historical reports by electric and gas service. The Company's CMS billing system tracks past due amounts and payments for each account, and the receivables tables in CMS are updated on a real-time basis as payments are received. When past-due bills are charged-off, the billing system moves the unpaid electric charges to a separate electric charge-off account, and it moves the unpaid gas charges to a gas charge-off account.

The "Grand Total Incl. Arrears" column shows the total average bills (gas plus electric) including past due amounts by class and time period. The "Grand Total" column shows the current average bills by class and time period.

We encourage all customers to stay as current as possible with their payments to avoid building up a large balance that may be difficult to manage later. If you or anyone you know needs help paying, a number of assistance programs may also be available.

Finally, if spending more time at home is affecting your budget, consider these quick tips to help keep energy use in check:

- Wash full laundry loads rather than multiple, small loads. You'll save water, detergent and energy.
- Cover liquids and wrap foods before putting them in the refrigerator.
 Uncovered foods release moisture and force your appliance's compressor to work harder.
- Choose "sleep" over "screen save." While effective in preserving your computer monitor, screen savers require the same amount of energy as when a computer is in full use.

Throughout this challenging time, we will continue to provide you with more energy saving ideas and ways to save. And remember, customers with smart meters can monitor their daily consumption online to gain better insight into new usage patterns.

Duke Energy Kentucky's response pertains to the period between March 2020, and May

31, 2020. As such, the information provided herein does not reflect the total financial

impact of the pandemic. Duke Energy Kentucky reserves the right to supplement this

response.

Please see STAFF-DR-01-014 Attachment for a breakdown of incremental costs

and decreased income due to lower volumes by customer class.

Total incremental costs through May are \$0.826 million. Incremental costs are split

into six categories for DE Kentucky-Electric and DE Kentucky-Gas. Categories include

bad debt/charge offs, credit card fees, pandemic assistance for qualifying employees, safety

related expenses, cost for remote work, and other expenses. Many of these costs are

expected to continue to be borne by Duke Energy Kentucky over the coming months as the

impacts of the pandemic continue.

Total decreased income through May is \$3.842 million. Decreased income includes

two categories, (i) the reduction in weather normalized volumes and (ii) waived fees.

• Total decreased income due to lower volumes through May is \$2.975 million. The

calculation compares actual billed base revenues in 2020 and 2019 by customer

class for March through May, adjusted for weather.

Total fees waived through May are \$0.867 million. This includes \$859,342 of non-

assessed late payment fees (please see STAFF-DR-01-012 Attachment) and \$7,431

of return check fees waived.

RESPONSE:

Duke Energy Kentucky is committed to delivering reliable power and protecting the health

and safety of our customers and employees. During this pandemic, Duke Energy Kentucky

continues to help those dealing with financial hardship and support our communities

through the gradual process of economic recovery. For instance, in March, shortly after the

pandemic began, Duke Energy Kentucky proactively suspended service disconnections for

nonpayment, as well as late-payment fees and fees for credit card payments and other

payment types. The Company also temporarily suspended some of its field operations and

non-emergency work inside customers' premises, re-prioritizing the work of its employees.

The suspended work has resumed with appropriate safety protocols as it was not

completely avoidable and must eventually be completed. On March, 16, 2020, to assist

customers during the outset of the pandemic, Duke Energy Kentucky filed a notice to the

Commission that the Company would not exercise its statutory right to implement new

rates subject to refund prior to May 1, 2020 (30 days beyond the statutory suspension

period), as part of its pending electric base rate case, Case No. 2019-00271.

Notwithstanding the Company implementing new rates in May, during the months of June

and July, Duke Energy Kentucky's residential customers have experienced a lower average

electric bill than that of June-July 2019. This is driven primarily by lower costs of fuel.

While the Company has been methodically resuming some essential operational activities, consistent with its commitment to safely and reliably serve customers, it has done so with an emphasis on protecting the health of its customers and employees by incorporating appropriate safety protocols and personal protective equipment (PPE). Among other things, all Duke Energy Kentucky's employees and contractors who may interact with customers or engage in field work have access to necessary PPE and maintain social distancing to the extent practicable. Materials and equipment such as tools and vehicles are cleaned regularly, as often as after each job. In instances where entry into a customer's premises is needed to perform an essential or safety-related service, Duke Energy Kentucky's personnel have been trained to complete a verbal screening, commonplace today, to elicit any COVID-related concerns with entry. For work that must be scheduled, the Company contacts customers in advance to inform them of the nature of the work, and the safety protocols that will be used. Customers have the right to refuse and reschedule the service at a later date unless an identified safety concern exists that creates a hazard with a delay.

