MOTION TO RESCHEDULE HEARING

Mountain Water District (MWD), by counsel, moves for an order rescheduling the hearing scheduled for August 22, 2019. Dan Stratton, counsel for MWD, has trials scheduled in Pike Circuit Court the week of August 19. One trial begins August 19 and expect it to go through August 20, possibly 21.
