CITY OF LEITCHFIELD ORDINANCE NO. 2021-11
SUMMARY OF AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LEITCHFIELD, KENTUCKY ESTABLISHING A CODE ENFORCEMENT BOARD.
WHEREAS, it is the intent of KRS 65.8801 to 65.8839 to protect, promote, and improve the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens residing within the City by authorizing the creation of an administrative board with the authority to issue remedial orders and impose fines in order to provide an equitable, expeditious, effective, and inexpensive method of ensuring compliance with the ordinances in force within the City; and
WHEREAS, it is the desire of the City Council of the City of Leitchfield, Kentucky to utilize the authority granted in KRS 65.8801 to 65.8839 by creating a City of Leitchfield Code Enforcement Board.
WHEREAS, under KRS 83A.060(4) the reading of an ordinance may be satisfied by stating the title and reading a summary rather than the full text;
NOW THEREFORE be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Leitchfield as follows a summary of an ordinance establishing a Code Enforcement Board:
There is hereby created within the city pursuant to KRS 65.8801 to KRS 65.8839, a code enforcement board which shall be composed of three (3) members.
The code enforcement board shall have the power to issue remedial orders and impose civil fines as a method of enforcing city ordinances when a violation of the ordinance has been classified as a civil offense. Regular meetings of the code enforcement board shall be held quarterly and shall be held during the second Tuesdays of the months of March, June, September and December at 5:00 PM.
Violations of ordinances that are enforced by the city code enforcement board shall be subject to the following schedule of civil fines:
If a citation for a violation of an ordinance is not contested by the person charged with the violation, the penalties set forth in this subsection shall apply:

If the citation is contested and a hearing before the code enforcement board is required, the following maximum penalties may be imposed at the discretion of the code enforcement board:

The Code Enforcement Officer and Code Enforcement Board shall have jurisdiction over and shall enforce this code and all other ordinances adopted or amended which specifically provide for the enforcement by the Code Enforcement Officer(s) or Board, in the matter set forth herein.

Raiders' Ruggs to face DUI case in Vegas fatal crash

LAS VEGAS — Raiders wide receiver Henry Ruggs III is facing a driving charge after a fiery vehicle crash early Tuesday in Las Vegas that left a woman dead and Ruggs and his female passenger injured, authorities said.

According to police, Ruggs was driving a Chevrolet Corvette a little before 3:40 a.m. when it crashed into the rear of a Toyota Rav4 on a busy thoroughfare in a residential area several miles west of the Las Vegas Strip.

The Toyota caught fire and the driver died, police said. She was not immediately identified.

Ruggs, 22, "showed signs of impairment," police said in a statement that said he will be charged with felony DUI resulting in death.

Ruggs and his female passenger were hospitalized. Ruggs' injuries were described by officials as not life-threatening. His female passenger was not immediately identified.

Charges were not immediately filed. Clark County District Attorney Steve Wolfson said he was aware of the crash and would await results of the police investigation.

Probation is not an option in Nevada for a conviction on a charge of DUI causing death, which carries a possible sentence of two to 20 years in state prison.

Ruggs' attorneys, David Chesnoff and Richard Schonfeld, said that on behalf of their client they also were investigating the crash "and ask everyone to reserve judgment until all the facts are gathered."

The Raiders released a statement saying the team is aware of the crash involving Ruggs. "We are devastated by the loss of life and our thoughts and prayers go out to the victim's family," the team said. "We are in the process of gathering information and will have no further comment at this time."

NFL spokesman Brian McCarthy issued a statement saying, "Our hearts go out to the family and friends of the victim of this horrific tragedy. We will continue to gather facts and monitor the matter under our policies, but our thoughts at this time are with those impacted by this devastating incident."

Ruggs is a second-year wide receiver who was taken 12th overall in the 2020 draft after a productive three-year career at Alabama, including helping the Crimson Tide win the national championship as a freshman in 2017.

Ruggs has 24 catches for a team-high 469 yards and two touchdowns this season. As a rookie in 2020, he had 26 catches for 452 yards and two touchdowns.

Ruggs, from Montgomery, Alabama, caught 12 passes for 229 yards and six touchdowns as a freshman with Alabama in 2017. He caught a 6-yard touchdown pass from Tua Tagovailoa in the 26-23 victory against Georgia in the championship game.

