Please note the following important information:

 Pursuant to federal regulations at 7 CFR 1970.11(b), the Agency has determined that assured access to ReConnect funding for this Project

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is necessary for economic rural development. As a result, the attached Grant and Security Agreement is subject to the completion of all necessary environmental procedures required by Federal law. Given that all such procedures have not yet finished on your Project, no work on the Project, whether work which will be reimbursed through federal funds, or work which will be paid for with Awardees own funds, may be engaged until successful completion of the environmental reviews. Awardee acknowledges that unless it has received written notice from the Agency, it will not engage in any work on the Project, under any circumstances, except for that required to finalize the environmental reviews. Failure to abide by this requirement will result in the termination of the Grant and Security Agreement. Additionally, Awardee acknowledges that should any findings in the environmental reviews require significant changes to the Project, and as a result to the Grant and Security Agreement, such changes will constitute an immediate deobligation of federal funding and the termination of the Grant and Security Agreement, and will not result in an amended agreement until revised terms are agreed upon and funding is determined to be still available.

In accordance with the Agreement, compliance with Standard Form 481 (Form 481), Financial Requirement Statement, is required for loan and/or grant funding to be advanced.  The project must be constructed and operated in accordance with the Scope of Work submitted as part of your application. If any changes are required, a written request detailing the changes must be

The Commonwealth of Kentucky is committed to facilitating high-speed broadband access to our rural areas. Projects expanding last mile rural broadband in Kentucky are paramount to attracting economic development and tourism growth, higher education advances, interconnected public safety, and enhanced health care. Kentucky is appreciative of the USDA and the ReConnect Rural Broadband Program for their commitment to addressing this much needed infrastructure issue. This letter is to confirm that Kentucky meets the requirements for the State Broadband Activity for the Program's criteria.

State Broadband Plan:

Kentucky's updated State Broadband Plan includes KentuckyWired, the border-to-border, middle mile fiber optic communication backbone that is expanding the Commonwealth's reach into rural areas. When fully deployed within the next 12 months or so, this leading-edge communication infrastructure service will provide affordable broadband connectivity on a statewide basis, foster collaboration in unlimited ways, and promote innovative use digital technologies connecting the people of Kentucky to the world. The State Broadband Plan can be found on the KentuckyWired website: https://kentuckywired.ky.gov.

Utilities:

There are no Kentucky statutes that directly prohibit utilities from providing broadband service. Electric cooperatives may provide broadband by establishing a nonregulated business or activity as provided in Kentucky Revised Statutes (KRS) 279.020.



Right-of-Way Environmental Permitting:

The Commonwealth of Kentucky is committed to rapid expansion of broadband and information technology (see KRS 147A.023). Accordingly, the Commonwealth of Kentucky has taken appropriate steps to reduce or eliminate impediments to construction of broadband networks. In an effort to minimize both rights-of-way issues and the environmental impact of projects, the Commonwealth of Kentucky encourages potential projects to utilize, as much as possible, existing utility infrastructure. The Kentucky Public Service Commission followed the lead of the Federal Communication Commission in providing unfettered access to the underlying easements of existing utility companies through Pole Attachment Agreements. In the event that existing infrastructure cannot be utilized by the project, the Kentucky Eminent Domain Act, KRS 416 et. seq., provides an expedited process to gain access to the necessary lands. In addition, the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet added staff to expedite the processing of all permits associated with broadband technologies.

Map Certification:

The Commonwealth of Kentucky has not allocated any state funding for last mile broadband service. This letter acts as a certification that the proposed funded service area has not received any state funds for last mile deployment.

This administration has been committed to eliminating red tape, and removing the barriers to broadband deployment is consistent with this objective. We realize the importance in providing accessibility to high-speed broadband in all areas of the Commonwealth, and we will continue to support our partners in communities across Kentucky in creating this critically important service.
