tiple sightings of a ghostly, bloody figure - was just beginning.

It saddled the Evansville area with a question no one has been able to answer for 65 years: who killed Andrew Reagan?

Andy

His friends called him Andy, and he was only 27 when he worked his way up to terminal manager at BB&I Motor Freight, Inc., in Evansville. He didn't plan to stop there, often regaling co-workers with tales of his massive ambition,

He certainly looked like an executive. Reagan was constantly draped in a sharp suit, and he boasted a handsome face and Cary Grant hair. He may have only been 5'4, but thick soles in his expensive shoes took care of that problem.

And on the night of Sept. 22, 1954, he decided to toast his good luck with a few beers.

After chatting with a co-worker on the BB&I docks for a while, Reagan climbed in his swanky 1954 Chevrolet - with its black body and cream top - and headed to the Lamplight Inn.

He killed a few beers there and took a quick detour to his apartment at Audubon complex, where he showered and changed into a gray suit. He then stopped at several other bars.

The last place anyone remembers seeing him was the Coral Room at 11:30 p.m.

Leads

By Sept. 24, Arthur Vaughn was officially worried. The office manager at BB&I, Vaughn never knew Reagan to be late, much less miss two days of work. So he was one of multiple co-workers who reported Reagan missing.

Police started digging. And it didn't take long for leads to materialize - some mundane, some wild.

Reagan recently had his Chevy repaired. A woman who worked at the shop told them Reagan had mentioned something about visiting his parents in Tompkinsville, Kentucky.

But the family said they hadn't seen Andy. And when police jimmied their way into his apartment, they found Reagan's overnight bag waiting inside.

A co-worker offered a juicier possibility. Reagan, he said, had been investigating the long-simmering thefts of cigarettes from the BB&I office. Maybe that had something to do with it?

Then there was the short, hairy man. Every night, driving his junker, he'd wheel into the Evansville Greyhound station to pick up a woman. But on the night Reagan disappeared, the ticket-taker noticed the man had upgraded his ride: a brand-new black Chevy with a cream top.

The strangest leads, though, were the horror stories.

When Tapp first examined Reagan's body in James C. Ellis' field that day, he determined Reagan had been dead for about five days.

He'd been missing for nine. What happened in that shadowy interim?

A farmer and his wife in Beals, Kentucky, might have had the answer.

Purgatory

"Tll give you \$20 if you will take me to Evansville." The farmer and his wife didn't know what to say. They had been enjoying the night air on their porch in Beals on Sept. 27 when the strange man stumbled into their yard and started promising them cash.

He'd walked from the direction of the Green River, which flowed about a mile-and-a-half down the way. He wore a gray suit and, judging by the way each of his words blurred into next, he'd been drinking. A lot.

They couldn't see him well in the darkness. But one attribute stood out: he was drenched in blood.

The farmer and his wife turned down his offer. What sane person would climb into a car with a drunk, bloody man in the middle of the night?

The man continued down the road.

###

Down the road from the farmer's place, a woman and her mother were standing outside their own home when they heard a "slow plodding" echo through the night.

A man in a gray suit materialized from the blackness. A trail of blood followed his every step.

He was mumbling to himself - something about a fight. A friend had beat him up and stolen his car, he said. Left him and his girlfriend stranded. But there was no girl around.

He walked a few more feet until he tripped and spun into a nearby ditch. That's when, according to the women, a car pulled up. It was a newer black Chevy with a cream top. When the car drove away, the man was gone.

###

A few days before that - about 48 hours after Reagan was last seen – a man was sleeping in his cabin near the Green River when a loud argument woke him.

He snagged a flashlight and stepped outside. A new

Chevy sat on the road. Inside it, the man could see two people fighting: a man and a woman.

He pulled the woman out of the car and looked inside at the fellow.

It wasn't Reagan - at least by the description the man with the flashlight later gave police. The fellow in the car was large, with overgrown sandy-colored hair. "Find my car, mister," he said.

Then the woman climbed back in and the car pulled away. The man with the flashlight got a glimpse of the license plate as they fled: 28-133.

Police ran the number. It belonged to Andrew Reagan

The car

And authorities would eventually find that car - six vears later.

A fisherman named Jack Adrianse was wading into the frothing Muskogee River just outside Big Rapids, Michigan, on March 29, 1960, when he saw something bobbing in the water: a1954 Chevy.