The AFC West-leading Raiders (5-2) have won two in a row under interim coach Rich Bisaccia and now return to the field this week without their leading receiver in yardage. They'll visit the New York Giants (2-6) on Sunday.

UK likes how it is scoring, but one of the things that Calipari likes most on his basketball teams are big players who make it difficult for other teams to score in the paint.

Calipari wants shot blockers, which means forwards working with Oscar Tshiebwe to keep opposing players out of the lane.

"This team needs an interior defender other than just Oscar. Who is it? I don't know," Calipari said after UK beat KWC. "Jacob (Toppin) raised his hand. OK, it can be you. I need dogs. Who are the dogs?"

C'mon. Show me who you are. 'I don't play that way.' OK, you just moved back a little bit."

Brooks, who along with freshman TyTy Washington led UK's scorers with 18 points each, defined "dogs."

Brooks gave his definition of what Calipari is looking for. Brooks has the most experience of anybody on this team in dealing with Calipari.

"Someone who plays hard, who competes every possession," Brooks said. "He just goes out there and does what other guys don't want to do. 'We're going to figure that out. I think we've got a team full of dogs. We've got to bring it out of people.'"

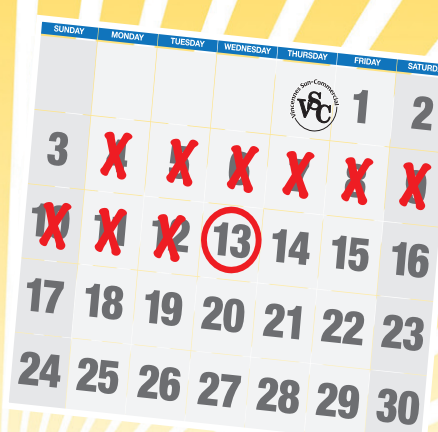

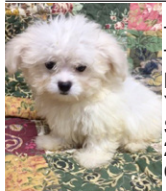

suspected of having links with a terrorist group.

Local administrations in some areas could be disbanded and a military leadership could be installed. Unauthorized public gatherings and any expression of opposition to the state of emergency are banned.

Such actions would be implemented by law. Ethiopian lawmakers are expected to convene within 48 hours.

Meanwhile, the Addis Ababa security bureau told residents that anyone with a firearm should register it now, and it warned that searches of homes and businesses would be carried out to ensure the city's peace.

The United Nations expressed extreme concern at the latest events, warning that "the stability of Ethiopia and the wider region is at stake" and again calling for an immediate cease-fire.

Ethiopia's prime minister this week called upon all citizens to combat the approaching Tigray forces, adding that "we should closely follow those who

work for the enemy and live amongst us." A new roundup of ethnic Tigrayans was seen in the capital Monday.

The Tigray forces say they are pressuring Ethiopia's government to lift a deadly months-long blockade on their region of around 6 million people, where basic services have been cut off and humanitarian food and medical aid are denied.

This is "perhaps the most egregious humanitarian obstruction in the world," a senior official with the U.S. Agency for International Development told The Associated Press on Tuesday. "We're seeing a campaign of systematic, bureaucratic obstruction blocking assistance into areas occupied by (the Tigray forces)" affecting not just Tigray but areas in the neighboring Amhara and Afar regions now held by the Tigray fighters, the official said.

The fighters moved into those regions after retaking much of Tigray in June, displacing hundreds of thousands of residents and widening the crisis.

"We certainly had difficulty getting the prime minister's attention" to the problem and any

calls to address it, the senior USAID official said after a recent visit to Ethiopia. The official spoke on condition of anonymity because they were not authorized otherwise.

The Tigray forces say they are now linking up with another armed group, the Oromo Liberation Army, with which an alliance was struck earlier this year.

The fighting soon could reach the Oromo region that neighbors Addis Ababa. Ethnic Oromo once hailed Abiy as the country's first Oromo prime minister, but discontent has since emerged with the jailing of outspoken Oromo leaders.

The U.S. special envoy for the Horn of Africa, Jeffrey Feltman, told a public event Tuesday that the link-up of Tigray forces with other armed groups is dangerous.

The envoy also said he understands why Ethiopia's prime minister doesn't want to sit at a negotiating table across from leaders of the Tigray forces, but "there are many, many ways to initiate discreet talks."

