**Kentucky Power Company's Notice Regarding Electric Vehicle Charging Provision Of
Tariff R.S.**

The January 13, 2021 Order of the Commission approved the amendment of Tariff R.S. to include a time-of-day electric vehicle charging provision for residential customers.¹ The Order specifies that the service is to be provided through the Company's AMR meters.² Kentucky Power cannot, consistent with section 230.66 of the National Electrical Code and 807 KAR 5:041, Section 3(2), implement time-of-day metering using AMR meters in residences. Section 230.66 requires that the meters be UL-listed for installation within the customer's electrical facilities. The only such meters known to Kentucky Power are AMI meters.

The Company filed today a motion for rehearing requesting that the Commission amend its January 13, 2021 Order to provide that the proposed residential EV charging provision and rates are conditionally approved to be implemented upon grant of a certificate of public convenience and necessity approving the installation of AMI meters.

In accordance with the mandate of the Commission's January 13, 2021 Order, Kentucky

Power is including on Tariff Sheet 6-3 its proposed “electric vehicle provision” for residential customers. The Company prefaced the provision with the legend: “This tariff is unavailable to residential customers pending the Commission’s Order on Rehearing in Case No. 2020-00174.”
