances that apply to the sale, purchase and use of fireworks. "Local governments set their own firework ordinances, so be aware of the regulations in your own town," said Haney.

Haney also emphasized that safety and supervision are key to a successful and injury-free celebration. Haney recommends reviewing safety tips from the National Council on Fireworks Safety:

Keep your fireworks; read the labels and performance descriptions before lighting.

A responsible adult should supervise all fireworks activities. Never give fireworks to children.

Alcohol and fireworks do not mix. Save your alcohol for after the show.

Wear safety glasses when shooting fireworks.

Light one firework at a time and then quickly move away.

Use fireworks outdoors in a clear area away from buildings and vehicles.

The total capital cost of Phase Two is the Company's 2017 Environmental Compliance Plan is estimated to be \$23.3 million.

Federal and state environmental regulations require Duke Energy Kentucky to build and upgrade equipment and facilities that produce energy from coal to operate in an environmentally sound manner. Specifically, the Company is seeking Commission approval of a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the construction of Phase Two of the facility at East Bend. This Phase Two construction project requires an amendment of Duke Energy Kentucky's 2017 Environmental Compliance Plan that was approved by the Commission in 2017.

Additionally, Duke Energy Kentucky is seeking an order approving Phase Two for purposes of recovering the costs of Phase Two through its Environmental Surcharge tariff. Phase Two is required for the Company to comply with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's federal Hazardous and Best Waste Management System, Cleanup of Coal Combustion Residues from Electric Utilities ("Federal DCR Plan"), and other environmental requirements that apply to Duke Energy Kentucky facilities used in the production of energy from coal. The total capital cost of Phase Two for which the Company is seeking recovery of 50¢ per kWh is estimated to be \$23.3 million. DCR costs related to Phase Two will be similar to DCR costs incurred in Phase One and are not distinguishable.