In the end, Feltman said, "there will be talks because neither side is going to win."

Top government scientists also predict an increase in droughts, heat waves and extreme rainfall across China that could threaten harvests and endanger reservoirs and dams, including Three Gorges Dam.

Meanwhile, China's people are already suffering the brunt of climate change. And in a common pattern around the world, those who have contributed least to the warming and have the fewest resources to adapt often feel the pain most acutely.

In late July, Chinese news broadcasts carried startling footage of torrential rains swamping Henan's provincial capital, Zhengzhou — at one point, 8 inches fell in a single hour — with cars swept away, subways flooded and people struggling through waist-deep water. More than 300 people died as the megacity turned into an accidental Venice, its highways transformed into muddy canals.

Even after the most dramatic storms ceased, the water continued to pool in much of the surrounding countryside, a flat and fertile region.

Here the economy

depends on corn, wheat and vegetables, and other regions of China depend on Henan for food. The local government reported that nearly 3 million acres of farmland were flooded — an area about the size of Connecticut — with damage totaling \$18 billion.

"All I could do at the time was to watch the heavens cry, cry and cry every day," said Wang, the peanut farmer.

A limited number of rudimentary pumps were shared among farmers in Henan. Soft plastic tubes were stretched across fields to drain water, but they periodically burst, sending farmers running to patch holes.

A 58-year-old farmer who gave only her last name, Song, said everything she owned was submerged by the floods — her home, furniture, fields, farming equipment.

"Nothing was harvested. This year, the common people have been suffering all year long," she said. "Ordinary people suffer most."

"We have been working so hard, breaking our backs ... without even a penny back, my heart aches," said Hou Beibei, a farmer whose simple vegetable greenhouses — plastic tarps covering plots of eggplant, garlic and celery — remain

flooded, her hard work washed away.

She is worried about her two young children. "The tuition fees of the children and the living expenses of the whole family rely on this land," she said.

The summer also saw another climate-linked natural disaster in China. In July, the hottest month on Earth in 142 years of record-keeping, according to U.S. weather experts, a vast and toxic blue-green algae bloom spanning 675 square miles engulfed coastal waters off the prosperous city of Qingdao, threatening navigation, fishing and tourism. State broadcasts carried footage of people using dump trucks to remove the mounds of algae.

Another threat to China's coastal provinces is sea level rise. Government records show that coastal water levels have already risen around 4.8 inches between 1980 and 2017 and project that within the next 30 years, waters could rise an additional 2.8 to 6.3 inches.

Because China's coastal areas are largely flat, "a slight rise in the sea level will aggravate the flooding of a large area of land," erasing expensive waterfront properties and critical habitats, a government report projects.

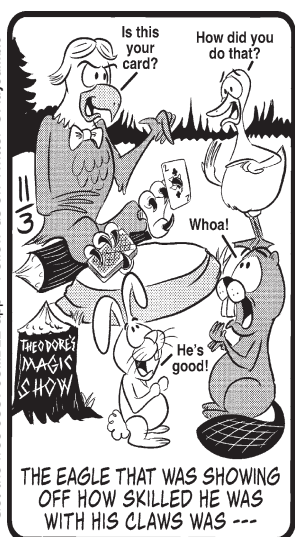

Indians begin removing scripted name from stadium scoreboard

CLEVELAND — The Indians began removing the team's scripted logo atop the giant scoreboard at Progressive Field on Tuesday as they transition their name to the Guardians.

A new "Guardians" sign will replace the old "Indians" one and be erected before opening day 2022.

Crews started dismantling the letters, beginning with the "I" on the 80-foot-long sign. It's another step in the offseason change for the Major League Baseball team, which has been called the Indians since 1915.

The removal of the letters is expected to take several days. After cutting into the first letter, workers had to delicately remove a section to be lifted with a crane between two of the ballpark's toothbrush-like light towers.

Windy conditions forced the crew to shut down after a few hours.

Once completely removed, the sign will be placed in storage while the team evaluates options for a permanent spot for it. In July, owner Paul Dolan joked that it was too big to fit in his basement.

When the Indians left Municipal Stadium in 1994 for their new ballpark,

which was then known as Jacobs Field, a neon sign of their Chief Wahoo logo was taken down and is now displayed at the Western Reserve Historical Society building.

A new "Guardians" sign will replace the old "Indians" one and be erected before opening day 2022.

