"We wanted to let the people of Clay County know that we are a strong local company with knowledge and experience building fiber broadband," he said. "We are committed to the people of Clay County and committed to expanding our high-speed fiber internet into Manchester and other areas of Clay County."

The office is in the Manchester Square Shopping Center, near Walmart. 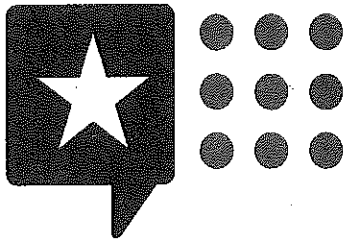

Taylor Gasser-Marshall fulfilled her calling for helping animals through MSU

Taylor Gasser-Marshall (left) didn't have a single moment where she knew she was a veterinarian. She had several.

"My mom presented it to me when I brought home every single thing I found outside and tried to rehabilitate it," she said.

A few moments stand out to her, though. There was the time, growing up in Canton, Kentucky, where she tried to "rescue" a mopping turtle the size of a hubcap under her front deck when she was almost eight years old. When she later moved to Richmond, Kentucky, she found a baby robin by a porch cone which she then aptly named "Birdie" and nursed it back to health.

"He went on to attack anyone with red hair because he thought they would also feed him," she said, laughing.

Gasser-Marshall is still fixated on animals, health and well-being as an emergency veterinarian at the Metropolitan Veterinary Specialists and Emergency Service in Lexington. It took her a unique journey to get there (more on that later) — a journey that started at Morehead State.

When Gasser-Marshall came to MSU, Gasser-Marshall wanted to enroll after seeing the 325-acre University Farm and meeting the attentive staff and veterinary interns. She was enrolled in the George M.



London, Jr. Academic Honors Program, earning two bachelor's degrees in veterinary medicine and Spanish when she graduated in 2019.

While she was a student, she was active with Delta Zeta Sorority, participated in Sigma Delta Pi — National Collegiate Hispanic Honor Society, and worked with the campus service dog organization, 4 Paws for Ability.

"My time in classes with Dr. Proctor to this day when he would let me into the veterinarian office today."

"I always joke to him my job is harder because my patients can't go. Oh, I ate two pounds of chocolate. That's why my heart is racing," she

discusses she traveled. Upon graduating from MSU, a "silly Google search" led to Gasser-Marshall enrolling in The Royal Veterinary College in London, England. She said she chose to go to vet school in London for the education model, the ability to practice in multiple countries upon graduation and the benefit of traveling and experiencing different cultures.

"I would have never thought leaving Morehead to go to England. I would have seen the country. I've seen it," she said. "It satisfied this desire to know more than just what was right around the corner."

"She left London both with a degree and her husband, James. The couple met less than a year into the program when she served him working her way through school as a bartender. After returning to Kentucky in the summer of 2019, Gasser-Marshall worked her way into her current position as an emergency vet. She said the job is not without its challenges, whether it is the long overnight hours or the nature of her patients. It's a running joke with her siblings who also work in the medical field like her younger brother, Dr. Justin Gasser (18).

"I always joke to him my job is harder because my patients can't go. Oh, I ate two pounds of chocolate. That's why my heart is racing," she

said. "I like the challenge of being an advocate for something that doesn't have a voice."

Taylor Gasser said a day's work could include a common owner bringing their cherished pet in for a perceived emergency that turns out to be something minor or having to do everything from suturing a puppy's leg to stabilizing a patient before life-saving surgery. No matter the patient or the task, she feels fulfilled as long as she helps animals live healthy lives.

"I can genuinely say every shift I go on, I can say I did something to make sure an animal is better off," she said. "Right now, I feel like I am making the most difference where I am."

Gov. Beshear Announces \$36.2 Million in CARES Act Funding for Local Health Departments

SIXTY-ONE LOCAL AND REGIONAL HEALTH DEPARTMENTS ELIGIBLE FOR COVID-19-RELATED EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENTS

Gov. Andy Beshear today announced \$36.2 million in additional Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act funding for 61 of the commonwealth's local and regional health departments.

The funding will support reimbursement of costs incurred from combating the COVID-19 global pandemic and follows \$10 million in CARES funding announced in May.

"Kentucky's health departments have been on the front lines of our battle with COVID-19," Gov. Beshear said. "We thank our health department leaders and staff who have worked tirelessly to protect and improve the health and safety of our Kentucky families throughout this global health pandemic. We are pleased to announce this funding, which will help our health departments continue their critical work."

Cabinet for Health and Family Services Secretary Eric Friedlander said, "It is important that additional funding is available to these deserving families and to the heroes who are local and regional public health employees."