It was no longer in pristine condition. For one, it had been underwater for years. And two, its top and hood were smashed, leading authorities to believe it had been shoved off a nearby 200-foot cliff.

When they lifted it from the turbulent river, they found no license plates. When they ran the engine block number, however, they identified its owner: Andrew Reagan.

Whoever swiped it in 1954 drove it straight from Kentucky to Michigan, where they seemingly drowned it forever. But the strong current that spring had lifted it from its grave.

"(This is) the first solid clue in the case," Henderson Police Chief Fred J. Halle told the Courier a few days later. That clue ultimately led nowhere.

Police tracked down a few suspects, who in turn ratted on a few others, but none of them produced information that led to charges.

Months later, Michigan State Police said they were doing nothing more than "going down blind alleys,"

We are where we were just about a couple months ago," trooper Charles Hinman said.

Forgotten

And they've remained there for decades - as has every other agency that's investigated the case.

His killing did inspire the Evansville police to establish a homicide unit in 1954. And they put it to good use months later, when serial killer Leslie Irvin carved his terrible path.

But Reagan's death hasn't sparked the fascination that sometimes tethers itself to other cases. There are no splashy true-crime blog posts waiting online. No specials on Investigation Discovery.

All you can find on him in 2019 is a blurb on the Kentucky State Police's website. It asks anyone with information in the now 65-year-old crime to come forward. You can contact KSP Post 16 at 270-826-3312,

No one knows who killed Reagan. Who swiped his car and shoved it off a cliff 500 miles from home.

According to his friends and family, he had no known enemies. He was a well-liked man poised for a successful career.

Instead, he was left to wander through the remote wilds of Kentucky like a bloody specter, asking for help that never came.

Beshear takes to TV to defend Affordable Care Act

LOUISVILLE - Democratic state Attorney General Andy Beshear highlights his efforts to defend the Affordable Care Act and Kentucky's Medicaid expansion while taking aim at Republican Gov. Matt Bevin in the first TV ad of his campaign for governor.

The ad is scheduled to debut Tuesday and will air this week in the Louisville and Lexington TV markets. It stresses Beshear's clashing views with Bevin on health care despite having two tough rivals in next month's Democratic primary longtime state Rep. Rocky Adkins and ex-state auditor Adam Edelen.

Bevin is the target in another new TV commercial that focuses on the incumbent's verbal feuding with teachers and education advocates over pensions and charter schools. That ad is being run by one of Bevin's GOP challengers, state Rep. Robert Goforth.

Beshear's 30-second ad starts out by showcasing Lukas Stevens, a young boy with diabetes, as Beshear touts his efforts as attorney general to protect health coverage for pre-existing conditions. Beshear joined a

group of state attorneys general to defend the ACA.

The Trump administration told a U.S. appeals court it wants former President Barack Obama's health care law struck down in its entirety.

"That would hurt Lukas and nearly half of all Kentuckians," Beshear says in the ad. "Tm not going to let that happen. As attorney general, I'm helping lead a national effort to protect coverage for pre-existing conditions."

Bevin, who is seeking a second term, is an ally of President Donald Trump, who dominated in Kentucky in his 2016 run to the White House.

The case against the ACA - brought by Texas and a group of other GOPled states - appears headed for the Supreme Court. A federal judge in

Texas earlier ruled in favor of plaintiff states. That prompted the appeal that Beshear joined.

Trump has said a Republican health care plan would have protections for pre-existing conditions and lower deductibles. But there's no sign that his administration has a comprehensive health care plan.

Beshear also vows in his ad to protect Kentucky's Medicaid expansion.

It was Beshear's father, former Gov. Steve Beshear, who used an executive order to expand Medicaid.

Bevin says the expansion was too expensive. He won federal permission to require some Medicaid recipients to have a job, go to school or do volunteer work to keep their benefits. Bevin's administration estimated the changes would reduce Medicaid rolls by about 95,000 people and save state taxpayers \$300 million over five years.

In his ad, Beshear says: "I'll protect expanded Medicaid to provide access to affordable health care. Gov. Bevin won't."

Last week, a federal judge once again blocked the new Medicaid rules in a setback for Bevin.

"Every one of the ablebodied people taking

(Medicaid), is taking it right out of the hands, right out of the mouths and right out of the pockets of the people for whom Medicaid was designed," Bevin said last week. "We are going to stay the course."