The American League franchise announced earlier this year it was changing its name in a move prompted by a national reckoning on racist names and symbols.

The team already has removed other signage inside and outside the downtown ballpark. The team's official name switch is expected to take place in a few weeks, when Guardians merchandise will go on sale.

The changeover hit a snag last week when a roller derby team known since 2013 as the Cleveland Guardians sued the baseball team in federal court, alleging the switch infringes on its trademark.

In a statement, the Indians said they don't believe there is a conflict between the parties and they remain confident in their position to move forward with the name change.

NASCAR team stands by Liberty in spite of lawsuits, scrutiny

With a 14th NASCAR Cup Series championship on the line this weekend, team owner Rick Hendrick on Tuesday defended his decision to extend his sponsorship deal with Liberty University as the school faces scrutiny over its handling of sexual assault allegations.

Hendrick Motorsports last month reached a new five-year agreement to extend the school's support of driver William Byron and the No. 24 Chevrolet. Liberty will serve as the primary sponsor in 12 Cup races annually through 2026.

Not long after the extension was announced, a report by ProPublica detailed accusations that the university discouraged students from reporting sexual violence or outright dismissed reports of assault. Twelve women filed a lawsuit in

July, accusing the evangelical Christian institution of a pattern of mishandling cases of sexual assault and harassment, and fostering an unsafe campus environment.

Jerry Falwell Jr. resigned last year from the presidency at Liberty and also apologized after posting a vacation photo that showed him with his pants unzipped and his arm around his wife's pregnant assistant. The photo was taken on a luxury boat that belonged to Hendrick, who has drivers Chase Elliott and Kyle Larson racing for the championship Sunday at Phoenix Raceway.

"Things that happened years ago, whenever it did happen, they'll make it right and move on," Hendrick said Tuesday. "Things like that, I mean, it's not pleasant, but they're dealing with it. They're being very up front, very transparent."

The school began its support of Byron in 2014 when he drove late model stock cars and has been a 12-race primary sponsor since his 2018 Cup Series rookie of the year season. Byron made NASCAR's playoffs this season as part of Hendrick's four-driver stable.

Hendrick Motorsports was won 16 Cup races this season and Larson's win in May at the Coca-Cola 600 gave the organization a Cup-series record 269th victory.

While some race fans have called on Hendrick to end its relationship with Liberty, the NASCAR Hall of Famer said neither he nor Hendrick Motorsports has received any blowback from the deal.

"They're great people up there. They'll get it worked out," the 72-year-old Hendrick said. "That's a situation that's unfortunate. But they'll get it resolved and move on."

Jets add Wilson's personal QB coach Beck to staff

FLORHAM PARK, N.J. — Zach Wilson will have a familiar face by his side for the rest of the season.

The New York Jets have hired John Beck, the rookie's personal quarterback coach, as a full-time assistant.

Beck began working with the team last week and was on the sideline wearing team gear and a headset during the Jets' 34-31 victory over Cincinnati on Sunday, led by Mike White's stunning performance.

Wilson, who is side-

lined with a sprained knee ligament, has worked with Beck for a few years. The two even met up in Utah during the Jets' bye-week break two weeks ago.

"He went to see John and I was like, 'Why not just bring him here?'" coach Robert Saleh said Tuesday. "So we just started talking about it and one thing leads to another. Now there's just a really good plan in terms of how to get him through the rest of the year and keep himself connected and keep everything tight."

The 40-year-old Beck had never previously been an NFL coach, but has become one of the game's leading personal quarterback gurus while working with several pro passers at his 3DQB facility in Huntington Beach, California.

The hope is Beck will be able to assist offensive coordinator Mike LaFleur, quarterbacks coach Rob Calabrese and senior offensive assistant Matt Cavanaugh in helping Wilson, the No. 2 overall pick, develop. Beck has familiarity with the Shanahan-style

offense LaFleur is running since he played under Mike Shanahan in Washington.

"We thought it would be really good to just have John in our building, learn the verbiage that we're teaching along with the things that are being asked of all our quarterbacks," Saleh said. "So when he is having those conversations, those on-the-side conversations, everybody's speaking the same language. And he can tie in what he does as a quarterback guy to the students."

