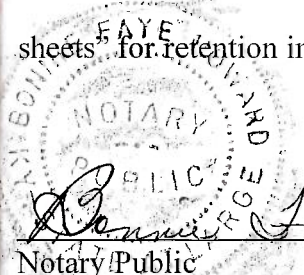

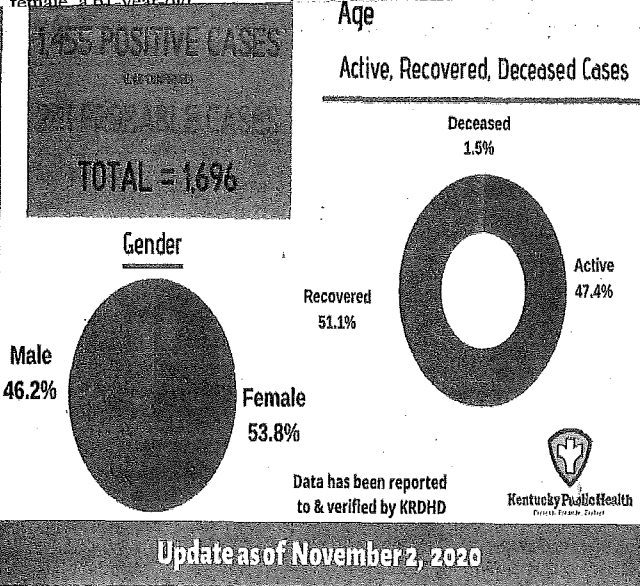

down the creek. Or, if they were interested in a place to eat, they could provide them with information on local restaurants.

Though council took no action on approving the plans at the time of the meeting, they told Messer-Conley they would continue to look into the chamber's request.

Council also heard from Carter County Public Library director Christy Boggs. Boggs informed council that two of the library board members chose to pick up the share of funding Grayson dropped he felt it was only fair to also cover the share for the Olive Hill branch. Fiscal court, however, has taken a "wait and see" stance instead of choosing to fund the entire cost of the library at this time.

While there is a group of concerned citizens who have gotten the library on the agenda for the next meeting of Grayson City Council, with hopes that they can come to some agreement with the mayor and city council, the county pledged their continued support for the library in their last meeting. That support, fiscal court has now said, will continue even if the Grayson branch ends up closing.

"The county needs

council had questions about whether the make-up of the board could change with Grayson's refusal to fund their share of library funding. The board currently includes members approved by each city council and by the county fiscal court, but that might need to change if the Grayson branch was closed due to Grayson City Council not including library funding in their budget this year.

Boggs told the Olive Hill Council the library even if it has to cut back to one branch.

In other action the court discussed the funding of an EMS helipad at the western end of the county. EMS have recently began refurbishing the helipad behind in the EMS office in Grayson. That upgrade includes new striping and the installation of lights. But EMS director Rick Loperfido has said the county also needs another helipad on the western end of the county for emergencies occurring nearer to Olive Hill than Grayson that require helicopter transport to a hospital.

"We have one here (in Grayson) and we probably need one over there," Malone told the fiscal court before asking magistrates

charged in a designated indoor firing range. The city also passed their property tax ordinance for 2020. That ordinance set the tax rate at the compensating rate of .237 cents per \$100 of valuation, for both real estate and tangibles.

Council also adopted resolutions transferring retirement coverage for police from non-hazardous to hazardous retirement coverage, utilizing KRS form 7005 for employees hired prior to September 1, 2008 and KRS Form 7008 for employees hired after. Malone is able to find a suitable location for the pad.

Court also moved to set election policy for county employees, granting them up to four hours of paid time off to vote, but giving them that time on Friday to participate in early voting rather than on election day. While fiscal court cannot see how employees vote, they can see if employees have signed the voter rolls, and employees would only be granted the paid time off if they signed in to vote.

The county also discussed road and bridge issues. Malone told the court that road crews "will get the cold paving done this year," and that the county also received almost \$200,000 in discretionary

to the 9 mm because of the lighter weight and the cheaper cost of ammunition. Malone said the county also expected bridge material to be delivered in the coming week for already approved bridge replacements on Appaloosa Lane and Flat Fork Road. Malone said no engineer stamp was needed on the bridges, which are on solid foundations, but that this would impact the weight rating of the bridges. If the bridges need to be rated for a higher load limit than the minimum weight rating an engineer would need to inspect and stamp the bridges.

