# **Blakeman Family**

Cord Blakeman, born June 18, 1882, was the son of David W. & Mary A. Neagle Blakeman. His wife, Nellie Green Warf, was the daughter of William Henry & Elizabeth J. Houk Warf. She was born in 1887.

Cord and Nellie were married December 20. 1905 at her father's home in Green County. The couple went on to have five children: Rual W. 1907-1940, Edgar 1911-1911, Thomas Gordon 1912-1982, Herman Wilson 1914-1999, and Ralph Nelson 1920-2010.

Blakeman was a farmer by trade. At an early age, he united with Greasy Creek Baptist Church. He later moved his membership to Greensburg Baptist Church, serving as Deacon in each of the churches.

Cord Blakeman died February22,1941 athis homenear Greensburg. He had been in declin-