Dr. Steven Stuck, Commissioner of the Department for Public Health, said, "These federal funds will make a real difference in local communities by reimbursing health departments for eligible expenses such as emergency operations, community-based surveillance and reporting, education and screenings, distribution of personal protective equipment (PPE) and assessment of public health and medical surge needs."

He added that the funding assistance represents projected payroll expenses, contractual service costs, travel, and medical supplies that local and regional health departments are expected to incur in response to the pandemic.

Former Bath County Deputy Sheriff charged with multiple sex-related crimes

The Bath County Grand Jury returned a thirty-three count indictment last week against a former Bath County Deputy Sheriff on charges of rape, sexual abuse and other sex-related charges.

Joshua Eugene Preece, 30, of Morehead, was indicted last Thursday on one count of third-degree rape, two counts of first-degree sexual abuse, fourteen counts of promoting a sexual performance by a minor, four...

counts of possession of matter portraying a sexual performance by a minor, and one count of distribution of matter portraying a sexual performance by a minor. The charges are the...

result of an investigation by the Secret Service Electronic Crimes Task Force and the Kentucky State Police.

Sgt. P. Zalone and Det. C. Gahhart provided testimony to the Grand Jury in this case.

According to a press release from Kentucky Attorney General Daniel Cameron's office, Preece is accused of requesting and receiving sexually graphic images from minors online from November 2017 through October 2018.

The investigation also accuses Preece of raping and sexually assaulting a minor on November 5, 2018.

All of the charges are Class D felonies, punishable by one to five years in prison, except for the promotion charge, which...

is a Class C felony, punishable by five to ten years in prison.

After the investigation, the Attorney General's Office of Special Prosecutions was appointed to handle the case.

Assistant Attorney General Reva Zakharin will prosecute the case on behalf of the Commonwealth.

"My Office of Special Prosecutions is committed to working with state and federal law enforcement to charge and prosecute those who commit heinous crimes against children," said Attorney General Cameron.

"Our children deserve to be protected, and I'm grateful to our law enforcement partners and my Office of Special Prosecutions for their diligent work to seek justice for the victim."

Preece previously served as a Kentucky State Police Trooper from 2005 before resigning in 2012 and later served as a Bath County Deputy Sheriff from 2015 through 2018.

He was arrested at his home in Morehead on November 8, 2018, by Kentucky State Police Trooper Michael Butler and charged with one count of prohibited use of an electronic device to procure a minor.

According to his arrest citation at that time issued by KSP Sgt. Joseph Zalone, Preece allegedly contacted the juvenile female victim on November 5 using the social media app Snapchat and asked her to send him nude photographs.

He was placed in the Rowan County Detention Center but was released less than 24 hours later on \$7,000 cash bond. He was suspended with pay at the time of his arrest.

Preece was taken into custody again by Kentucky State Police last Thursday and lodged in the Rowan County Detention Center under \$100,000 cash bond.

He is scheduled to be arraigned in Bath Circuit Court on August 6.

A grand jury indictment is a statement of charges against an individual before the case is turned over to a prosecutor and is not a conviction.

All individuals are considered innocent until proven guilty or pleading guilty in court.

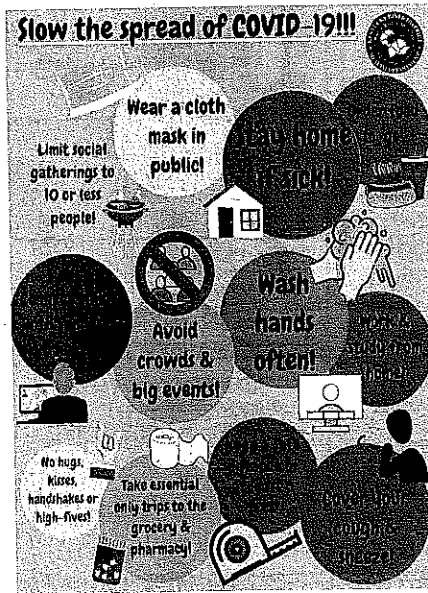

Continued from Page 4 you are concerned about this topic, the Extension Service has many resources that could help you get through this tough time. The rest of this week's column is dedicated to including children in the family budget. There are small adjustments that can make a big difference in the overall family spending. Especially when you know that the income is going to be lower. What needs will still be there and where can changes be made? Contact me for more information and if you would like to talk with a specialist on this topic, UK has family consumer science professionals who are ready and willing to help Kentucky families.

The COVID-19 pandemic has strained many families' finances. If your budget has recently tightened, it's important to communicate with all your family members about the new financial realities. This includes young people. Talking to young people about money may be difficult and uncomfortable, but it is an important conversation to have to make sure everyone understands the situation.