Additionally, Duke Energy Kentucky has been proactively working with residential and non-residential customers who are accumulating past-due balances on their utility bills, offering multiple payment plan options to mitigate potentially more significant financial challenges in the future.

Duke Energy Kentucky will continue to provide assistance to residential and business customers whose accounts have fallen behind due to illness or lost wages.

Support for these efforts include:

• Offering extended payment arrangement that best fits their needs.

- Continued access to Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program
 (LIHEAP) and other funds available through communities' agencies.
- Professional guidance for small business customers to help analyze their energy usage, discuss energy rates and identify solutions to help lower their energy bills as they are reopening.

Duke Energy Kentucky is currently offering an online "self-help" automatic extended payment plan opportunity for customers via the Company's website, whereby any customer wishing to automatically enroll in a 3- or 6-month payment plan can do so automatically without need to contact the Company's call center.

On a broader corporate level, Duke Energy Corp., through its foundation, is partnering with the Northern Kentucky Chamber and the Cincinnati USA Regional Chamber to provide financial assistance to local women-, veteran- and minority-owned small businesses impacted by the coronavirus. Each chamber will receive \$75,000 from Duke Energy to be distributed to qualified small businesses.

As Kentucky's economy has started transitioning back to regular business operations, with certain safety protocols in place to mitigate social contact risks, so should Kentucky's utilities be permitted to resume normal business operations, so that they may continue providing safe and reliable service to its customers consistent with existing regulations. As utilities are prohibited from exercising their legal remedies for non-payment, customers are not incentivized to make payments. As arrearages continue to grow, the likelihood that such arrearages will become insurmountable for customers increases, and likewise, the likelihood these receivables turn into bad debt, which in turn, impacts rates to all customers. The Commission should balance the interests of all stakeholders in establishing a measured and reasonable return to normal operations plan

that provides adequate notice for customers, along with appropriate accounting treatment to protect utilities from further financial harm. The nominal savings experienced during this pandemic will not offset the material loss of revenue experienced by Duke Energy Kentucky due to customer load reductions associated with the suspension of business activities and the longer economic downturn in the Commonwealth. Nor will those nominal savings offset the incremental costs the Company has incurred associated with, among other things, acquiring PPE, implementing remote work capabilities, ongoing sterilization of tools and equipment, establishment of new work protocols to protect employees (e.g., deploying more vehicles with fewer employees/passengers to maintain social distance) in response to the pandemic.

Regulatory commissions in nearby jurisdictions are already preparing for utilities to return to normal operations. For example, on June 26, 2020, Duke Energy Kentucky's parent, Duke Energy Ohio, Inc., in response to an order by the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO), filed it transition plan to return to "pre-COVID-19" operations. The plan is subject to a 45 day review and approval period. This plan includes, among other things, resumption of previously suspended non-essential utility work and normal billing practices in August 2020, with disconnections due to non-payment of bills commencing, after required notices, in September 2020. Numerous utilities have submitted similar plans for PUCO approval. The PUCO has also granted deferral authority for Ohio utilities for

The Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC) recently extended its

disconnection moratorium through August 14, 2020. Additionally, the IURC has stated that

all jurisdictional Indiana utilities are authorized to record COVID-19 related impacts

directly associated with any prohibition on utility disconnections, collection of certain

utility fees, and the use of expanded payment arrangements, which may be considered for

cost recovery in the future.⁴ Duke Energy Indiana has voluntarily announced it will

continue to suspend service disconnections for non-payment for an additional month,

through September 15, 2020. Similarly, Duke Energy Florida has announced its current

plan to return to standard billing and payment practices in mid-August, which means

customers in arrears will receive notices about their past-due balances and the earliest

possible date their service could be interrupted. That change could result in disconnections

for non-payment under regular credit and notice timelines during the month of September

for customers.
