# Flu season is coming. and it could be nasty one

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says about 8% of Americans are sickened by the flu each year and that thousands die from the flu and re-

that thousands die from the flu and re-lated illnesses.

The CDC doesn't like to forecast whether the coming season will be rela-tively harsh or not, but the agency says the impact will be lessened greatly if people get vaccinated - and soonest is best.

The season generally starts in Octo-

The season generally starts in October and peaks in February before winding down with spring.

"Now is the best time to get your flushot," CDC press officer Scott Pauley said. "You want to get it before the season well's tracts." son really starts.

In Australia, the flu season is wind-In Austraia, the flu season is winding down. Ogbonnaya Omenka, an associate professor and public health
specialist at Butler University, says the
number of confirmed flu cases there
was the highest in history – more than
270,000, compared to almost 60,000 in

That may not bode well for the U.S.,

he says.
"It definitely is concerning because "It definitely is concerning because the U.S. flu season comes after Australia's," he said. He added that a U.S. child who tested positive for influenza died earlier this month.

Cameron Kaiser, public health officer in Riverside County, California, called the death of a 4-year-old boy

from Perris a tragic reminder of how deadly influenza can be.

"We should never forget that the flu
still kills," Kaiser said.



# Biker campground pushing to be a town

STURGIS – The South Dakota Su-preme Court will once again hear oral arguments in Buffalo Chip's quest to become a municipality, after a lower court ruled in February that the popular motorcycle rally campground near Sturgis must be dissolved as a town.

Sturgis must be dissolved as a town. The Rapid City Journal reports that oral arguments are scheduled for Sept. 30. Attorneys for the state have argued that Buffalo Chip was improperly incorporated in 2015 because it had fewer than 100 legal residents or 30 voters, as than 100 legal residents or 30 voters, as was required by law at the time. The city of Sturgis has also opposed Buffalo Chip's incorporation for years.

Buffalo Chip officials have argued that the area had more than 30 voters.

Kent Hagg, an attorney representing the campgound, said the case could come down to the difference between

the words "and" and "or." He said the law in place in 2015 required municipal ities to have at least 100 residents "or

In 2016, the state Legislature changed the law to require municipal-ities to have at least 100 residents "and" 45 voters.

Hagg said about 53 voters listed the Hagg said about 53 voters listed the Buffalo Chip as their address of record in 2015. The campground fills with thousands of visitors during the Sturgis motorcycle rally, but has few, if any, year-round residents.

The city has said in a statement that the judge's decision was based on common sense and plain language of the law. "It would not make sense for the Legislature to authorize the incorporation of a municipality with no residents."

# Taps cut off for 2M in Zimbabwe capital

HARARE. Zimbabwe - Tempers HARARE, Zimbabwe – Tempers flared Tuesday as more than 2 million residents of Zimbabwe's capital and surrounding towns found themselves without water after authorities shut down the main treatment plant, raising new fears about disease after a cholera cuthoral.

Officials in Harare have struggled to Officials in Harare have struggled to raise foreign currency to import water treatment chemicals; about \$2.7 million is needed per month. Meanwhile, water levels in polluted reservoirs are dropping because of drought.

For residents who have seen shortages of everything from medicines to have the control of the control

The toilets at school are just too "The toilets at school are just too filthy; people continue using them, yet there is no water," said 12-year-old Dy-lan Kaitano, who was among many uniformed schoolchildren waiting in line at wells, some shoving in impatience. "I didn't go to school today because I have to be here."

Everyone living in Harare is affected,

City Council spokesman Michael Chideme said, as residents turned to other options such as bottled water. He called it a dangerous situation because of the

it a dangerous situation because of the risk of water-borne diseases.
"It is a desperate situation," Deputy Mayor Enock Mupamaonde said outside the closed treatment plant.
At the Chivero reservoir, the city's main water supply, plastic bottles, vehicle tires and algae floated in the shallow water, which emitted a foul smell.

Zimbabwe's capital now frequently
records cases of diseases such as typhoid due to water shortages and dilapidated sewer infrastructure. Some
residents for months have been forced
to get water from shallow, unsafe wells
and defecate in the open.

"We are suffering," said Gladys Mupemhi, a resident of the low-income
Kuwadzana suburb, who said some
people woke up at 4.a.m. on Tuesday to
wait for hours in line. "We are only allowed a maximum of 20 liters of water
per person."

Emmerson Mannagagwa to express dismay that Zimbabweans were suffering
from a "medieval" disease.

And yet as much as Zellweger's per-formance is a whole-bodied acting feat, it's bodied acting feat, it's not mere mimicry. Her Garland may be show-stopping Oscar bait, but it's also a delicate and deeply felt character study. Its power lies in the fusion between Zell-weger and Garland— how they naturally con-nect despite diverging in nect despite diverging in drastic ways. Both were American sweethearts whose public personas, forged at the heights of fame, cleaved away from

them.
"I understand the dif-ferences between the projections that land on a public persona and the truth of the human ex-perience," says Zellwe-ger. "There are certain things about her experi-

She's also haunted by flashbacks with MGM chief Louis B. Mayer, who turned her into

The execu-tive is depicted as betive is depicted as be-ing responsible for her addiction to diet pills, preying on her insecuri-ties (he called her "my little hunchback") and, according to an unub. according to an unpub-lished memoir by Garland, regularly groped

The FAFSA asks for information about income, assets and ex-penses. A formula set

by Congress determines eligibility for feder-al and state aid. If the student is considered a dependent under feder-al guidelines, both the student and parents must provide financial information. Nearly all students going direct-ly to college from high school are considered dependent.


The information on the FAFSA determines if students qualify for ed money and provide funds on a first-come, first-served basis, so it is important to submit the FAFSA as soon as possible.

Even if they don't think they'll qualify for financial aid, students should submit the FAF-SA. They may be sur-prised because student aid rules change all the time.
