## **Division of Water**

This proposed project is within Crittenden-Livingston County Water District designated Source Water Protection Area, Zone 3 (Zone of Potential Impact/2.5 hour to 12.5 hour Time of

ANDY BESHEAR GOVERNOR Travel). Per 401 KAR 4:010, a Water Withdrawal Application is required for any project proposing raw water withdrawals of 10,000 gallons per day or more. Applications should be completed and submitted four to six months prior to proposed withdrawal initiation. The proposed work is endorsed by the Groundwater Section of the Watershed Management Branch. However, the proposed work is located in an area with a high potential for karst development where groundwater is susceptible to direct contamination from surface activities. It is our recommendation that proposed work be made aware of the requirements of 401 KAR 5:037 and the need to develop a Groundwater Protection Plan (GPP) for the protection of groundwater resources within that area.