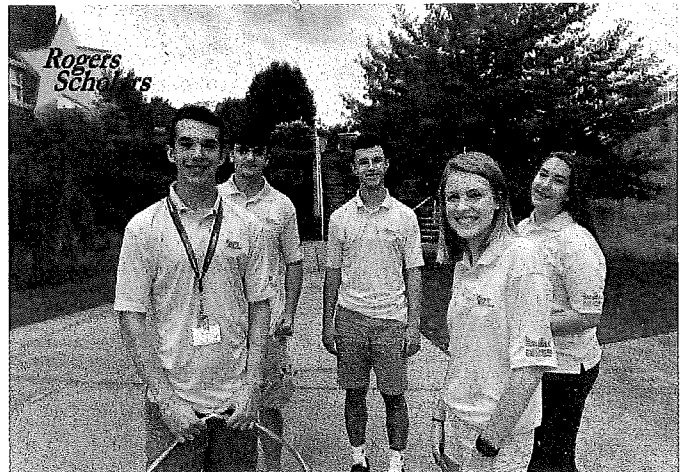

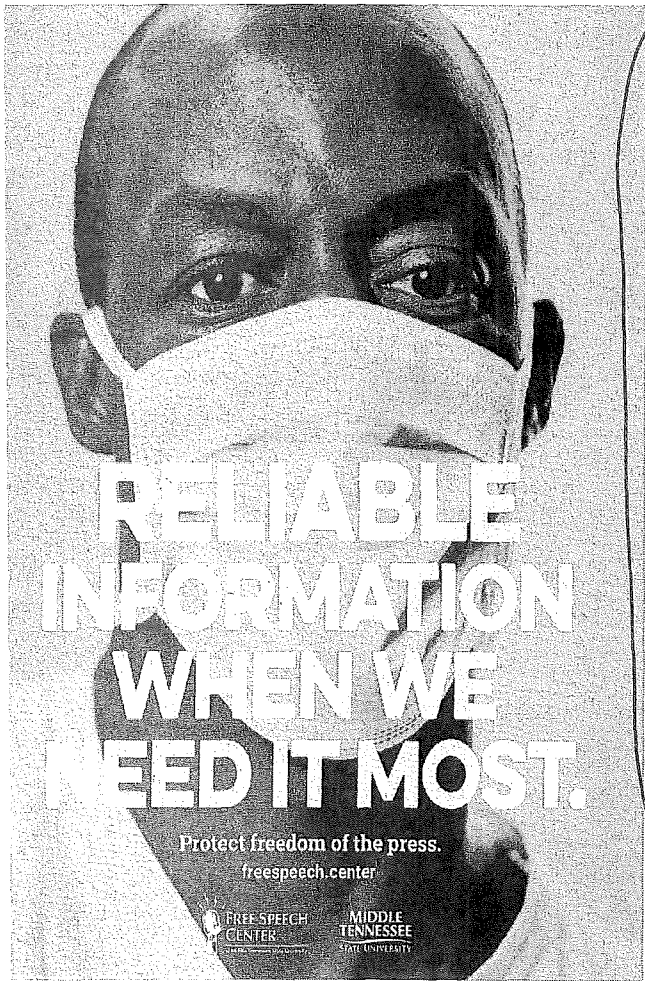

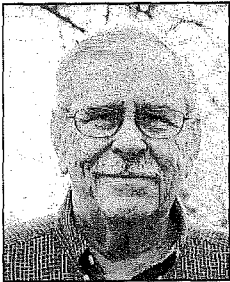

Last military assignment

When we returned stateside, Estelle and our children stayed with one of her sisters while I went to Jenkins to visit my parents for the first time in three years, and to work on our second car that we had to leave stateside for the three years.

After a couple of weeks, I drove back to the D.C. area to check on my family. When I arrived at her sister's house, I was told my wife and kids were at the new house she had bought a few days before, and were waiting for our household goods to arrive.

Buying a house was not in my plans. I had saved money and owed no one for the first time in our lives. Her sister said Estelle was at a store buying things for our new house. I was very upset, but I would not show it in front of my kids.

Estelle had made me a map showing how to get to our new house. It was in a small town called Dale City about 25 miles south of the Pentagon. When I got to the house, it was very nice and in a nice area. I wanted to make the best of all that had happened. I just gritted my teeth and said nothing.

The next day I drove to the Pentagon to sign in and to get a look at the place I would be working. When I turned off the ramp to get to the Pentagon, cars were backed up for about a mile. I got out of my car to join the people standing around talking, and found out the road was blocked by war protesters and we would have to wait until the police brought buses in to haul them away. I was told this happened every morning. I knew then that I was not going to like my new assignment.

For Your Pets

Doctor, which vaccines do I get up for Rosie?
While at many veterinary hospitals, that would be an easy answer to an easy question, it is not at Guardian Animal Medical Center. We shifted to a "not all vaccines every year" protocol about two decades ago, but there are many clinics who still vaccinate for everything, every year.

We took our guidance from Richard Ford, DVM an expert in vaccine immunity. "The science is abundantly clear on this point," Ford said. "While some vaccines must be administered annually to sustain a reasonable level of protective immunity, others — namely the core vaccines — provide years of protective immunity in the majority of dogs and cats that are vaccinated. There is simply no medical justification that warrants administering core vaccines to all pets annually."

