MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

Kentucky Association of Electric Cooperatives, Inc. (“Kentucky Electric Cooperatives”), by counsel and on behalf of the jurisdictional rural electric distribution cooperatives among its membership,¹ hereby respectfully requests an extension of time until February 10, 2021, to respond to Commission Staff’s Second Request for Information propounded in this matter on December 22, 2020.

Commission Staff’s Second Request for Information directs the cooperatives to provide updated information regarding “the percent of customers, by class, that pay on time for each month in 2020, including for the month of December.” This request is in follow-up to Commission Staff’s First Request for Information, Item 9, to which the cooperatives responded in July of 2020 with data then available. The updated information is requested by January 18, 2021.

In order to allow the cooperatives sufficient time to compile and submit complete and accurate information, the Kentucky Electric Cooperatives seek a short extension of the deadline by which responses must be provided. Though no two cooperatives’ billing cycles, systems, and

processes are precisely the same, many (if not all) will be required to supplement any response filed by the existing deadline in order to provide complete data reflecting the year 2020, as requested, because the manner in which the cooperatives close their year-end books will mean that the requested December information will not be available until early February.

The extension of the deadline should permit each cooperative adequate time to ascertain and review the relevant information—particularly with respect to the month of December—and file that information in this docket. It does not appear any prejudice or undue delay will result from this extension of time, and having shown good cause, the Kentucky Electric Cooperatives respectfully request until February 10, 2021, to respond to Commission Staff’s Second Request for Information.
