**KENTUCKY POWER COMPANY LIST OF
PROPOSED ISSUES FOR INFORMAL CONFERENCE**

Pursuant to the Commission’s June 30, 2026 Order in this proceeding, Kentucky Power Company (“Kentucky Power” or “Company”) provides the following list of proposed topics for discussion during the August 11, 2026 informal conference:

- How can the Interconnection and Net Metering Guidelines (the “Guidelines”) be updated to provide flexibility for addressing future changes in technology or a utility’s review process.
- How can the Guidelines be updated to provide a balance between a customer’s desire to quickly connect a net-metering eligible distributed energy resource (“DER”) to a utility’s system with the utility’s need to fully evaluate the impact of the proposed DER on the utility’s system.
- How energy storage systems should be treated when associated with net-metering eligible DERs considering the energy storage resources are not included in the definition of “eligible electric generating facility” in KRS 278.465(2).
- How the Guidelines can be updated to ensure that DER Aggregators operate with the best interest of all Kentucky customers in mind by establishing rules and processes that provide end-to-end governance of the DER aggregation process including, but not limited to:
 - State registration/certification processes.
 - Requiring utilities to perform appropriate technical reviews of DER aggregations and providing the utilities with adequate time to conduct technical analysis.
 - Ensuring the DER aggregators bear the expense of all administrative costs, system studies, and system upgrades required to support their aggregation.

Kentucky Power looks forward to discussing these topics with the Commission and stakeholders as the August 11, 2026 informal conference.
