14	Having considered the entire record herein and being fully advised in the premises, the		
15	Commission finds, concludes, and orders that:		
16	FINDINGS OF FACT		
17	1. On December 3, 2013, the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission" or		
18	"ACC") issued Decision No. 74202 in Docket No. E-01345A-13-0248. Among other things, Decision		
19	No. 74202 ordered that this generic docket be opened on net metering issues, and that workshops be		
20	held with all stakeholders to help inform future Commission policy on the value that distributed		
21	generation ("DG") installations bring to the grid.		
22	2. On October 20, 2015, at its regularly scheduled Open Meeting, during the course of the		
23	Commission's consideration of Docket No. E-01345A-13-0248, the Commission ordered that an		
24	evidentiary hearing on the value and cost of DG be held in this generic docket.		
25	3. Parties to this case are: The Alliance for Solar Choice ("TASC"), Clean Power Arizona,		
26	Freeport Minerals Corporation ("Freeport Minerals"), Arizonans for Electric Choice and Competition		
27	("AECC"), Arizona Solar Deployment Alliance ("ASDA"), Vote Solar, Arizona Utility Ratepayer		
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1 Alliance ("AURA"), Arizona Investment Council ("AIC"), the Residential Utility Consumer Office 2 ("RUCO"), Grand Canyon State Electric Cooperative Association, Inc. ("GCSECA"), Arizona 3 Competitive Power Alliance (the "Alliance"), Western Resource Advocates ("WRA"), Ajo 4 Improvement Company ("Ajo"), Arizona Electric Power Cooperative, Inc. ("AEPCO"), Arizona 5 Public Service Company ("APS"), Columbus Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("CEC"), Dixie-Escalante 6 Rural Electric Association, Inc. ("Dixie-Escalante"), Duncan Valley Electric Cooperative, Inc. 7 ("DVEC"), Garkane Energy Cooperative, Inc. ("Garkane"), Graham County Electric Cooperative, Inc. 8 ("GCEC"). Mohave Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("MEC"), Morenci Water and Electric Company 9 ("MWE"), Navopache Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("NEC"), Sulphur Springs Valley Electric 10 Cooperative, Inc. ("SSVEC"), Trico Electric Cooperative, Inc. ("Trico"), Tucson Electric Power 11 Company ("TEP"), UNS Electric, Inc. ("UNSE"), Patricia Ferré, Nancy Baer, Arizona Solar Energy 12 Industries Association ("AriSEIA"), Local Unions 387, 1116 and 769 of the International Brotherhood 13 of Electrical Workers, AFL-CIO ("IBEW Locals"), Lewis M. Levenson, Susan Pitcairn, Richard 14 Pitcairn, and Staff.

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4. On October 7, 2016, following an evidentiary hearing on the value and cost of DG, and 16 briefing by the parties, a Recommended Opinion and Order ("ROO") was docketed.

17 5. At the Commission's December 19 and 20, 2016 Open Meeting, the Commission 18 considered the ROO, along with several amendments thereto proposed by the Commissioners. The 19 Commissioners voted to adopt the ROO as amended by Andy Tobin's Proposed Amendment No. 12 20 (with verbal amendments) ("Tobin Amendment"), Bob Burns Proposed Amendment No. 3, and 21 Chairman Little Proposed Amendment No. 13.

22 On December 23, 2016, AriSEIA filed a letter in this docket requesting a change to 6. 23 certain amendatory language regarding grandfathering requirements as they appear in the Tobin 24 Amendment. AriSEIA requests that the Commission clarify that an interconnection request, and not 25 actual interconnection, govern grandfathering status for DG systems.

26 7. Also on December 23, 2016, APS filed its Request for Order Nunc Pro Tunc 27 ("Request"). APS states its belief that the Commission intended to tie grandfathering to the date 28 customers submit interconnection applications requesting interconnection to a utility's system, and not 1 to their actual interconnection date, over which a customer has no control.

2 8. On December 28, 2016, RUCO filed its Response to APS's Request, stating that it 3 shares APS's concern, and that it supports the Request.

9. On December 29, 2016, Vote Solar filed its Response in Support of the Request. Vote

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5 Solar states that setting a grandfathering date based on when a solar DG customer submits an 6 interconnection agreement is preferable to setting it based on when a customer is interconnected, in 7 order to provide solar DG customers more control over their grandfathering status. Vote Solar states that in two prior Commission Decisions,<sup>1</sup> the Commission established that solar DG customers who 8 9 file an interconnection agreement prior to a Commission Decision in a rate case would be 10 grandfathered. Vote Solar requests that the Decision in this docket be modified to be consistent with 11 those prior Decisions.

12 10. On December 30, 2016, TASC filed its Response in Support of the Request. TASC 13 states that it joins RUCO and Vote Solar in supporting the Request. TASC submits that language 14 currently stating "DG systems that interconnect to a utility's distribution system" should instead state 15 "customers that file for DG interconnection."

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11. On January 3, 2017, the Commission issued Decision No. 75859 in this docket.

17 12. The parties' requests to amend the language in Decision No. 75859 regarding 18 grandfathering are reasonable.

19 13. The grandfathering provisions of Decision No. 75859 should rely on the date a customer 20 files for interconnection, as opposed to the date interconnection is actually accomplished. Decision 21 No. 75859 should therefore be amended as follows:

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
