The Fleming County Panthers are scheduled to take on the Bath County Wildcats, Monday evening during the first round of the 61st District Tournament.

The game will be played at FCHS with tip-off being at 7 pm.

Panther head Coach, Buddy Biggs, said the team is ready to play and the Panthers previously beat the Wildcats 89-80 on March 2, 2021 on the road.

“We just need to guard (sophomore guard) Otis and make some shots,” Coach Biggs said. Otis scored 40 points and grabbed 7 rebounds in the loss against the Panthers.

The Panthers are coming off of a March 10, 67-58 win against Fairview and a 67-87 loss to West Carter on March 11.

Panther junior guard, Jayden Argo scored 23 points in the win against Fairview and grabbed

# St. Patrick's Day is this week

Maewyn Succat in the late 4th century.

Irish also wear green on St. Patrick's Day to become invisible to leprechauns!

Although many parades, normally held as part of St. Patrick's Day celebrations across America have been canceled due to Covid-19, families and friends will still gather in small numbers to celebrate this great Irish Holiday.
