a. Provide an explanation of how the across-the-board percentage increase method to increase monthly water service rates was chosen.

Response: Since there have been no material changes in its system since the last cost of service study, the District considers an across-the-board increase to be the most equitable means of passing on increased costs to its customers. Applying a uniform percentage increase to all customer classes lessens the likelihood that the public will perceive that any customer class is being unfairly favored or disfavored.

b. Provide a list of alternative methods West Daviess District considered and an explanation as to why each alternative was not chosen to increase its monthly water service rates.

Response: No alternative methods were considered.

Response: See Attachment 4.a._W. The original data table includes wholesale sales. The number of bills and gallons sold were adjusted to eliminate these bills.

b. Provide a list of any adjustments made to the data and include an explanation of each adjustment.

Response: See response above. Twenty-four bills and 8,603,000 gallons were deducted from the All Over 20,000 usage block.

c. Provide a detailed breakdown of the items that are included in the Net Billing Adjustments amount of (\$2,714) in the Summary section. Include a description of each adjustment and the method in which the amount of each adjustment was determined.

Response: See Attachment 4.c._W. This report includes several categories of transactions that are not applicable to billing adjustments. The totals for those categories are marked out. The sum of the remaining categories is close to the total of (\$2,714) and the difference is immaterial.

5. A review of records on file with the Commission shows that West Daviess District last filed a cost-of-service study (COSS) in Case No. 2011-00459.

a. Explain if any material changes to the West Daviess District's system would cause a new COSS to be prepared.

Response: There have been no material changes that would cause a new COSS to be prepared.

b. If there has been no material changes to the West Daviess District's system, explain when West Daviess District anticipates completing a new COSS.

Response: Southeast Daviess County Water District and West Daviess County Water District have approved a Statement of Intent to merge and become the Daviess County Water District. The formal agreement to merge is under consideration at both Districts' August board meetings. If this agreement is approved by both, an application for approval of the merger will be filed with the Public Service Commission in September. The new utility will then file a COSS in 2022 after one full year of merged operations.

6. Refer to West Daviess District's 2019 annual report, page 57. Line 30, Total Other Water Used, is stated as 78,835,000 gallons, which equates to 17.5398 percent of the water purchased by West Daviess District.

Response: This item uses the following reference: "...District's 2019 annual report, page 57. Line 30, **Total Other Water Used**, is stated as 78,835,000 gallons, ...". Exception is made to this statement because Line 30 is labeled "**Other Loss**" in the District's 2019 annual report on page 57 with the amount of 78,835,000 gallons that matches the reference. The District's responses to Items 6.a., 6.b., and 6.c. are provided with the assumption that a typographical error was made and the intention is for the District to answer questions pertaining to water loss rather than Total Other Water Used which is listed on Line 22.

a. Provide a detailed explanation of how the amounts were determined for each of the categories listed as Other Water Used.

Response: The calculation for the category Other Loss is the mathematical result of taking the subtotal amounts on page 57 of the 2019 annual report for Total Gallons Produced and Purchased (Line 4) less the subtotal Total Water Sales (Line 14) less subtotal Total Other Water Used (Line 22) to achieve the residual amount listed as Other Loss.

b. Provide copies of all documents relied upon to support the amounts of water usage for each of the categories listed as Other Water Used.

Response: See Attachment 6.b._W

c. In the event that any of the usage is estimated, provide the basis for the amount of the estimate.

Response: No estimates were made in the calculation of Line 30, Other Loss.
