## MOTION FOR DEVIATION

Pursuant to 807 KAR 5:066, Section 18, West Daviess County Water District ("West Daviess District") hereby moves the Kentucky Public Service Commission ("Commission") for a temporary deviation from the requirements of 807 KAR 5:066, Section 16(1) regarding the frequency of testing its 5/8- x 3/4-inch Sensus SRII meters. In support of its motion, West Daviess District states:

- 1. On June 8, 2020, West Daviess District filed an application with the Commission for a deviation from 807 KAR 5:066, Section 16(1) to allow its 5/8- x 3/4-inch Sensus SRII meters to remain in service for a period of 15 years.
- 2. When West Daviess District filed its Application, it respectfully requested that the Commission rule on the Application by October 1, 2020, to ensure that West Daviess District had ample time to remove and test all 10-year-old meters in 2020 if the Application was denied.

- 3. Given the Commission's heavy workload, West Daviess District understands that it may not receive an order approving or denying its deviation request in 2020.
- 4. To ensure that West Daviess District remains compliant with 807 KAR 5:066, Section 16(1), West Daviess District moves for a temporary deviation from the regulation to allow its 5/8- x 3/4-inch Sensus SRII meters installed in 2010 to remain in service until the Commission issues an Order granting West Daviess District's requested relief.
- 5. In the alternative, if the Commission does not grant the requested relief, West Daviess District moves for a deviation from the regulation to allow it **120 days** to remove and test all 5/8- x 3/4-inch Sensus SRII meters installed in 2010.
- 6. 807 KAR 5:066, Section 18 authorizes the Commission to permit deviations from 807 KAR 5:066 when good cause is shown. Good cause exists for West Daviess District's requested temporary deviation for many reasons. West Daviess District proposed sample testing pursuant to its Sample Meter Testing Plan ("Plan"), which was attached to the Application. If the Commission does not grant the requested temporary deviation and requires West Daviess District to remove meters installed in 2010, the Plan will be moot and require revisions before the Commission can consider West Daviess District's request. West Daviess District will incur additional cost and resources to update its Plan and the Commission will

incur additional resources to consider an updated Plan. Additionally, the savings associated with the Plan will be delayed.

7. Furthermore, as West Daviess District described in its Application, customers will not be harmed by the temporary deviation because the 5/8- x 3/4-inch Sensus SRII meters remain remarkably accurate at 10 years of age

WHEREFORE, West Daviess County Water District requests that the Commission grant it a temporary deviation from 807 KAR 5:066, Section 16(1) to allow its 5/8- x 3/4-inch Sensus SRII meters to remain in service until (1) the Commission issues an Order granting the requested relief; or (2) 120 days after the Commission issues an Order denying the requested relief.
