COLUMBIA GAS OF KENTUCKY, INC.'S MOTION FOR DEVIATION

Columbia Gas of Kentucky, Inc. ("Columbia") hereby moves the Kentucky

Public Service Commission ("Commission") for a deviation from 807 KAR 5:011

Section 8(2)(b)(3) which requires a utility to publish notice for three consecutive

weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the utility's service area.

Columbia's notice was scheduled to run for three consecutive weeks in twenty-nine newspapers in its service territory beginning the week of July 24, 2019. All twenty-nine of the newspapers ran Columbia's notice as scheduled the first week, however two newspapers did not run the notice scheduled for the second week and one newspaper did not run the notice scheduled for the third week. The Inez Mountain Citizen and the Floyd County Chronicle and Times failed to run Columbia's notice in its Wednesday July 31 edition, at no fault of Columbia. Attached hereto as Attachments A and B are signed letters from both papers explaining their failure to run Columbia's notice the second scheduled week. Both papers ran the notice the week of August 6 and will run the notice again August 14, for a total of three weeks, however it will not be three consecutive weeks. The Greenup County News Times ran the notice for two consecutive weeks, however, failed to run the notice for the third week. The paper will run the notice on August 15. Attached hereto as Attachment C is a letter from the Greenup News Times explaining its failure to run Columbia's notice as scheduled. All other papers will run the notice as scheduled for three consecutive weeks. Given these facts, Columbia's customers will receive the requisite notice on three occasions and will have the opportunity to participate in the above-captioned proceedings.

Therefore, Columbia respectfully requests a deviation from 807 KAR 5:011 Section 8(2)(b)(3).
