Content will be judged based on likes, shares, comments and reposts – participants can collect cumulative votes by posting their video on TikTok, Instagram, Facebook and

Twitter.

The third place winner will receive a \$250 scholarship, the second place winner will receive a \$500 scholarship, and the first place winner will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. There will also be an additional \$500 prize for a participant over the age of 18. All participants will receive a free Donate Life KY t-shirt.

Additionally, Donate Life KY is encouraging schools to get involved in the effort to increase registrations for organ donation. Schools that develop a registry drive with at least 50 registered donors will have



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



This is a great book to read to an elementary class during the Thanksgiving season.