While they may not be financial contributors, young people do influence the family's budget with their needs and wants, and many times, they have an unrealistic view of their family's financial situation. You can approach conversations about family finances in age-appropriate ways. Perhaps one of the simplest ways to explain budget tightening is to talk with your young person about the difference between a want and a need.

A need is an item that is necessary for survival. Food, clothing, shelter and medical services are all needs. Most people's basic needs are the same. In contrast, a want is not a necessity but something you feel could add comfort and happiness to your life. Wants will differ among people depending upon their interests, tastes and lifestyle.

After explaining to young people about wants and needs, talk to them about opportunity costs. Also known as tradeoffs, opportunity costs are

things you give up in order to have something else. As many families tighten their budgets, parents can explain to their children how it is important to put some of their wants on hold and focus on the family's needs for now.

Including kids in family conversations, at an age appropriate level, builds their ability to understand topics such as budgeting and their understanding of how to make responsible decisions. Students who go off to college with experience in keeping a budget, doing their own laundry, buying groceries, basic cooking and time management are going to be more successful in the long run because they won't get distracted with the difficulties of life management. Building those skills over time is a great way to prepare a child for whatever comes their way.

None of us expected to experience a pandemic but it has become a reality around the world this year. We are still seeing new ways that it is affecting our lives. We want to protect ourselves and our families but we must also think about how we can use the situation to learn how to make good decisions and shape the future that we want for ourselves and our children.

Football practice on hold; to be re-evaluated next wk.

We were oh so close to the start of high school football practice this week. How close? About 30 hours.

The Morgan County Cougars were scheduled to begin a regulated practice on Wednesday at 6 pm. Coaches and players would've had temperature screenings at the field with conditioning and route running drills to follow in groups of 10-or-less—all without using footballs.

However, just before noon on Tuesday, Superintendent Dr. Thomas Potter elected to hold off on workouts, based on guidance from the Morgan County Health Department and the recent increase in positive COVID-19 cases. Administrators will re-evaluate the situation on a week-to-week basis.

"To be honest, I kind of expected this, even though I was hoping for better news," Head Coach Mark "Polo" Easterling said. "As coaches, we have a plan in place and the players are excited and ready to go. We'll continue to be patient and get started when the time is right."

With no mandatory "dead period" this summer, the Kentucky High School Athletic Association is allowing school districts to make decisions lo-

cally on the start of practice, which players would participate on a voluntary basis. The KHSAA has set August 3 as the official date for summer practice. At that time, player participation would be mandatory in order to gain eligibility for the season.

"I can't imagine us playing games any earlier than early-to-mid September," Polo said. "Until then, we're committing to be diligent, careful and strictly follow the guidelines. I'll be there with the thermometer before practice and do our part to keep everyone safe."

Once given the green light, the Cougars will practice six hours per week—two each on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday—while taking Friday off. Polo will divide his staff (Jeff Brown, Stuart Cook, Denny Lewis, Jared Hammonds and Don McKenzie) between the field and weight room and ensure guidelines are met.

"We've got a great group of kids—some who've played before and others that have not," Polo added. "I'm anxious to see how many come on day one—it could be 10 or 40. I understand some parents are still cautious. Again, we're prepared to do things the right way. Hopefully we can get started soon."

Before Extreme Heat

To prepare for extreme heat, you should:

- Install window air conditioners snugly; insulate if necessary.
- Check air-conditioning ducts for proper insulation.
- Install temporary window reflectors (for use between windows and drapes), such as aluminum foil-covered cardboard, to reflect heat back outside.
- Weather-strip doors and sills to keep cool air in.
- Cover windows that receive morning or afternoon sun with drapes, shades, awnings, or louvers. (Outdoor awnings or louvers can reduce the heat that enters a home by up to 80 percent.)
- Keep storm windows up

and regular meals. Avoid using salt tablets unless directed to do so by a physician.

Drink plenty of water. Persons who have epilepsy or heart, kidney, or liver disease; are on fluid-restricted diets; or have a problem with fluid retention should consult a doctor before increasing liquid intake.

Limit intake of alcoholic beverages.

Dress in loose-fitting, lightweight, and light-colored clothes that cover as much skin as possible.

Protect face and head by wearing a wide-brimmed hat. Check on family, friends, and neighbors who do not have air conditioning and who spend much of their time alone.

- Never leave children or pets alone in closed vehicles.
- Avoid strenuous work during the warmest part of the day. Use a buddy system when working in extreme heat, and take frequent breaks.

Drought can affect vast territorial regions and large population numbers.
