RESPONSE:

As stated in response to Item 1 of the Commission's First Request for Information, in making its initial proposal to Bracken County Water District, Augusta identified two primary drivers requiring an increase in rates: (1) the FY2019 Audit showing a net loss for the water treatment plant operations and (2) increases in health insurance premiums for its water treatment plant employees. As identified in the letter dated July 1, 2020, and filed into the record with the Commission's August 25, 2020, Order, the FY2019 Audit showing a net loss for the water treatment plant operations of \$23,962 and increases in health insurance premiums for its water treatment plant employees totaled \$10,631. The sum of these two numbers is approximately \$34,500.

In FY2019, Augusta sold approximately 207,828,000 gallons of water (147,836,000 gallons to Bracken County Water District and 59,992,000 to Augusta customers). Augusta proposed to increase its rates by 15 cents per 1,000 gallons for all customers, which would generate approximately \$31,200 additional revenue. The 15-cent increase was proposed because

is close to (but less than) the increase that would be necessary to make up for the net loss for the water treatment plant in FY2019 and the increase for the health insurance premiums for its water treatment plant employees. Please see attached Excel spreadsheet.

c. Explain the operating expense labeled Professional Fees, and how it pertains to the provision of wholesale water service to Bracken District.

d. Explain the operating expense labeled Office Expense, and how it pertains to the provision of wholesale water service to Bracken District.

e. Augusta proposes to increase its Fiscal Year ended June 30, 2019 (Fiscal Year 2019) audited operating expenses by \$26,575. Provide detailed documentation to show that each of Augusta's proposed adjustments listed in table below meets the rate-making criteria of being known and measurable. For each adjustment include the supporting calculation in an Excel spreadsheet format with all columns and rows accessible and all formulas unprotected.

RESPONSE:

Please refer to the Water Purchase Contract between the City of Augusta and Bracken County Water District. It states:

The Water Treatment Plant's operating costs shall be allocated based upon the total annual volume of finished treated water delivered to Bracken District and to Augusta's distribution system at their respective delivery points located immediately adjacent to the Water Treatment Plant. . . . Bracken District shall be assigned the percentage of Water Treatment Plant operating costs that is equal to the percentage that results from dividing the volume of finished treated water delivered to Bracken District at the Point of Delivery during the test period by the total annual volume of finished treated water delivered to Bracken District and Augusta's distribution system.

Each of the above-mentioned items (natural gas, telephone, professional fees, and office expenses are the Water Treatment Plant's operating costs. Therefore, they are appropriately allocated to and recovered from Bracken County Water District as described above.

- a. Natural gas is used to heat the building housing the water treatment facilities.
 Heat is necessary for the water treatment plant, which produces water for
 Bracken County Water District.
- b. The water treatment plant telephone is used for normal business activities of the Water Treatment Plant. It can be used to communicate with a variety of individuals including vendors and regulatory staff, who are necessary to properly operate the water treatment plant that produces water for Bracken County Water District. It can also be used to communicate with Bracken County Water District.
- c. Professional fees relate to expenses related to legal, accounting, and auditing services for the water treatment plant. These services are necessary for the operations of the water treatment plant, which produces water for Bracken County Water District.
- d. Office expenses are incurred for various business-related items of the water

treatment plant. This expense includes paper and pens for employees; paper and ink/toner for printers, and a variety of other supplies that are necessary to operate the water treatment plant that produces water for Bracken County Water District.

The cost to perform the preventative maintenance annually is \$600.00 per well (\$500 for flow testing and \$100 preventative maintenance). This service will include mob/demob, setup of temporary piping, valve and orifice meter, as well as the equipment necessary to conduct a vibration and wire-to-water analysis. The flow test will be conducted for approximately two (2) hours at three (3) different flowrates and pressures.

In addition, upon running each flow test, the pumping levels, flowrates, pressures, amps and volts will be recorded and used to generate a performance report.
