

We are pleased to present our application for financial assistance for our Natural Gas Distribution System. I am the mayor of Drakesboro, Kentucky, a small town in Western Kentucky. Our natural gas system is aging and is need of many repairs and upgrades to address excessive loss of product and to assure safe operations today and in the future.

This application is in response to the Notice of Funding Opportunity for the Natural Gas Distribution Infrastructure Safety and Modernization Grant Program for Fiscal Year (FY) 2022.

Drakesboro, Kentucky is a home rule-class city with a Mayor and City Council responsible for the operations as the presiding governmental body. The City was incorporated in 1888 and the population was 515 as of the 2010 census.

We own and operate water, sewer and natural gas utilities for our community and a portion of outlying Muhlenberg County. We have our own employees for the operations and utilize contract assistance for any operations exceeding our capacity.

We have worked with various funding agencies for projects over the years and have utilized the assistance of our engineers and the Pennyrile Area Development District (PADD). This project is partially funded through the Kentucky Community Block Grant program and we are contracted with PADD for grant administration.

Applicant Eligibility

This project and applicant are eligible for the FY 2022 NGDISM Grant Program because the City of Drakesboro's gas system is a community-owned utility operating a natural gas distribution system.

Standard Title VI/Non-Discrimination Assurances

- 28 C.F.R. section 50.3 (U.S. Department of Justice Guidelines for Enforcement of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964);
- Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, (29 U.S.C. § 794 et seq.), as amended, (prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability); and 49 CFR Part 27;
- The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, (42 U.S.C. § 6101 et seq.), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of age);
- The Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, (PL 100-209), (Broadened the scope, coverage and applicability of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, The Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, by expanding the definition of the terms "programs or activities" to include all of the programs or activities of the Federal-aid recipients, sub-recipients and contractors, whether such programs or activities are Federally funded or not);
- Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act, which prohibit discrimination on the basis of disability in the operation of public entities, public and private transportation systems, places of public accommodation, and certain testing entities (42 U.S.C. §§ 12131 12189) as implemented by Department of Transportation regulations at 49 C.F.R. parts 37 and 38;
- Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended, which prohibits you from discriminating because of sex in education programs or activities (20 U.S.C. 1681 et seq).

The preceding statutory and regulatory cites hereinafter are referred to as the "Acts" and "Regulations," respectively.

General Assurances

PHMSA Natural Gas Distribution Infrastructure Safety and Modernization (NGDISM) Grant:

- 1. The Recipient agrees that each "activity," "facility," or "program," as defined in §§ 21.23 (b) and 21.23 (e) of 49 C.F.R. § 21 will be (with regard to an "activity") facilitated or will be (with regard to a "facility") operated, or will be (with regard to a "program") conducted in compliance with all requirements imposed by, or pursuant to the Acts and the Regulations.
- 2. The Recipient will insert the following notification in all solicitations for bids, Requests For Proposals for work, or material subject to the Acts and the Regulations made in connection with all (*PHMSA NGDISM Grant*) and, in adapted form, in all proposals for negotiated agreements regardless of funding source:

"The City of Drakesboro, Kentucky", in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. §§ 2000d to 2000d-4) and the Regulations, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that with respect to any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full and fair opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award."

- 3. The Recipient will insert the clauses of Appendix A and E of this Assurance in every contract or agreement subject to the Acts and the Regulations.
- 4. The Recipient will insert the clauses of Appendix B of this Assurance, as a covenant running with the land, in any deed from the United States effecting or recording a transfer of real property, structures, use, or improvements thereon or interest therein to a Recipient.
- 5. That where the Recipient receives Federal financial assistance to construct a facility, or part of a facility, the Assurance will extend to the entire facility and facilities operated in connection therewith.
- 6. That where the Recipient receives Federal financial assistance in the form, or for the acquisition of real property or an interest in real property, the Assurance will extend to rights to space on, over, or under such property.
- 7. That the Recipient will include the clauses set forth in Appendix C and Appendix D of this Assurance, as a covenant running with the land, in any future deeds, leases, licenses, permits, or similar instruments entered into by the Recipient with other parties:

That this Assurance obligates the Recipient for the period during which Federal financial assistance is extended to the program, except where the Federal financial assistance is to provide, or is in the form of, personal property, or real property, or interest therein, or structures or improvements thereon, in which case the Assurance obligates the Recipient, or any transferee for the longer of the following periods:
 - a. the period during which the property is used for a purpose for which the Federal financial assistance is extended, or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits; or
 - b. the period during which the Recipient retains ownership or possession of the property.
- 9. The Recipient will provide for such methods of administration for the program as are found by the Secretary of Transportation or the official to whom he/she delegates specific authority to give reasonable guarantee that it, other recipients, sub-recipients, sub-grantees, contractors, subcontractors, consultants, transferees, successors in interest, and other participants of Federal financial assistance under such program will comply with all requirements imposed or pursuant to the Acts, the Regulations, and this Assurance.
- 10. The Recipient agrees that the United States has a right to seek judicial enforcement with regard to any matter arising under the Acts, the Regulations, and this Assurance.

Additionally, you must comply with all other reporting, data collection, and evaluation requirements, as prescribed by law or detailed in program guidance.

Desc.: This project will entail the replacement of a portion of the Drakesboro natural gas distribution system including 4", 2", and 1" diameter distribution and service lines. There will be approximately 7,800 lineal feet of 4" diameter steel line replaced with 4" diameter polyethylene, 5,340 lineal feet of 2" diameter steel line replaced with 2" diameter polyethylene, and 46 service lines replaced in Phase I. In addition to the replacement of said

portions of steel line, we will be installing new rectifiers in the areas where the line will not be replaced in this phase to bolster the system and protect it from further corrosion/damage using impressed current cathodic protection. These improvements will reduce gas loss and make the

system sound for at least the next 50 years.
