WEST CARROLL WATER DISTRICT’S STATUS REPORT

Comes now West Carroll Water District (“West Carroll”), by and through the undersigned counsel, pursuant to the Commission’s March 13, 2020 Order and offers the following information for its status report due to be filed on July 1, 2020:

As the Commission has seen in the past few status reports, the current state of emergency for COVID-19 has slowed the merger/consolidation discussions between West Carroll and Carrollton Utilities. Over the past couple of weeks, as the restrictions due to COVID-19 have started to be lifted, West Carroll and Carrollton Utilities have begun reaching out to the necessary parties to restart those discussions. At this time, no meetings have been set in stone, but West Carroll will continue to work towards scheduling the necessary meetings to continue the merger/consolidation discussions with Carrollton Utilities, the city of Carrollton and other interested parties. West Carroll will continue to file monthly status reports to keep the Commission informed of any progress.
