Motion For Deviation From The Commission's Orders With Respect To The Publication Of The Notice Of Hearing

Kentucky Power Company moves the Public Service Commission of Kentucky for a deviation from the requirements of the Commission's January 15, 2021 and February 2, 2021 Orders with respect to the publication in the *Leslie County News* of the notice of the hearing in this case scheduled to begin April 6, 2021. Kentucky Power states in support:

1. Kentucky Power provided the required notice to Kentucky Press Service, Inc. in sufficient time for the timely publication of the required notice in each of the 20 counties in the Company's service territory. Kentucky Press Service contacted each of the newspapers on behalf of Kentucky Power and arranged for the publication of the notice in each publication the week of March 22, 2021.

¹ Kentucky Power filed its notice of request for publication on March 9, 2021.

- 2. Kentucky Power subsequently was informed by the Kentucky Press Service that the Leslie County News failed to publish the notices as scheduled. The notice is now scheduled to be published in the Leslie County News on April 1, 2021. A mockup of page three of the April 1, 2021 edition of the Leslie County News with the notice is attached as **EXHIBIT 1** to this motion. Kentucky Power is unaware of the reason the newspaper failed to publish the notice as originally scheduled.
- 3. The requested deviation will not prejudice the public or the Commission as notice of the hearing will be published prior to the hearing. Kentucky Power acted in good faith and with due care in arranging for the timely publication of the notices.

For the foregoing reasons, Kentucky Power requests that the Commission grant a deviation from the requirements of its January 15, 2021 and February 2, 2021 Orders.

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

She was a beloved


