Worick Building On Paris' Main Street Had Swastikas On The Front



When we moved to Paris in 1979, one of the things we noticed on Main Street was a large, three-story brick building on the corner of Second and Main. The reason the building stood out was because of the large, white brick swastikas that were part of the decorative motif on the front of the building. When we asked about it, people told us that they weren't swastikas but instead an old symbol, possibly Native American in origin, that was a reverse of the symbol used (actually, abused) by the Nazi Party in Germany.

The building was torn down 18 years later but when I did a series of articles about "Lost Landmarks" in Bourbon County, I discovered that the well-rehearsed local story about the building was wrong. When I looked up "swastika," I found that the illustration showed a symbol matching the symbols on the front of the building. Of course, since the building was constructed in 1921 to house Workek Motors the symbol

1997 which showed the building being demolished, the building was originally built to house the Mammoth Garage. An ad in the newspaper in October, 1921 said that the Mammoth Garage was open for business. It wasn't too long after that that the building was sold to the Worick brothers – Wilson and Rees and they opened Worick Motors in that location. An ad for the company in 1948 proudly stated: "1924-1948, Twenty-four Years in Paris as Your Dodge Dealers. A Pioneer in the Field in Kentucky."

The husband-and-wife team of Berkeley and Jeanine Scott is working on a new book featuring historical photos from Paris and Bourbon County. Some of the photos from the Scotts' first two books on Bourbon County will be included in the new book but most of the book will contain new material. Anyone who has photos taken before 1960 that might be included should contact the Scotts at 859-987-5546. Photos can be scanned and the originals returned to the owners. Topics of special interest include farming, early schools and African-American life but a variety of photographs is needed for the new book.

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