Medicaid is a joint federal and state health care program for the poor and disabled. The ACA allowed states to expand the program to include adults with no children.

Meanwhile, in Goforth's ad, the Republican challenger says: "Are you fed up with Matt Bevin insulting our teachers, ridiculing our judges, demeaning Kentuckians?

Goforth says in the ad that he would "restore civility and respect all Kentuckians,"





outside town, thought she was complying with the new rules. She has been on Medicaid for years and already had a job, working seven days most weeks as a home health aide. Her wages — \$9.25 an hour, with 50 cents more for hospice patients — and her hours met the new rules. Yet she received a June letter saying she needed to verify that her income made her eligible, or she would be cut off.

She called the listed phone number and faxed information to a state employee in Pine Bluff. She was told that, like many people, she was exempt from the work requirements — in her case, because she was caring for her 20-year-old daughter recovering from a car accident and her 3-year-old granddaughter.

But on Aug. 18, she received another letter, saying she had been terminated because she had not verified her income. In December, four letters arrived saying she needed to update her email address, then 11 more in January. Each letter told her to create an online account. She doesn't have a computer and didn't realize that the program requires everyone to get an email address.

This winter, she applied to get her insurance back and is still waiting for an

answer.

In all these months, she hasn't seen a doctor for swelling in her right foot, which makes it hard to stand. Nor has she addressed the throbbing around the scar from her hysterectomy two years ago.

"I won't go" to the doctor, she said, having just finally paid off, in \$10 monthly installments, a hospital bill for X-rays she needed for a torn tendon before she got onto Medicaid.

"I am just putting it in God's hands," Cloinger said. "He is going to let me stay on this Earth to see my grandbaby be raised."

The kind of life on the edge that she leads is common here in Marianna, which has essentially been on a long slide ever since it grew up along the L'Anguille River, a Mississippi tributary, as a regional shipping hub. This early spring, the river is swollen

from winter rains. The town's population, 4,115, is lower than a century ago.

Of Arkansas' 75 counties, Lee ranks 73rd in life quality, according to the national **County Health Rankings** project. Computers are so scarce that even the public library has a sign out front saying it does "not offer the Internet" - a special problem for those dealing with the work requirement, since they were not allowed to phone in their monthly reports in the first several months.

For now, what is clear is that some people on Arkansas Works are confused - because of both a lack of understanding about what rules apply to them and contradictory information from the state.

Last summer, a month before the first people were cut from Arkansas Works, Murdock, the legislator, and leaders from a historic

health clinic teamed up to plan a workshop about the new requirements.

They handed out fliers at barber shops and public-housing complexes, ran radio ads, and got a donation of finger sandwiches for the 150 people, at least, they expected to show up. They set the time for the hour between when those with jobs got off work and when many went to church on Wednesday night.

Yet when the evening arrived, only one family showed up — and they came mistakenly thinking they might get help finding work. Melissa Buford, who helps people sign up for insurance and does community health work, thinks people didn't understand that the rules apply to them.

Murdock kept trying to spread the word at churches and barber shops. Buford

got a kiosk put inside the clinic to help people do their monthly reporting in a county where just 45 percent of homes have Internet access. Of the patients she offered to help, one man took her up on it.

In such a poor Delta town, she now believes, "to make job search a requirement, that is just wrong, because the jobs are not here.'

Even her 31-year-old daughter, Conisha Gatewood, got caught in the confusion. Gatewood was a clinic patient until she was referred to an obstetriciangynecologist for nonstop menstrual bleeding caused by ovarian cysts. But when she arrived for a September checkup, she was told she no longer had insurance. "I was like: 'Yes, I do. They sent me the papers in June."


She thought she had done everything right,

creating a password and an online account. The state had used an automated system to fill in her child-care job and work hours. A letter from the state confirmed that, she thought, telling her she did not need to search for a job because she already had one. But then another letter came, telling her she needed to do a job search after all.

"I was so confused," she said. "I already had a job. No one could tell me what I needed to do."

By the time she was cut off, she had found a better-paying position, selling cellphones inside a Walmart. In January, she reapplied to Arkansas Works - and was rejected because her December phone sales, high for the holidays, put her just over the income limit.

She has stopped filling prescriptions, including for the birth-control pills that