Audubon Area To Offer Low-Income Energy Assistance

Audubon Area Community Services, Inc. will offer Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) services to eligible clients beginning this week with an anticipated end date of March 31, 2022, to clients in Daviess, Hancock, Henderson, McLean, Ohio, Union and Webster counties.

The subsidy component will run through December 10, 2021. During subsidy, all eligible individuals or families at or below 150 percent of the federal poverty guidelines who are responsible for home energy cost, whether directly or as an undesignated portion of rent will be provided assistance.

Benefit amounts will be based on the household poverty level and the type of fuel used for heating. Applicants will need to provide proof of social

security numbers or permanent residence card for each member of the household, proof of all household members' income from the previous month, most current heating bill, statement from the landlord if heating expenses are included in the rent, statement from utility company if participating in a pre-pay electric program and the account number and name on the account for main heating and fueling sources and electric bill.

The Crisis component will begin January 10, 2022 and run until available funds have been expended, not to exceed March 31, 2022. In addition to the eligibility requirements for subsidy, the applicant must have received a disconnect notice or be within four days of running out of fuel if wood, coal, propane or kerosene is used for the heat

source. Crisis relief will be provided within 48 hours or 18 hours if facing an emergency.

Individuals interested in applying for services are encouraged to visit the Audubon Area Community Services website, click on request assistance and schedule a call from a LIHEAP employee.

Applicants may phone the AACS offices in Union County at 270-389-3742; the number to call in Webster County is 270-639-5635.

Check Net Price Calculators To Get Idea Of College Costs

Kentucky high school students can get an idea of how much it may cost to attend college using a school's net price calculator, according to the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA).

"Pursuing some level of education beyond high school can help enrich a student's long-term earning potential, but it often does require a significant financial investment," Gov. Andy Beshear said. "Online calculators are a useful tool in determining what the estimated costs may be, including scholarships, as well as low-interest loans. It's important to remember that the calculation is only an estimate, but it can be helpful as students pick the right school for their education."

The U.S. Department of Education requires all colleges to have a calculator on their websites.

Students and parents must enter information about the student's academic record and the parents' finances to get a net price estimate for the cost of attending a trade school, two-year community college or four-year school.

Families should look for the net price, not the net cost.

The net price is how much a family can expect to pay toward a student's technical or college education, including any loans. The net cost will be lower than the net price because the net cost

doesn't include loans, which have to be repaid.

Students and parents can get free estimates for up to six colleges across the country using the "Getting the Facts" program at kheaa.com. To get a free estimate, students must sign in and create an account. Students and parents should speak with the financial aid office at each college to get the most accurate cost information.

KHEAA is the state agency that administers Kentucky's student financial aid programs, including the Kentucky Educational Excellence Scholar-

ship (KEES). Its sister agency, the Kentucky

Higher Education Student Loan Corporation (KHESLC), offers low-cost Advantage Loans to help students and parents pay for college or refinance student loans. For more information about Advantage Loans, visit AdvantageEducation-Loan.com.

Many of KHEAA's student aid programs are funded by Kentucky Lottery revenue.

Mark Welch, who serves as pastor at New Life Church in Murray, Ky., spoke at the event.

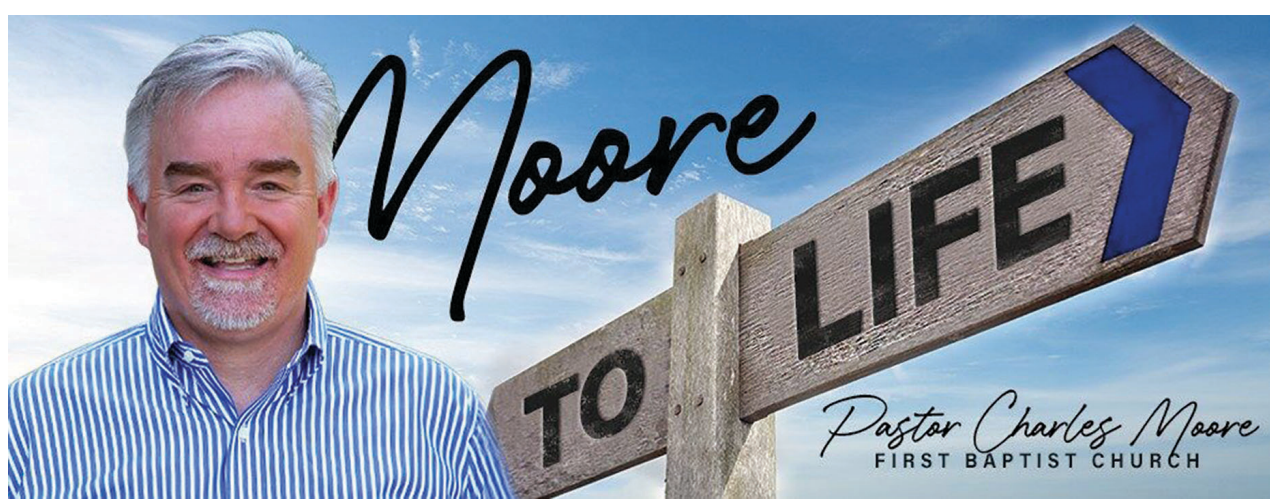
“It was a great message that reminded us about the importance of serving faithfully wherever God plants us,” Ewing said.

