



(1) In accordance with KRS 350.093, notice is hereby given that B&W Resources, Inc., 300 Liperote Way, London, Kentucky 40741 has applied for a bond release on permit number 897-0516 which was last issued on May 6, 2019. A Phase 1, Phase 2, and Phase 3 release is being requested for Increment 4. A Phase 2 and 3 release is being requested for Increments 1, 3, 8, 9, 10, 11, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 18 The application covers an area of approximately 450.59 surface acres located 1.60 miles southwest of Krypton in Perry County.

(2) The permit area is located approximately 3.30 miles south of the junction of KY 451's junction with State Route 28 and located approximately 0.10 miles west of Campbell Creek.

(3) The surety bond now in effect for increment 1 is in the amount of \$16,100 and approximately 40% of the original bond amount is included in the phase 2 and phase 3 release. The surety bond now in effect for increment 3 is in the amount of \$14,700 and approximately 40% of the original bond amount is included in the phase 2 and phase 3 release.