In 1996, the new vaccine protocols were considered revolutionary. Now, it is estimated that half of the US clinics use

a less than annual booster for all vaccines. Although I still think, the most important part of the annual exam is the physical exam, there are some vaccinations for dogs, cats and ferrets that are due every year.

All puppies and kittens need a series of vaccinations that do not end until they are over 16 weeks of age. After that they get booster vaccinations at about the time of their birthday. Those vaccinations are routine and all of my staff can get them ready for me to check and administer. Starting on the second birthday, things get somewhat complicated.

In dogs, distemper, hepatitis (adenovirus), parvovirus and rabies all last well more than a year. Leptospirosis, Lyme vaccine, Bordetella and influenza are lucky to last a full year. We had a dog that tested positive for Lyme disease that was only two weeks overdue for his annual booster. When I called the tech support veterinarian, he said that Lyme really only lasts 50 of the 52 weeks

in a year. Which supports our long term practice of trying to get boosters in three weeks before the one year mark.

In cats, feline rhinotracheitis, calicivirus, panleukopenia, chlamidia and rabies have longer immunity from a vaccine series. Feline leukemia, Feline Infectious Peritonitis (FIP) have shorter durations of immunity.

While cat vaccines probably started the whole vaccine duration debate (because of feline vaccine related sarcomas), they are even more complex than dog vaccines. Feline vaccines come in adjuvant free and adjuvanted vaccines. All adjuvant free vaccines only last a year, even if you vaccinate for one of the core vaccines. The adjuvant makes the vac-

cines last longer, but one cut per 10,000 to 30,000 vaccinations can develop a vaccine related tumor. Because one in seven cats without vaccines can contract feline leukemia alone, this vaccine tumor risk is tiny compared to the risk of going vaccineless. But it is greater than none. This is why an adjuvanted free vaccine was created.

Dr Ford believes that some veterinarians don't follow the protocols because, "This is what I've always done and it works, so I'm going to keep doing it that way." Ford also said some practices are driven by financial incentives to stick with annual core vaccinations, as annual "boosters" get pet owners into clinics at least once a year. Still others don't believe or

"They aren't trusting the protocols," he said. Blood titters may have some role in the future of vaccines, but many of the current titer checks may not correlate with vaccine protection. It's "emerging and it's going to get a lot of attention in veterinary medicine."

We may be vaccinating less, but vaccines are not going away. Recombinant technology can be used to prevent new and old infections, but also the treatment of disease. We have a vaccine that treats oral melanoma for dogs. Having had two dogs that died of oral cancers, I think that is amazing! Imagine the future with a breast cancer or prostate cancer vaccine.

So, when a patient shows up for annual vaccinations, the prior vaccination status, the age, health, risk factors, exposure factors, geographic prevalence, history, maternal antibody interference, immunodeficiency, immunosuppressive therapy, concurrent disease, nutritional status, chronic stress and aging immune response all get taken

into account and that requires the experience and knowledge of a caring veterinarian.

We once had a patient come in because it was mildly sick. After fixing the problem, I mentioned that it was overdue for her vaccinations. The owners produced a vaccine record from a distant vet. They had driven to get cheaper vaccines. Unfortunately, the only vaccines they had gotten were distemper, parvo and rabies. Those vaccines were not due for one or two years. But the leptospirosis (a more expensive vaccine and therefore not always used) and bordetella were not done. After discussing the risk factors, we vaccinated for the only two vaccines they were really due for.

Saving money on vaccines that are not needed allows us to do more of the things that are needed, like heartworm prevention, dental care and behavior counseling.

So, even for seemingly routine things, they really do need me and sometimes, less really is more.

Reducing in-person shopping and returning to curbside pickup as much as possible;

Ordering takeout, avoiding dine-in restaurants or bars;

Prioritizing businesses that follow COVID-19 prevention measures;

Not hosting gatherings of any size;

Avoiding nonessential activities outside the home;

Pausing high-contact sports, minimizing crowds at sporting events; and

Following all other COVID-19 mitigation efforts.

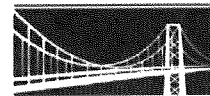
At the Shaping Our Appalachian Region (SOAR) summit, Congressman Harold "Hal" Rogers and Gov. Beshear announced over \$8 million in funding for Eastern Kentucky projects. If approved, a portion of the funds will go to the King's Daughters Health System expansion project, which will receive \$4 million for the purchase of health care equipment. According to the Governor's office, the move is expected to result in the creation of 250 full-time jobs and mitigate job losses and concerns about availability of care in the region after the closure of Our Lady of Bellefonte Hospital. This is great news for health care and jobs in our region.

Some road repairs will soon make their way to Carter County, which was the recipient of transportation funding awarded by Gov. Beshear this week. The \$194,928 will go to resurfacing efforts on Huffs Run and West Bringer Road. Weathering and daily commuting have taken their toll on these roads. I appreciate the Governor and his administration allocating these much-needed funds for these improvements.

As the state braces for the third wave of COVID-19 infections, we have reached a critical juncture in our state.