AACS To Offer Low-Income Energy Assistance

Audubon Area Community Services, Inc will offer Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) services to eligible clients beginning this week with an anticipated end date of March 31, 2022, to clients in Daviess, Hancock, Henderson, McLean, Ohio, Union and Webster counties.

The subsidy component will run through December 10, 2021. During subsidy, all eligible individuals or families at or below 150 percent of the federal poverty guidelines who are responsible

for home energy cost, whether directly or as an undesignated portion of rent will be provided assistance.

Benefit amounts will be based on the household poverty level and the type of fuel used for heating. Applicants will need to provide proof of social security numbers or permanent residence card for each member of the household, proof of all household members' income from the previous month, most current heating bill, statement from the landlord if heating expenses are

Kentuckians who want to further their education in the field of early childhood instruction may receive more funding from an expanded Early Childhood Development Scholarship (ECDS).

"This expanded program will help early childhood education professionals improve their skills and knowledge for the benefit of our children and our state."

Funds from a grant through the federal American Rescue Plan will allow Kentucky to expand the ECDS program for the next three years. Mark Welch, who serves as pastor at New Life Church in Murray, Ky., spoke at the event.

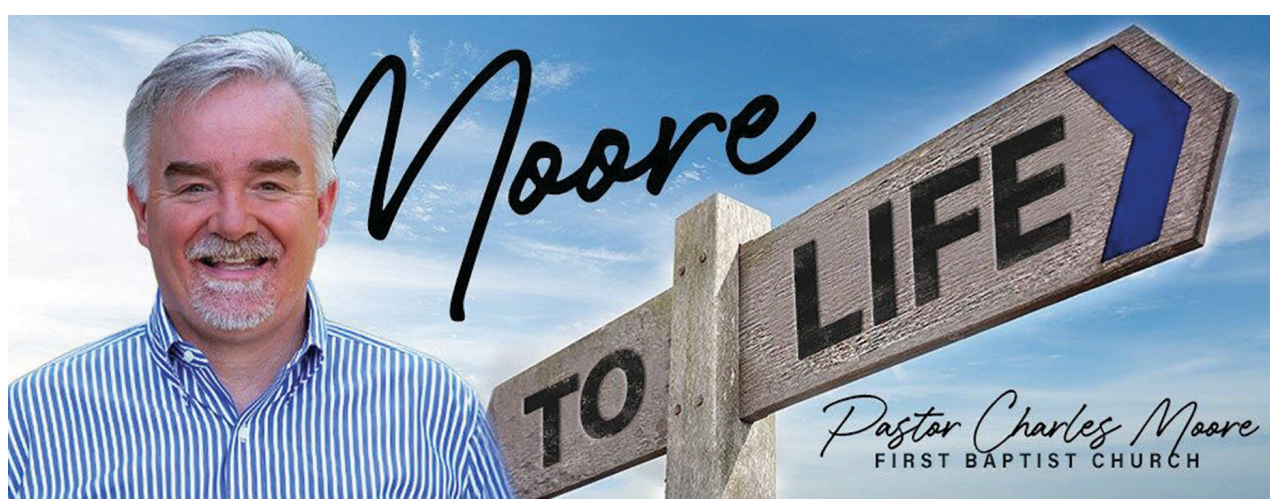
“It was a great message that reminded us about the importance of serving faithfully wherever God plants us,” Ewing said.
