Blakeman Family

Cord Blakeman, born June 18, 1882, was the son of David W. & Mary A. Neagle Blakeman. His wife, Nellie Green Warf, was the daughter of William Henry & Elizabeth J. Houk Warf. She was born in 1887.

Cord and Nellie were married December 20, 1905 at her father's home in Green County. The couple went on to have five children: Rual W. 1907-1940, Edgar Gordon 1912-1982, Herman Wilson 1914-1999, and Ralph Nelson 1920-2010.

Blakeman was a farmer by trade. At an early age, he united with Greasy Creek Baptist Church. He later moved his membership to Greensburg Baptist Church, serving as Deacon in each of the churches.

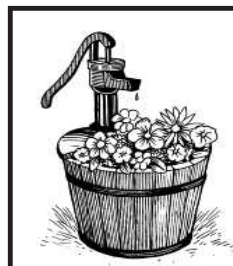
Cord Blakeman died February 22, 1941 at his home near Greensburg. He had been in declining

health for over a year and suffered from a painful growth on the side of his face. His cause of death was listed as parotid gland carcinoma which is cancer of the gland that produces saliva.

Nellie passed away at Jane Todd Crawford Hospital on May 16, 1975 at the age of 87. She was buried alongside her husband at the Warf Cemetery in the Newt community.

**April 18, 2001

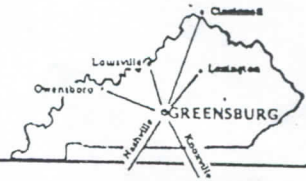
